Second week of Advent

In this second week of Advent, John the Baptist plays a defining role in the life and ministry of Jesus. John is often referred to as the precursor of

Jesus. The definition of precursor is forerunner, forbearer, or trailblazer. In reading the Scriptures that pertain to John the Baptist, anyone of those terms would be appropriate for John. John was indeed a trailblazer making people aware that one more powerful than he (John) was to come.

This Advent season affords us the opportunity to be like John and tell our stories of faith and our spiritual journey. Advent is one of those times that the Church encourages us to see how God is present in our daily life, but more importantly to share those experiences of God's presence with those people who are a part of our life or who enter into our journey for a short time. We all have a story to tell and there are people who want to hear our story.

One of the materials I use every Advent season is what has become known as the, "The Little Blue Book". The Little Blue Book contains writings or reflections by Bishop Ken Untener. These little six minute reflections allow us to center our attention on the season of Advent in the midst of our busy life and Christmas preparations. I would encourage you to pick up an Advent book in the gathering space and spend that six minutes a day reflecting upon the scripture verse, the reflection, and the prayer at the bottom of each page.

Whatever prayer form you use throughout this season of Advent, may it prepare you to celebrate the great Feast of Christmas. This is a time for us to step back from our busy schedules and focus our attention on God and the many ways in which He reveals and shows Himself to us on a day to day basis.

Many people have asked. What is the meaning of Carpe Diem? It is Latin for "seize the day". I began using the term after I saw the movie: The Dead Poets Society. It is a reminder for us to see God's hand in our work, our play, and our interaction with each other. As we journey through this season of Advent, may we seize each day and each moment as a gift from God knowing that He loves us and cares for us.

Let us keep in our prayers the men and women who are serving in the military. May God protect them and their families. Let us also remember those women and men who will be away from their families this Christmas season that they may be united in spirit with their loved ones.

the front page. Mary's preparation for Christ's birth can be a model for us during Advent. Can we prepare as if we had Christ within us, waiting to be born into the world? We can look to Mary as our model as it is her immaculate conception that made possible the birth of our Lord as fully human and fully divine. Like Mary, may we be instruments of grace, giving new birth to the Lord in today's world, for the Lord is with us.

Do not miss an opportunity to enjoy a delicious breakfast with St. Nicholas on Sunday, December 11th, following 9:00am Mass (no registration necessary)!

The true story of Santa Claus begins with Nicholas, who was born during the third century in Asia Minor, now on the southern coast of Turkey. His wealthy parents, who raised him to be a devout Christian, died in an epidemic while Nicholas was still young. Obeying Jesus' words to "sell what you own and give the money to the poor," Nicholas used his whole inheritance to assist the needy, the sick, and the suffering. He dedicated his life to serving God and was made Bishop of Myra while still a young man. Bishop Nicholas became known throughout the land for his generosity to those in need, his love for children, and his concern for sailors and ships. The Church celebrates his feast day on the anniversary of his death, December 6th.

Through the centuries many stories and legends have been told of St. Nicholas' life and deeds. These accounts help us understand his extraordinary character and why he is so beloved and revered as protector and helper of those in need. St. Nicholas is honored throughout Europe and one of the old Christian traditions surrounding his feast day is for kids to leave their shoes out overnight in front of the fireplace, on the windowsill, or outside their bedroom door so that St. Nicholas can fill them with special fruits, candies, other small gifts, and treats. We will invite the children attending our breakfast to leave their shoes in the hallway leading to the Fr. Leon Page Activity Center. St. Nicholas is sure to leave them a surprise!

-What do you do while you are waiting? What do you do while you wait in Advent?


-How do you wait in peace?


