Recently I read an article by Dr. Jeff Mirus entitled, *Proverbs, read spiritually*. The author informs his readers that the book of Proverbs is an instruction on the art of right living. Dr. Mirus states in his article that “the Book of Proverbs deals with the full range of life, from the spiritual heights to the pragmatism of daily life.” The Book of Proverbs is about everything.

The same can be said about the Book of Psalms which addresses every human emotion from life to death, to forgiveness and sin, love and hate. Every human emotion that we experience can be found in the Book of Psalms.

I would encourage you to pick up the Sacred Scriptures (the Bible) and open it to either the Book of Proverbs or the Book of Psalms and use them as a form of meditation. In the hustle and bustle of our lives we need to take some time to step out of our day to day life and reflect upon our lives in light of the situation that we find ourselves in.

Dr. Mirus suggests that the Proverbs found between chapters 17 and 26 are of the greatest spiritual interest. With regards to the Book of Psalms each psalm lends itself to a deeper reflection and allows that reader to center his or her attention on a power that is much greater than us, namely God.

You have heard me say so often, that God has a plan for each one of us and He does. It may not be the plan we envision for ourselves. We need to see God’s hand in our lives and the many ways that He blesses and enriches our lives with the people and experiences that we find ourselves dealing with. I am reminded of a saying that I heard many years ago which helps me to keep my life centered. Do you want to make God laugh? Tell Him your plans for the day.

Bon mot: Mark Twain once said, most people are bothered by those passages of Scripture they cannot understand: but as for me, I have noticed that the passages that trouble me the most are the one I do understand.

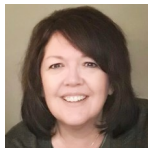

HOLY WEEK:

As we continue with the last weeks of Lent, we are looking forward to Holy Week and Easter Sunday! As anticipated, the ongoing

pandemic and the need for safe worship will continue to impact our liturgies this year. While some elements may not be celebrated communally, all aspects of the liturgies can be reflected on personally, in prayer. Palm Sunday will begin simply, without a procession. As usual, you will receive a blessed palm branch on the way in to the worship space. If you wish to have additional branches for your home, please pick them up on the way out, after all in attendance have received one. We will participate in the Gospel proclamation again this year, with a worship aid provided. We ask that you keep the aid; the Holy Week schedule will be provided on the back of the aid.

Holy Thursday will not include the Washing of the Feet and the procession to the Altar of Repose will be different. The blessed sacrament will be processed to the Tabernacle, then the monstrance will be displayed for the period of Adoration that begins immediately following and concludes with Evening Prayer at 10pm. We invite you to reflect on the great message of service to one another that is found in the Washing of the Feet, prayerfully remembering Jesus's commandment to love God and neighbor. Please know that you are welcome to spend time with the Lord any time the parish is open. Good Friday will include an extra prayer for the end of the pandemic and our adoration of the cross will be placed at the end of the liturgy, rather than before communion. We ask this year that you simply make a profound bow before the cross, without kissing or touching it, again, for the safety of all. Our Easter Vigil celebration will be joyous as we are bringing two people into full communion with the Church! We will eliminate the fire as well as part of the Service of Light. We are unable to have a reception following this liturgy as serving food is still not possible. As we remember the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ for the salvation of all, we give thanks for this great gift won on the cross and remember all those who have suffered through this pandemic. While our celebrations will look slightly different, the spirit with which we come together as community remains.

HOLY OILS

Each year during Holy Week the Chrism Mass is celebrated at the Blessed Sacrament Cathedral, presided over by Archbishop Vigneron. At this liturgy, in the rite of the blessing of oils and consecrating the chrism, the bishop prepares the sacred oils for use in the diocese. These oils are received in our parish on Holy Thursday evening and placed in the ambry. These oils will then be used throughout the year for Baptism, Confirmation and Anointing of the Sick. The oils are used as follows:

The oil of the sick for the anointing of all those who suffer in mind and body. By this holy anointing, may the sick gain strength, be released from fear, and receive the consolation of faith.

The oil of catechumens for the anointing of all infants, children and adults who ask to be baptized. By this anointing, may they be strengthened in their journey to the waters of new birth.

The holy Chrism, the mixture of oil and fragrant perfume for the anointing of the baptized in the Sacrament of Confirmation, for the anointing of the presbyters' hands and the bishop's head and also the altar and walls of the church. By this anointing, we confer the presence and essence of the Holy Spirit.

These holy oils are an important element in the sacramental life of our church.



During the Lenten season, we ask you to pray for our adults seeking initiation. I would also like to ask you to give them a card with a note of welcome to the parish. A simple Easter card is sufficient, and the note need be nothing more than "Welcome to St. Jane Frances de Chantal." These cards will then be given to the newly-initiated after the Easter Vigil. This gesture is always appreciated by our newest members, as it makes them feel welcome and truly a part of the community of our parish.

