Lent

This Wednesday, Ash Wednesday, we will begin the season of Lent, a season to prepare ourselves for the Feast of Easter. While serving as an associate pastor at the Shrine of the Little Flower, I received a book entitled, *What Color is Lent?* Of course we all know that the color purple is the color that signifies the Lenten season. And we would be correct. However, the book challenges the reader to think beyond the actual color of Lent to how we can enter into the season. To summarize the book, Lent is what you make it. How we enter the season of Lent is a question we have to answer for ourselves.

I recall an experience when I was in California attending a board of directors meeting for the National Federation of Priest's Councils. This group began in 1968 and has been instrumental in addressing many issues regarding priestly life and ministry. I have been a member of this group for the last five years.

During the course of our meetings, we have the evenings free to get together and socialize. The priests that serve on the board represent priests from every part of the country. At one of our evening gatherings, the topic of Lent came up. All of us said that we enjoy the season of Lent. Certainly there are extra activities during this time, but overall it is a wonderful season. These activities prepare us to celebrate the passion, death and resurrection of Christ. You might be surprised to know that most priests enjoy the season of Lent.

We will hear in the Gospel for Ash Wednesday what the three disciplines for Lent are namely: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. The important thing to note is that the Gospel does not say how we are to incorporate them into our life. The three disciplines are open ended and are very broad, which allows us to think outside the box and gain a new perspective as to the meaning of Lent. They allow us to be in the present moment. The Church allows us to choose how to implement these disciplines into our Lenten journey.

In a recent article, titled "Discipline, The Word I Loved To Hate", Kendra Von Esh, the author, writes: "we often equate discipline as a form punishment. For example, we discipline our children". She goes on to say, "we have to change our attitude towards discipline and see it as an opportunity change our life but more importantly to visually see the change that takes place when we are disciplined in aspects of our spiritual, physical, and mental life". If you would like to read the entire article, you can find it online at the Catholic Stand website. The article was written by Kendra Von Esh and was published on January 31, 2023.

I would hope that we enter this season of Lent with a spirit of gratitude to God for the blessings and love He bestows upon us. We are called to share that love and gratitude with those that we meet on our journey. May we see these disciplines as a way to refresh and renew our relationship with God, and not as something we have to do.

I hope that your Lent is a time of reflection and meditation on the life of our Lord in preparation for the great Feast of Easter. The parish of St. Jane Frances de Chantal has many prayer forms available to you so that you can enter into a deeper relationship with God and the people you meet along the way. Please refer to the card that was sent to your home or the church bulletin for more details about the events scheduled at St. Jane Frances de Chantal this Lenten season.

Lent is Coming Ash Wednesday Imposition of Ashes

Lent begins this week, with Ash Wednesday on February 22nd this year. We will have Mass at 8:00am and 6:00pm and two additional opportunities to receive ashes at a Liturgy of the Word at 12:15pm and 4:00pm.

Ashes will be distributed in the usual way. When you approach the minister, he/she will say: "Repent and believe in the Gospel" or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Ashes will then be placed on your forehead. No response is called for.

The message of the ashes remains the same: we are creatures of the earth, "remember you are dust," and our earthly life will pass away. But we are also baptized people on a journey to "turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel." At the liturgy of Ash Wednesday we receive ashes and hear Matthew's Gospel that explains that we are to cultivate three Lenten practices: fasting/abstinence, prayer, and almsgiving. These practices provide a structure to our penitential season. As we hear the message and receive the ashes on our foreheads, may we embark on a Lent that brings us ever closer to our loving and merciful God.

The Chosen series

If you are still considering joining in on The Chosen series, now is the time to decide and register by calling the parish office or emailing me at LHall@sjfparish.org. Please register to attend even if you can't be there every week – it is easy to catch an episode at home and then rejoin the group when you are able. Please register by Wednesday, February 22nd so we know there are enough people for the sessions and have adequate copies of materials.

Stations of the Cross

Please join us each Friday in Lent at 6:30pm in the main worship space for Stations of the Cross. Please note the time as it is different from previous years. Fr. Tony will lead the Stations this Friday.

Remote Stations of the Cross: If you cannot join us each Friday of Lent here at our parish, there are two options available online at sjfparish.org/sotc. The first is a video of Fr. Tony leading the Stations of the Cross which includes a link to the booklet he is using. The second option is The Way of the Cross: A Prayer for Hope and Healing Amidst a Global Pandemic by Zach Stachowski. The booklet is available on our website along with a link to the guided prayer: a YouTube video where the prayer is spoken, accompanied by pictures.

Lenten Reflection Books

Both the Little Black Books and two reflection books are available for the season of Lent in the gathering space. The Little Black Book contains six-minute reflections on the Passion According to Matthew. The reflections begin February 19th and continue through Easter Sunday. We also have a supply of two other booklets this year, A Season of Deep and Everlasting Healing by Deacon Eddie Ensley, PhD and Deacon Robert Herrmann and 40 Days of Faith, Hope, and Love by Alice Camille. The booklets contain daily reflections from Ash Wednesday through Holy Saturday. These booklets are a great resource for learning more about your faith and for deepening your relationship with Jesus through prayer. Suggested donation for each of the books is \$1.
