St. Therese of Lisieux

As I have mentioned on a few occasions, one of my parish assignments shortly after I was ordained was the Shrine of the Little Flower in Royal Oak. The parish dedicated to St. Therese of Lisieux. During my time there I developed a devotion to St. Therese.

One only must read her writings to know that she had a fondness for simplicity for the “little ways” in which God reveals Himself to us.

On October 15th, of this year, Pope Francis published a new apostolic exhortation on St. Therese of Lisieux, subtitled, “On confidence in the merciful love of God”.

The Pope writes, at a time when human beings are obsessed with the grandeur and new forms of power, she points out to us the little ways, “In an age that casts aside so many of our brothers and sisters, she teaches us the beauty of concern and responsibility for one another”.

The message of the Gospel is a simple one, love of God and love of our neighbor, but sometimes the simplest of tasks can be the hardest to implement. St. Therese reminds us of that when she spoke of the “little ways” in which God makes His presence felt in our daily life. Faith and daily life are intimately connected. They go hand in hand with living out our baptismal call.

Pope Francis shares his own devotion of St. Therese when he was Archbishop of Buenos Aires when he said, “When I have a problem, I ask the saint, not to solve it, but to take it into her hands and help me to accept it, and as a sign, I almost always receive a white rose”.

I often have people say to me, Father, I ask God for patience, but He does not answer me. My response is often, you are asking for the wrong thing. Instead of praying for patience, pray for understanding of the situation you find yourself in. It will open many possibilities to a potential solution.

When we see the events that are happening in the world today, this exhortation reminds us to seek the Lord and to trust in Him. Pope Francis ends his exhortation with a prayer, “Dear St. Therese, the church needs to radiate the brightness, the fragrance and the joy of the Gospel. Send us your roses! Help us to be, like yourself, ever confident in God’s immense love for us, so that we may imitate each day your ‘little ways’ of holiness”.

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, acknowledging that Jesus Christ is above all earthly rulers, past, present, or future. The solemnity of Christ the King was established in 1925, in the aftermath

of the Great War and the rise of nationalism, which served to divide people and often cultures. Most solemnities (feast days) focus on biblical events. In contrast, “Christ the King” focuses on an idea. The original motivation for the feast was to celebrate the dominion of Christ that transcends national boundaries and that makes war a sacrilege against Christ’s body.

From the USCCB website: “Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical *Quas primas* (“In the first”) to respond to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to “thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law” out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever.

Pope Pius XI’s encyclical gave Catholics hope and—while governments around them crumbled—the assurance that Christ the King shall reign forever. Jesus Christ “is very truth, and it is from him that truth must be obediently received by all mankind” (*Quas primas*, 7).

For Christians, when our faith is repeatedly marginalized in public life, we can fall into the habit of compartmentalizing our lives. We love Jesus in our private lives, but we shrink from acknowledging the kingship of Christ in our social life. When we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, we declare to the world and remind ourselves that Jesus is the Lord of the Church and of the entire universe.”

How can I mark this feast day? Today, war and terrorism still torment many areas of the world. On this solemnity, we can pray for these nations, and we can pray for victims of acts of terror and of war. We can also recognize that Jesus Christ should reign in our lives, guiding us in our thoughts, our decisions, and our actions. We can acknowledge that in both the universe that is the entire world and the universe that is our own heart, Jesus Christ is Lord. To state it simply, we can do as we have been called to do – see each other as Christ does – sisters and brothers, sharing in building the Kingdom of God.

In what way is Jesus king in my life? How do I live in this world while living for God’s kingdom?

Abigayle Ministries

Abigayle Ministries is a faith-based ministry that **provides residential housing for homeless mothers during their pregnancy and postpartum care**, while providing life skills training.

Mothers in the program receive everything they and their baby need: a private room, safe environment, meals, baby items, infant care classes, bible studies, assistance with: employment, education, transportation, counseling, and finance management.

Mothers are expected to maintain employment, participate in counseling and daily chores, adhere to curfew and resident guidelines.

Mary’s Children Family Center serves people with **brain injuries and developmental disabilities** by providing **academic, occupational, recreational, and social activities** in a Christ-oriented environment.

A **Day Program** offers structured activities to improve functional independence and enhance the quality of life. Activities include: **classes for speech, computer, reading, scrap-booking, and cooking**. Lunch is provided for all participants, and **nursing students** visit on a regular basis.

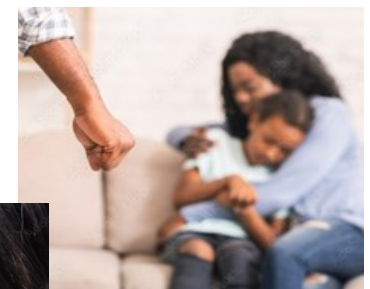