This year, we have two candidates: Lee Sutton and Michelle Slosek. Please bring your cards of welcome to the Parish Office, and we'll see that they get to Lee and Michelle.

Thank you for your welcoming spirit, and please remember our candidates in your prayers this Lenten season!

It surely is easy for people to question and criticize others for a myriad of things. Even Jesus was subjected to mild rebukes in today's Gospel: "Lord, if only you had

been here, our brother Lazarus would not have died!" That's a pretty heavy burden to place on someone. Yet, we foist this blame-game upon ourselves and others all the time.

Of course, Jesus had another purpose for the delay in getting to Lazarus, to illustrate what was to come through everlasting and eternal life after death. The people could not have known that. This concept is so difficult, almost impossible, for us as human beings to comprehend. Perhaps the best way we can understand is to contemplate what happens each night as we go to bed. We never really know exactly the moment we fall asleep, but know we do. And, we have faith that we'll awaken at some point the next morning. If we are lucky, we're given another day. However, what do we do with that day? Do we use it for good? Do we accomplish anything worthwhile? Do we pray for others? Or do we fall back into something for which we need redemption and forgiveness yet again?

Wouldn't it be nice to go through a whole day without sin, or hurting anyone's feelings, or blaming others perhaps for offenses we ourselves often do? A couple things I'm personally working on this Lent are instant responses to criticism or slights and a 'rush to judgment' in forming opinions about what I hear or read. As a writer and journalist, I was taught there are three sides to every story: one side's version, the other side, and then, the truth. To write a fair and balanced account, those need to be searched out. But who takes the time and effort to do that, and where do you go for the truth? These days we hear so much, so many statements, stories, supposed facts....and the tendency is to immediately take them at face value only to find out later they either weren't true or that we didn't get the entire story. We must fight that urge and be patient. In a 24/7 news cycle with hundreds of channels that demand constant content, no one seems to be fact-checking. Wrong information gets passed on and the story spirals out of control. If we've repeated the report, we feel duped. The solution? Look before you leap....or, don't pass it on. In a previous column, I mentioned two words to live by and they apply here too: patience and kindness. Before you speak ill of someone or something, or directly criticize, ask yourself if it's true or necessary? Above all, is it kind? If not, please reconsider. We all have wounds and burdens we are carrying which often aren't apparent. Keep in mind this old spiritual, 'There is a Balm in Gilead': "There is a balm in Gilead to make the wounded whole; there is a balm in Gilead, to heal the sin-sick soul. Sometimes I feel discouraged and think my work's in vain, but then the Holy Spirit revives my soul again!"

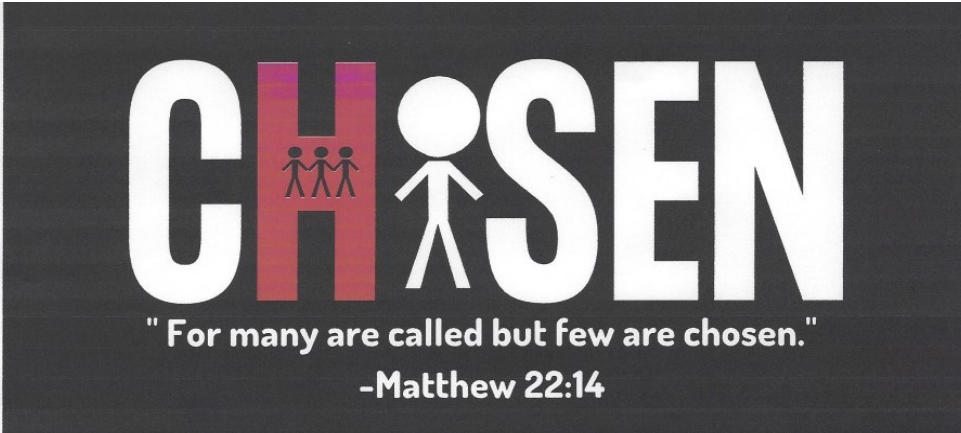

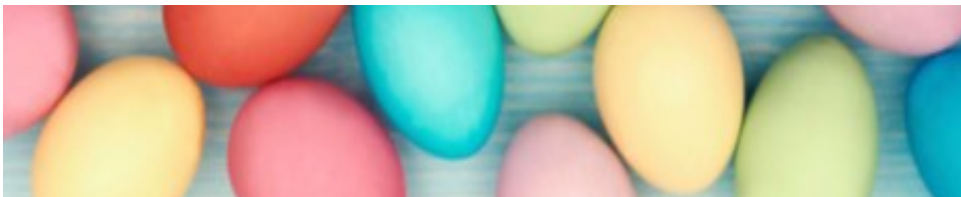

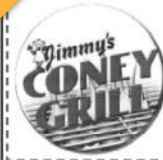
