**Holy Week** 

It is difficult for me to believe that Holy Week is upon us. Holy week has a great significance in my life. When I was a seminarian at St. John's Provincial Seminary in Plymouth, Michigan, we had the opportunity to study in

Israel for 11 weeks. We lived in Ein Karem, the birth place of St. John the Baptist and we studied in Jerusalem. We stayed with the Sisters of Sion who have their motherhouse and convent in Ein Karem.

We made many day trips to various areas in and around Jerusalem. From travelling to the Sea of Galilee to climbing Mt. Sinai to see the little town of Bethlehem. It was a trip that I will always remember. As a side note, I made a second trip to Israel ten years after I was ordained and celebrated Masses at the places important in the life and ministry of Jesus. I look forward to returning to Israel next year to see friends that I still keep in contact with, and to visit the places that hold a special place in my heart. For those who have been to Israel, you will agree that the Scriptures take on a deeper meaning when you see and visit the places we hear about in the Bible.

During that time, we travelled all over Israel and walked in the footsteps of Jesus. The most memorable week of that trip was Holy Week. We celebrated Mass in the upper room on Holy Thursday, walked the Via Dolores on Good Friday, slept in the garden of Gethsemane, and visited the tomb of Jesus on Easter Sunday morning. It was a trip that I will never forget.

For those who have been to Israel, once you have been to the places Jesus walked and taught, the Holy Scriptures take on a deeper and richer meaning for you. You will never read or hear the Word of God proclaimed the same again. The Word of God becomes more meaningful because you visited the very spot where it happened.

I invite you to take part in the Holy Week liturgies from Passion Sunday to Easter morning. The liturgies are rich in tradition and each liturgy has its own distinction within Holy week and they point us to the great feast of Easter. Again, I invite you to take part in all or some of the liturgies of Holy Week as we prepare for Easter.

Have a joyous and wonderful Holy Week.

### **Triduum Rituals**

Lent comes to an end before the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy

Thursday. That liturgy begins the Triduum, the great Three Days that celebrate the central mystery of our faith. Triduum rituals include many symbols that invite us all to baptismal renewal. Here are some examples.

Washing of Feet: After the homily on Holy Thursday, we echo our master in the washing of feet. This ritual reminds us that our baptismal commitment means we are to be servants of one another. In the time of St. Ambrose in Milan, those who were baptized also had their feet washed, because of Jesus' words to Peter: "Whoever has bathed has no need except to have his feet washed" (Jn 13:10). Many scholars have seen a baptismal reference in those words.

Veneration of the Cross: As part of our observance of Good Friday, we venerate the cross on which Christ died. The action of veneration challenges us to be willing to accept the cross, too, for it is the only way to resurrection. Through Baptism, we shared in Christ's death that we might come to new life. Every year we are called to deepen our identification with his cross and resurrection.

Waters of Baptism: The core of our celebrations of the Easter Vigil is the Baptism of the elect. As we share in their joy on this holy night, we are all called to renew our own baptismal promises, to live in the joy of life in the Risen One. Lent comes to its fulfillment around the waters of the font.

Another element of the Triduum is the reception of the Holy Oils. Each year, on Holy Thursday, the Chrism Mass is celebrated at the Blessed Sacrament Cathedral, presided over by Archbishop Vigneron. At this liturgy, in the rite of the blessing of oils and consecrating the chrism, the bishop prepares the sacred oils for use in the diocese. These oils are received in our parish on Holy Thursday evening and placed in the ambry. These oils will then be used throughout the year for Baptism, Confirmation, and Anointing of the Sick. The oils are used as follows:

- The oil of the sick for the anointing of all those who suffer in mind and body. By this holy anointing, may the sick gain strength, be released from fear, and receive the consolation of faith.
- The oil of catechumens for the anointing of all infants, children and adults who ask to be baptized. By this anointing, may they be strengthened in their journey to the waters of new birth.
- The holy Chrism, the mixture of oil and fragrant perfume for the anointing of the baptized in the Sacrament of Confirmation, for the anointing of the presbyters' hands and the bishop's head and also the altar and walls of the church. By this anointing, we confer the presence and essence of the Holy Spirit.

#### **OPPORTUNITY TO RECEIVE THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION**

SS. Cyril and Methodius will have two opportunities for the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Monday, April 3<sup>rd</sup>, from 10:00am-12:00pm and from 6:00pm-9:00pm. As always, the Sacrament is available here at St. Jane Frances each Tuesday from 5:30pm-6:30pm



#### REFLECTION

When Jesus arrived in Jerusalem, a very large crowd gathered to welcome him. Some of them spread their cloaks on the road for Jesus to ride on, while others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. Why would they do that? They were treating Jesus like a king!

The Bible tells us that the crowds that went ahead of him and those that followed shouted:

"Hosanna to the Son of David!" "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

The people greeted Jesus as a King that day. Today, Jesus wants to be your King -- and he will be if you will allow him to come into your heart and rule over your life. Always give Jesus your love.

#### DISCUSSION

-What public events or traditions do you look forward to every year (parades, etc)? -What are some things you do that show you follow Jesus?

#### FAMILY ACTIVITIES

**HOSANNA BRANCH WAVERS:** Use green construction paper to trace your hand 7 times. Cut out the 7 green hands. Tape or glue them onto a paper towel roll, one toward the bottom then two side by side the rest of the way up. \*Be sure to leave room at the bottom to wrap your hand around the waver so you can wave it in the air.

**ROAD MAP TO EASTER:** On separate pieces of 8 ½ x 11 white paper, print or write the days of Holy Week: Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday. Place several pieces of colored construction paper on the floor (at least 5, but more makes it more fun). Place the days of Holy Week in order along the construction paper. Walk along them and talk about what each one of the day's entail.
