St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin

Mary. In honor of this feast, we will celebrate St. Joseph with food and fun following the 9:00am Mass today. All are welcome to enjoy continental breakfast and, for the kids, assemble birdhouses in honor of St. Joseph's vocation as a carpenter. Please join us!

The spouse of Mary the mother of Jesus and the legal father of Jesus according to Jewish law, Joseph is a model of humility and obedience to God's will. He followed God's instructions, given by angels in dreams, and took the pregnant Mary into his home as his wife, protected her and Jesus at the child's birth in Bethlehem through the family's sojourn in Egypt, and provided for them as a carpenter in Nazareth. This feast, which was celebrated locally as early as the ninth century, became a universal feast in the fifteenth century, when it was placed on the liturgical calendar. Pope Pius IX named St. Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church in 1870; he is also the patron saint of carpenters, the dying, and workers.

"Being a guardian is the distinctive trait of Joseph: Being the guardian is his great mission . . . We look to Joseph as the model educator, who watches over and accompanies Jesus as he grows 'in wisdom, age and grace,' as the Gospel says. He was not Jesus' father: the father of Jesus was God, but he was a father to Jesus, he was a father to Jesus in order to help him grow. And how did he help him grow? In wisdom, age and grace." —Pope Francis, March 19, 2014

FAMILY GOSPEL PAGE MARCH 19, 2023 JOHN 9:1-41, FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

REFLECTION

In today's Gospel story, Jesus met a man who couldn't see. This man was born blind. He had never been able to see, not once in his whole life. Jesus decided to heal the man. He took some dirt, and he mixed it with his own spit, to make mud! Umm, eew? Then he spread that mud on the blind man's eyes! Jesus told him to go wash up in a pool, and when the man did, he could see again! It was a miracle! Some people weren't too happy about this, though. Some people didn't believe it was the same man as the one who had been born blind. Some people were angry because Jesus did "work" on the Holy Sabbath day, since He made mud and healed someone. The neighbors and church leaders were questioning the healed man, and his parents. They were so suspicious and upset that they missed out on appreciating this great miracle. They closed their eyes, in a way.

Did you know we have eyes in our hearts? Not actual eyeballs, of course...but we can think about seeing with our hearts when we consider our attitudes towards God and one another. If your thoughts and your actions are focused on yourself, it's hard to have a "vision" or see outside your own little problems and needs. You might be able to look at things with your eyes, but you'll be "blinded" to what God wants you to see, or to the things other people need and are doing. It's like closing your eyes or wearing goggles that don't let you look around.

God wants us to recognize that HE is the light. He should be our vision and desire. Jesus is the light of the world, and our heart eyes should seek Him. Jesus sometimes said that people did not see things clearly, even if they could see with their physical eyes. That's how some people missed out on HIM and the amazing things He did! So let's keep our eyes open, spiritually and physically. We can look around to know what others need. We can keep our minds on God, and what He wants to do in our lives.

DISCUSSION

-When you close your eyes, what do you see? -What, or who, do you look forward to "seeing" in your life?

FAMILY ACTIVITIES

BLIND IDENTIFY: Have one family member sit at the table with a blindfold on. Other family members bring items from around the house to place on the table.

The blindfolded person tries to feel the items and identify them.

BLIND DRAWING: Sit at the table blindfolded with a piece of drawing paper and a pencil or crayons. Someone say what picture you should draw. Try drawing it blindfolded and see how they turn out. IE:

boat on a lake, Jesus on the cross, etc.




