Christ is Alive

In response to the October 2018 Synod on Young People, Pope Francis issued an apostolic exhortation titled *Christ is Alive*, (*Christus Vivit.*). As an aside, the pilgrimage that I led to Italy last October, our group had the opportunity to attend the opening Mass for the Synod for young people with Pope Francis in St. Peter's square. The document is reader friendly and is written as a letter to a specific group of people; namely young people.

I had the opportunity to read the Pope's apostolic exhortation and found it to be a wonderful document that encourages young people to actively renew the Church. The document defines the age of young people as between the ages of 16-29. We often hear that young people are the future of the Church. In the document, Pope Francis reminds and challenges young people by stating that they are the "now of God".

In paragraph 64 of *Christ is Alive*, Pope Francis explains the meaning of the "now of God". He says: "We cannot just say that young people are the future of the world. They are its present, even now; they are helping to enrich it. Young people are no longer children. They are at a time of life when they begin to assume a number of responsibilities, sharing alongside adults in the growth of the family, society, and the church. Yet the times are changing, leading us to ask: What are today's young people really like? What is going on in their lives?"

Throughout the document, the Pope encourages young people to share the talents and gifts that God has bestowed upon them to renew the church. This document is written and directed to young people. I would encourage young people to read this document and discern what your gifts and talents are and how they will enrich the church. The Pope ends with a wish; that young people "keep running the race", as the church needs your momentum, your enthusiasm, your intuition, your faith.

As we journey towards the Feast of Pentecost, may we call down the Holy Spirit to enlighten our hearts and minds in our response to the needs and life of the church. I recall the words of Cardinal John Dearden as he returned from Rome after attending Vatican Council II. He would often say: "the more difficult the task, the more the Spirit will be given".

Bon mot: Difficulties are God's errands; and when we are sent upon them we should esteem it a proof of God's confidence--- as a compliment from him.

On this second Sunday of Advent, our Gospel reading from St. Mark is one of contrast. John the Baptist appears in the desert, a hot, dirty, dry land, proclaiming baptism with water, cool and decidedly

not dry, to be cleansed of sin. When we think of a desert, we often perceive an absence of living things; those who hear John the Baptist are given a message of abundant life, cleansed of sin, and made new.

Think of a time spent in the desert, or on a hot beach, or working in your garden in the heat and humidity of summer. Maybe you felt your clothing sticking to your skin, sweat accumulating on your body, and a general slowing of your activity to accommodate the physical aspects of heat and sand or dirt. Think also of the feeling of a cleansing shower after, refreshed, skin breathing again, cooled, and made new. It is a relief and a joy! We go from the scarcity of cleanliness and comfort to overwhelming bounty.

John the Baptist seems to be telling his listeners that what he is giving them is wonderful, a refreshing new start. But he also is making it clear that this joy of baptism is just the beginning, and the best is yet to come! "One mightier than I is coming after me...I have baptized you with water, he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." (Mark 1:7-8)

We have been baptized in the Holy Spirit; we follow the mighty one. As we go through this season of Advent, let us reflect on the refreshing gift of baptism and seek to follow Jesus and his teachings more closely, enjoying the overwhelming bounty of God's love and mercy.

GOSPEL: Mark 1:1-8

John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins.

People of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him

and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins.

John was clothed in camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist.

He fed on locusts and wild honey.

And this is what he proclaimed:

"One mightier than I is coming after me.

I am not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of his sandals.

I have baptized you with water;

he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

REFLECTION

John the Baptist baptized people and called them to turn away from sin. He had some interesting habits. He wore rough scratchy clothes, and he ate bugs with honey! He was sort of a wild man in some ways. He also announced to people that Jesus was coming.

We have a similar job to John the Baptist. We can rejoice and be glad that God has sent a savior. We can "prepare the way" by telling other people about Jesus and celebrating the "good news" of the gospel.

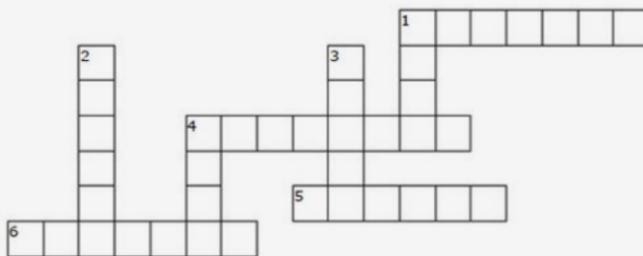

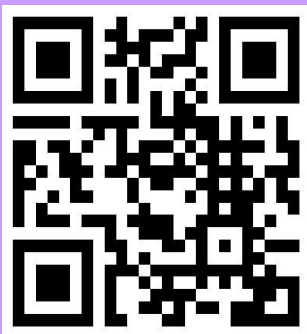
