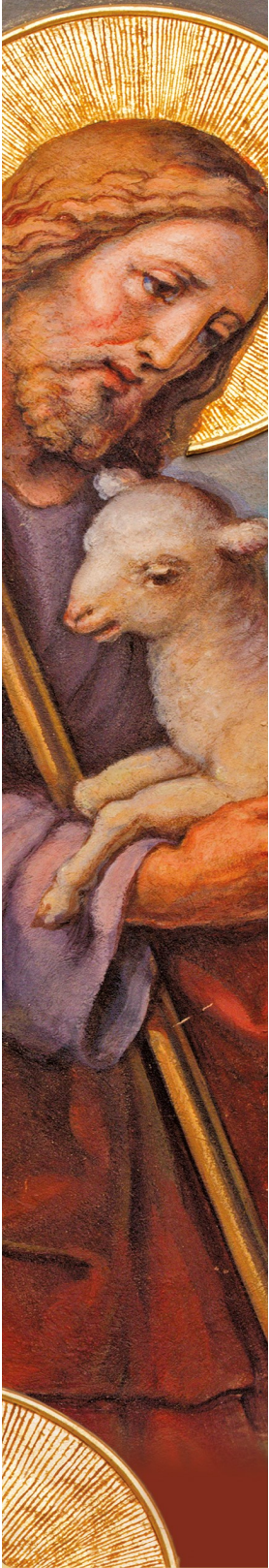

Come to the table, it is the Lord who invites.

This weekend the children from our Faith Formation program who have been preparing to receive the Eucharist will do so at the 11:30am mass. The Lord has

invited them to begin coming to His table, to be fed and to be nourished with His body and blood.

Throughout our lives, there are a few days or events that we remember. One such day that seems to be forever etched on our mind is our First Communion Day. We remember the weather, the clothes we wore, the people who were there, the party afterward and the list goes on.

The point I am trying to make, is that our First Communion Day was memorable, and we relive those memories every time we celebrate at the Eucharistic table. Whether we are aware of it or not, our First Communion Day replays itself in our mind every time we come to the Eucharistic liturgy.

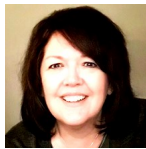

This week, April 22nd, we celebrate Earth Day. As Catholics, we have a particular responsibility to care for all of God's creation. "We show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of creation. Care for the earth is not just an Earth Day

slogan, it is a requirement of our faith. We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship with all of God's creation. This environmental challenge has fundamental moral and ethical dimensions that cannot be ignored" (USCCB).

Care for our Common Home is the seventh theme of Catholic Social Teaching. In 2015, Pope Francis wrote *Laudato Si': On Care for Our Common Home* to address all people of the planet on how we are to care for the planet in order to preserve it for the common good. "The title is taken from the first line of the encyclical, "Laudato si', mi Signore," or "Praise be to you, my Lord." In the words of this beautiful canticle, Saint Francis of Assisi reminds us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us. The encyclical is divided into six chapters which together provide a thorough analysis of human life and its three intertwined relationships: with God, with our neighbor, and with the earth" (USCCB).

On October 4, 2023, Pope Francis released an Apostolic Exhortation, *Laudate Deum*, addressed to "All People of Good Will On The Climate Crisis." In this exhortation, Pope Francis states "I have realized that our responses have not been adequate, while the world in which we live is collapsing and may be nearing the breaking point (Paragraph 2)." This Earth Day would be a good time to read this 2023 Apostolic Exhortation and renew our efforts to work for change, including to pray for God's creation, and to take action to both reduce our individual actions that contribute to environmental concerns and to seek to understand how we can affect change in our local community.
