Lent

Ash Wednesday, we began the season of Lent, a season to prepare ourselves for the Feast of Easter. While serving as an associate pastor at Shrine of the Little Flower, I received

a book entitled; *What color is Lent?* Of course we all know that the color purple is the color that signifies the Lenten season. And we would be correct. However, the book challenges the reader to think beyond the actually color of Lent to how we can enter into the season. To summarize the book, Lent is what you make it. How we enter the season of Lent is a question we have to answer for ourselves.

I recall an experience when I was in California attending a board of directors meeting for the National Federation of Priest's Councils. During the course of our meetings, we had the evenings free to get together and socialize. The priests that serve on the board represent priests from every part of the country. At one of our evening gatherings the topic of Lent came up. All of us said that we enjoy the season of Lent. Certainly there are extra activities during this time but overall it is a wonderful season. These activities prepare us to celebrate the passion, death and resurrection of Christ. You might be surprised to know that most priests enjoy the season of Lent.

We heard in the Gospel for Ash Wednesday what the three disciplines for Lent are: namely, prayer, fasting and almsgiving. The important thing to note is that the Gospel does not say how we are to incorporate them into our life. The three disciplines are open ended and very broad which allows us to think outside the box and gain a new perspective as to the meaning of Lent. They allow us to be in the present moment. The Church allows us to choose how to implement these disciplines into our Lenten journey.

In a recent article titled Discipline, The Word I Loved To Hate, Kendra Von Esh the author writes; we often equate discipline as a form punishment. For example, we discipline our children. She goes on to say we have to change our attitude towards discipline and see it as an opportunity change our life but more importantly to visually see the change that takes place when we are disciplined in aspects of our spiritual, physical and mental life.

I would hope that we enter this season of Lent with a spirit of gratitude to God for the blessing and love He bestows upon us. We are called to share that love and gratitude with those that we meet on our journey. May we see these disciplines as a way to refresh and renew our relationship with God, and not as something we have to do.

I hope your Lent is a time of reflection and meditation on the life of our Lord in preparation for the great Feast of Easter. The parish of St. Jane Frances de Chantal has many prayer forms available to you so that you can enter into a deeper relationship with God and the people you meet along the way. Please refer to the card that was sent to your home or the church bulletin or website for more details about the events scheduled at St. Jane Frances de Chantal this Lenten season.

Bon mot: Time is so fleeting that if we do not remember God in our youth, age might find us incapable of thinking about him.

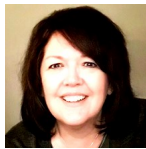

Our efforts to raise awareness of fulfilling our baptismal call through parish ministry are reaping rewards! A call to worship

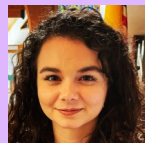

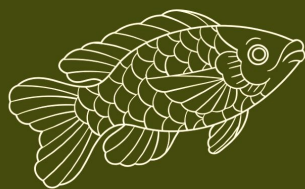

GOSPEL: Mark 1:12-15

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan. He was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him. After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

REFLECTION

This gospel reminds us that there is evil in the world, but we can overcome it. Lent is a time to remember that God's kingdom is for us because Jesus died on the cross. In this first week, we need to be sorry for our sins, want to do better, and reflect on what it means to "believe".

ACTIVITIES

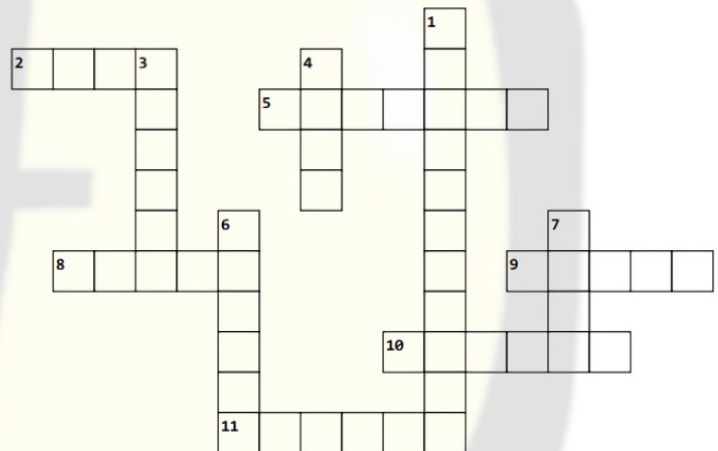
- 1) Have family members write bible verses or positive messages that relate to our faith on 40 pieces of paper (index cards, construction paper, plain paper or lined paper). Put them in a large envelop and each day pick one out to read together before/after dinner or at night.
- 2) Get white paper plates. Cut a circle out of construction paper to glue in the middle. Cut out a large heart to glue overtop of the circle. Cut out a cross to glue on top of the heart. Along the plate's edge, draw four or five lines from the edge of the plate to the cut-out circle. List, in each of the sections divided by the lines, themes for you to work on during Lent (prayer, service, church involvement, family activity, things to give up, reconciliation, etc.) Set goals and try to achieve them during Lent, based on these themes.
