It is difficult for me to believe that Holy Week is upon us. Holy week has a great significance in my life. When I was a seminarian at St. John's Provincial Seminary in Plymouth, Michigan we had the opportunity to study in Israel for 11 weeks. We lived in Ein Karem, the birth place of St. John the Baptist and we studied in Jerusalem. We stayed with the Sisters of Sion who have their motherhouse and

convent in Ein Karem. We made many day trips to various areas in and around Jerusalem. From travelling to the Sea of Galilee to climbing Mt. Sinai to see the little town of Bethlehem, it is a trip I will always remember.

As a side note, I made a second trip to Israel ten years after I was ordained and celebrated Masses at the places important in the life and ministry of Jesus. I look forward to returning to Israel soon to see friends that I still keep in contact with and to visit the places that hold a special place in my heart.

During the time we travelled all over Israel and walked in the footsteps of Jesus, the most memorable week of that trip was Holy Week. We celebrated Mass in the upper room on Holy Thursday, walked the Via Dolores on Good Friday, slept in the garden of Gethsemane, and visited the tomb of Jesus on Easter Sunday morning. It was a trip that I will never forget. For those who have been to Israel, once you have been to the places Jesus walked and taught, the Holy Scriptures take on a deeper and richer meaning for you. You will never read or hear the Word of God proclaimed the same again. The Word of God becomes more meaningful because you visited the very spot where it happened. I am looking forward to travelling to Israel in a few weeks.

I invite you to take part in the Holy Week liturgies from Passion Sunday to Easter morning. The liturgies are rich in tradition and each liturgy has its own distinction within Holy week and they point us to the great feast of Easter. Again, I invite you to take part in all or some of the liturgies of Holy Week as we prepare for Easter.

Have a joyous and wonderful Holy Week.

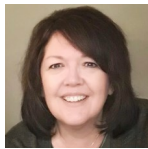

This Lent we continue on our journey to holiness, a life led as a reflection of the love and teachings of Jesus Christ, made possible by the grace given us in the Sacraments.

Having completed our review of the Sacraments of Initiation, we move to the Sacraments of Healing. The two sacraments of healing are Reconciliation and the Anointing of the Sick.

Reconciliation is the sacrament through which we confess our sins to God and ask for forgiveness. Jesus taught always of God's great love for us and his mercy in forgiving our transgressions. As people of faith, we follow Jesus, including taking part in the Sacrament of Reconciliation as he asked us to.

In sacred scripture, on the night of his resurrection, Jesus greeted his disciples and "breathed on them, and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained'" (John 20:22-23). With those words, Jesus instituted the Sacrament of Reconciliation, calling on the apostles to continue his mission of forgiveness. The apostles passed this mission down to bishops and priests so that we can experience God's love and mercy personally.

Praying and asking God for forgiveness is important and necessary as, when we sin, we rupture our relationship with God. But the other half of the equation is that, when we sin, we rupture our relationship with our neighbor. We are all interconnected with each other; St. Paul speaks in Sacred Scripture of how we are all one body in Christ (1 Cor 12:20). We can say then that, when one person sins, it affects others and, in fact, all believers in Christ. Knowing that, we need to seek the forgiveness of God and of the other members of the Body of Christ.

The person receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation brings the matter—the sins committed which have not been previously confessed, and the acts of contrition, confession, and penance. The form is the words, "God the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of his Son, has reconciled the world to himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church may God give you pardon and peace. And I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." The ordinary minister is the priest, acting in the person of Christ, representing God and the people of God.

There are many advantages to receiving reconciliation. It is an act of humility to speak our sins aloud, which can lead to healing. A priest also speaks the words of absolution which make it clear that our sins are forgiven, and that sacramental grace is given. The effects of the sacrament of reconciliation are forgiveness and spiritual resurrection. We are cleansed of our sins and fortified to fulfill our call to holiness. This repeatable sacrament is regularly available and should be received at least once per year.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is one that should be prepared for and received with the proper disposition: baptized, Catholic, repentant, aware of sins and open to forgiveness. It is important to go into the Sacrament of Reconciliation with a contrite heart and a desire to avoid the behaviors that separate us from God.

Prior to receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation, preparation should include an examination of conscience, prayerfully reflecting on thoughts, words, and deeds and seeking to uncover those areas that need healing. There are many different ways to examine one's conscience, including using resources available

online. The United States Council of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has several helpful examinations available at <https://www.usccb.org/prayer-and-worship/sacraments-and-sacramentals/penance/examinations-of-conscience>.

If it has been a while since you received the grace of Reconciliation and feel you don't know what to do, please know that the priest will be happy to guide you. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available here at St. Jane every Tuesday from 5:30pm – 6:30pm. The Reconciliation Room is located in the Chapel where you can prayerfully prepare to receive the Sacrament. A Lenten Reconciliation Day is also available on Monday, April 11th, at St. Cyril & Methodius, from 10am – 12 noon and from 6 pm– 9pm.

This Lenten season (and into Easter), as we explore the seven sacraments, we hope that you will come to a deeper understanding and appreciation for the way God speaks to us through the sacraments and for the great grace they impart. Next week we will look at the second of the Sacraments of Healing, Anointing of the Sick.

DECORATING THE WORSHIP SPACE FOR EASTER HELP NEEDED!

We will be preparing the Worship Space to celebrate the joy of Easter on **Good Friday, April 15th**, immediately following the Good Friday liturgy, **approximately 2:30p.m.** If you can stay and help for an hour, we would be very grateful! No special skills or sign-up is needed, simply stay and we will put you to work!

LITTLE WHITE BOOKS

The Little White Books for the Easter Season are available again this year in the Gathering Space. This booklet is an excellent resource for daily prayer during the 50 days of Easter. It's important to take time each day to be mindful of God's presence in our lives and the great gift of the Risen Christ. A \$1 donation for each book would be appreciated.

BIBLE STUDY

Are you interesting in learning more about the Bible in a casual, sharing atmosphere? Our Six Weeks with the Bible group began meeting in January this year and has completed two sessions thus far. We will have a third session that will run six consecutive Tuesday mornings at 9am, April 26 – May 31, 2022. The book for this session is titled Acts: The Good News of the Holy Spirit, focusing on the Book of Acts. We utilize a learning system called Six Weeks with the Bible by Loyola Press. Each six-week series utilizes a book that the participants purchase (approximately \$10) that explores either a book of the Bible or a particular theme. The guide includes the Scripture passages, insights from Church fathers and saints, questions for discussion and reflection, and prayer suggestions. It doesn't matter if you have never studied the Bible before or if you have experience with Bible study, all are welcome!

Books must be ordered so I will need to know quickly if you wish to join, no later than April 14th this week. Reading and reflecting on Scripture provides a wonderful way to get to know God and enter into deeper relationship with him. ACTIVITY

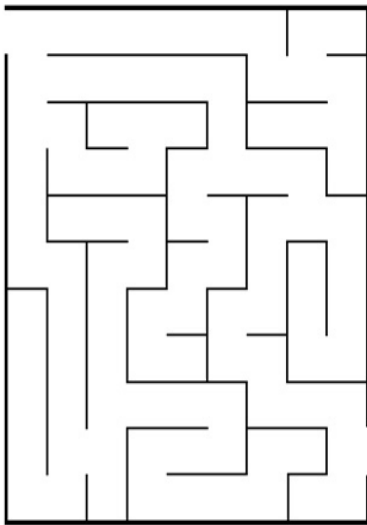
