Lent, it's how we perceive it.

As a child I remember how much I disliked the season of Lent. We would go to Church on Ash Wednesday, and for the next forty days we would hear the same song. The song, "These Forty days of Lent oh Lord", set in my mind a constant reminder of how long the Lenten season is and the disciplines that we are to implement into our spiritual journey. I am not making light of the season of Lent. How we perceive it will determine the outcome.

If we perceive Lent as a time when we have to give up this or that, then Lent is seen as something to "get through", then the song, "These forty days of Lent" becomes a dirge or a funeral march. If we perceive Lent as a time to step back and reflect upon our life's journey, then that same song takes on a totally different meaning for us.

The Church, as well as the calendar, informs us that the forty days of Lent draw us to the Great Feast of Easter. Easter will come whether we have prepared for it or not. The season of Lent should allow us time to prepare for the Risen Christ.

Let us use this time for self reflection, self discovery, and renewal within ourselves and those whom we come in contact with. Many people have walked with us on our life's journey. Let us pause to thank God for placing them in our life, just as He places us in the lives of others. As I have always said, God has a plan for us. It is not for us to understand what that plan is, our role as Catholics is to accept His plan.

I recently read the book titled *On Heaven and Earth*, co-authored by Jorge Mario Bergoglio (Pope Francis) and Abraham Skorka. The book addresses issues of Faith, Family, Prayer, and the Church in the Twenty-First Century. I would recommend it for one's spiritual reading during Lent. The essence of this book can be summarized by a quote from Pope Francis. He says, "God makes Himself felt in the hearts of each person. He also respects the culture of all people. God is open to all people. He calls everyone. He moves everyone to seek Him and to discover Him through creation."

May Mary's response to the angel Gabriel become our humble prayer, "I am a servant of the Lord, let it be done unto me as you will".

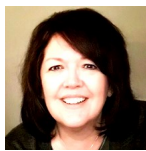

THE SEASON OF LENT

As we are now entering the third full week of Lent, it may be the right time to take stock of your Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Have you set aside time for these practices? Have you found your efforts fruitful?

It is often the case, in all things in our lives, that we make concrete plans to change or grow in some way. During Lent, we seek to grow spiritually, in closer relationship with Jesus and with our fellow humans. I saw a quote recently, attributed to the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal, that I found powerful: "If Christianity is about a person, that means Lent is also about a person. Lent is not simply about prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Those disciplines help us focus on what we need to focus on: namely, a person. Lent is about a person. Lent is about Jesus."

It follows, then, that our focus on Jesus is to get to know Jesus more fully. How do we do that? First and foremost, we can turn to Sacred Scripture. The Gospels provide an intimate sharing in Jesus' life on earth and in his teachings. Prayer is a beautiful way to get to know Jesus, including praying with the Scriptures. Reflecting on the Scriptures and conversing with Jesus is like a conversation with someone who has similar experiences to yours. Sharing commonalities allows us to bridge the gap between our lives. Sharing our experiences in the world with Jesus in prayer brings us closer. In prayer, we also share the joys and sorrows of life with the one who knows us best. Also, in prayer we can seek counsel and support from Jesus in managing the opportunities and challenges of daily life.

Have you chosen to fast from something other than the stereotypical chocolate? When we fast, we also seek to grow closer to Jesus. Fasting from anything that impedes our relationship with Jesus is what this Lenten practice is all about. We can fast from unkindness, from worldly things that take up too much of our time and get in the way of spiritual practices, or we can fast from habits that are contrary to our faith. Fasting is far more than giving up chocolate or skipping a meal. The purpose of fasting is not to endure the torture of denial from something for forty days and then return to it on Easter Sunday. On the contrary, it is to bring about growth in the spirit, to make a true change in our lives that leads to a greater relationship with those around us and with Jesus.

As you take stock of your Lenten journey this week, talk to Jesus about the path you are taking, including the successes and the missteps. As the quote above says, Lent is about Jesus, so who better to engage with on our journey of faith... in the forty days leading up to Easter Sunday and throughout our lives.

