Christ is Alive

In response to the October 2018 Synod on Young People, Pope Francis issued an apostolic exhortation titled *Christ is Alive, (Christus Vivit.)*. As an aside, the pilgrimage that I led to Italy last October our

group had the opportunity to attend the opening Mass for the Synod for young people with Pope Francis in St. Peter's square. The document is reader friendly and is written as a letter to a specific group of people: namely young people.

I had the opportunity to read the Pope's apostolic exhortation and found it to be a wonderful document that encourages young people to actively renew the Church. The document defines the age of young people as between the ages of 16-29. We often hear that young people are the future of the Church. In the document, Pope Francis reminds and challenges young people by stating that they are the "now of God".

In paragraph 64 of Christ is Alive, Pope Francis explains the meaning of the "now of God". He says: we cannot just say that young people are the future of the world. They are its present, even now they are helping to enrich it. Young people are no longer children. They are at a time of life when they begin to assume a number of responsibilities, sharing alongside adults in the growth of the family, society and the church. Yet the times are changing, leading us to ask: What are today's young people really like? What is going on in their lives?

Throughout the document, the pope encourages young people to share the talents and gifts that God has bestowed upon them to renew the church. This document is written and directed to young people. I would encourage young people to read this document and discern what your gifts and talents are and how they will enrich the church. The Pope ends with a wish that young people "keep running the race", as the church needs your momentum, your enthusiasm, your intuition, your faith.

As we journey towards the Feast of Pentecost, may we call down the Holy Spirit to enlighten our hearts and minds in our response to the needs and life of the church? I recall the words of Cardinal John Dearden as he returned from Rome after attending Vatican Council II. He would often say: "the more difficult the task, the more the Spirit will be given".

Bon mot: Difficulties are God's errands; and when we are sent upon them we should esteem it a proof of God's confidence --- as a compliment from him.

Today's readings remind us that God sent his Son to walk and live among us so that we LHall@sifparish.org could better know God and understand and live out his commandments of love. The Israelites had lived with the Law

as given to Moses, the Ten Commandments, but often failed to truly understand what they had received. They interpreted the laws, often struggling between the letter of the law and the spirit of the law. Jesus came, as he said, "not to abolish the law...but to fulfill [the law] (Matthew 5:17). Knowing that his time on earth was drawing to a close, Jesus spells out exactly what the Law intended: "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:34-35).

Jesus doesn't just suggest to the Apostles that they should love one another, Jesus commands his disciples. Jesus makes it clear that it is in living out their lives with the love of God that everyone will know that they are his disciples. As we reflect on today's readings, we can ask ourselves if we can be recognized by our love. Do we show the love we have for one another in what we do and say? Do we love one another as much as Jesus loves us? Are we living out Jesus' command or are we more concerned about the letter of the law, following the rubrics exactly and judging those who do not as unworthy of God's love and mercy?

In the first reading, Paul and Barnabas provide a wonderful example of living out the new commandment of love. When we hear the first reading, we get a sense of the many places Paul and Barnabas experienced on their travels to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ to the Gentiles (those who were not Jewish). We can be certain that the news wasn't always well received or followed, but the Scriptures tell us that they "had opened a door of faith" to all they encountered. That is an important element in following Jesus' commandment to love God and neighbor. Our behavior that reflects the love and mercy of God demonstrates that we are followers of Christ; we can be an open door to those who observe the love and joy we exhibit in our interactions with others.

Jesus' commandment is challenging, it is not just the warm feelings we get when we think of loving the other. Paul and Barnabas relied on the "grace of God for the work" (Acts 14:26). Left to our own devices, we would find it very difficult to live out the sacrificial love of God; it is by the grace of God, through the Holy Spirit, that we are able to live out the commandment of love. To love as Jesus taught means to sacrifice our own needs at times for the good of the other, for the common needs that all humanity experiences. This means we have to be willing to give of ourselves, to even lay down our lives for one another. Our faith makes this possible, because we know that God is right here, renewing us, redeeming us, loving us.

May the God of love bless us in the challenge to love each other.

May is National Nurses Month and I wanted to take this opportunity to recognize our own parish nurses here at St. Jane Frances. They work with our Health Ministry through the Parish Nurse

Program at Ascension Health. The Ministry has been going on for some time now, but Covid put a bit of a halt on any in-person activities over the last couple of years. We are looking forward to bringing back some more in-house activities soon. So please stay tuned and let us know which ones you might like to see return.

There are several nurses who volunteer their time: Kathy Pawlik, Chris Cosnowski, Doreen Corby, and Wendy Rzeppa. For now, you can see them when we offer our Blood Pressure Screenings on the last weekend of the month. However, this month, May 28/29 is Memorial Day weekend so there will not be any screening those days, though Screenings will continue throughout the summer months

You may not know that the Parish Nurse program through Ascension Health is a faith-based effort hosted at dozens of churches in the area. In the past, the nurses and I, as Staff liaison, would attend quarterly meetings and presentations about a number of current health topics and hear some wonderful speakers who are experts in their fields. Those evenings always began and ended in prayer and in song. They were truly informative but also very spiritually fulfilling and inspirational events.

Did you know that the Health Ministry has a bulletin board in the main hallway which is filled with great information for you to consider? There is also a calendar of events for programs in which you can enroll or take part. Take a stroll there after Mass and check it out. Quite often, there's information available on the table you can take with you.

Turning to a Parish Nurse for help and support is also something you can do. Our Health Ministry nurses are professional or retired nurses who are members of the congregation and attend church, just as you do. Parish nursing programs are a relatively new but fast-growing idea with more than 16,000 nurses practicing in the U.S. alone. Most parish nurses embrace their work as a calling, a vocation, or caring, and are ready and willing to help you and your loved ones should you need their assistance.

If you have a health concern, a new diagnosis, or a desire to improve your general health or nutritional practices, they are here to help. Parish Nurses can build a bridge of support between you, your family, your doctor or health care provider, and your faith community. To reach one of our nurses, you can always call the parish office and leave a message for me (Ext. 103) and I can put you in touch with our team.

These days, we are still somewhat under Covid parameters and do understand how difficult it can be to get in to see your doctor. While talking with a parish nurse is not meant to take the place of your doctor's visit, nor should it, a meaningful conversation with these special ladies can ease your mind.

We do love our nurses...they are truly angels here on earth!