WHEN: Saturday, March 23rd from 5:00pm until about 10:00pm.

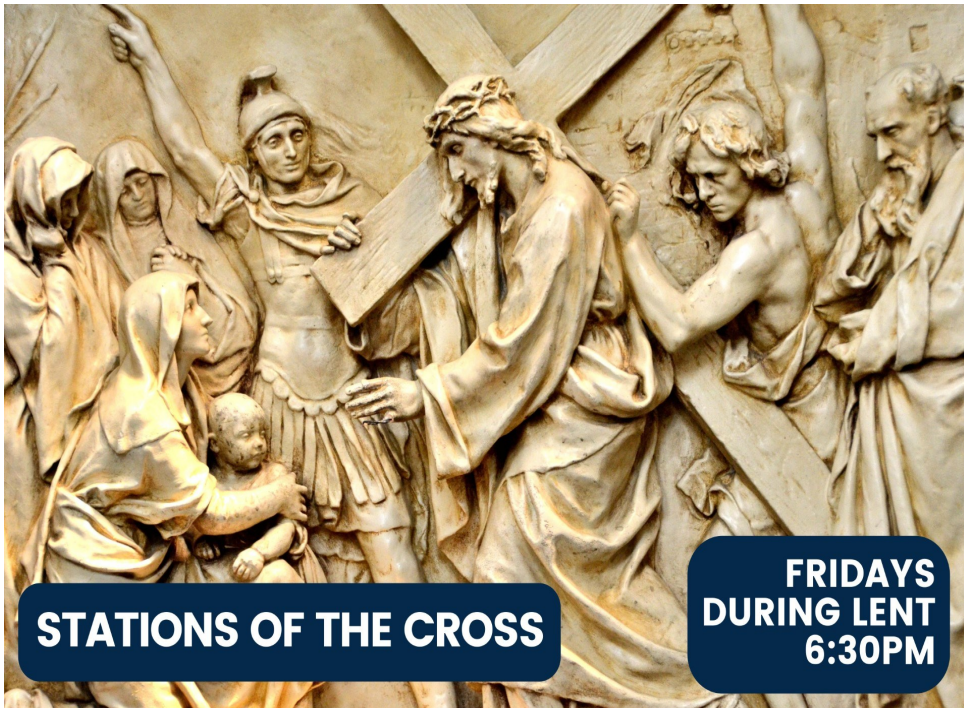

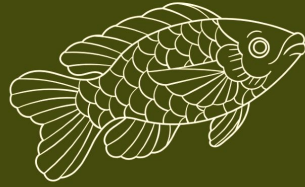


ST. LEO'S SOUP KITCHEN

ACTIVITIES

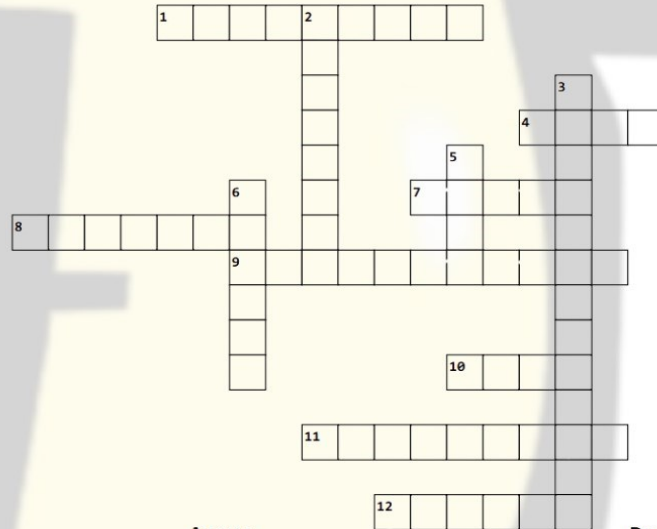
