Peace be with you!!!

It goes without saying that we celebrated Easter differently this year. It was wonderful to see so many people come to celebrate the great feast of Easter, yet Easter came and as in years past, we celebrated the Resurrection of the Lord in a way that was meaningful for us. He has been raised. Indeed He has. He is not in the tomb. In this Easter season, these fifty days between Easter and Pentecost the church invites us to reflect deeper upon our relationship with Christ.

The Gospel for the second Sunday after Easter was from John 20:19-31. It is the Gospel when Jesus appears to the disciples who have locked themselves in the upper room. Despite the locked door Jesus appears to them and says, "Peace be with you." This piece of Scripture is one of my favorites and I reflect upon it often. You may recall the homily I preached three weeks ago, in which I said if I could give this Gospel a title it would be: **What Jesus could have said and didn't.**

If we reflect upon all that had happened from Holy Thursday to Easter. The reaction of the disciples when they find themselves in difficult and challenging situations, their first reaction is to run from the situation and distance themselves from Jesus. Yet, in the Gospel, Jesus knowing all that had happened and says to his disciples, "Peace be with you". And a calming presence comes over the disciples.

This has been a difficult and long journey for all of us. It has changed our lives and has become the "new normal". When we find ourselves becoming frustrated and unable to see any hope in the present situation may we take comfort in the words of Jesus, Peace be with you and know that I am with you until the end of time. I would invite you to read John 20:19-31 and meditate upon it as we journey through this Easter season.

I recently read an article about how the pandemic has affected how we look at life and all that life has to offer us. The author of the article explores two gifts that have been stifled by the pandemic, namely our ability to see our experiences through the lens of wonderment and awe. This Easter season provides for us the opportunity to see with the eyes of faith the many ways which God reveals himself to us. God has blessed us, let us not take that for granted.

Like the disciples, we too will receive the gifts of the Spirit. The challenge for us as we prepare to celebrate the Feast of Pentecost will be: do we avail ourselves to these gifts or do we allow them to remain dormant. The choice is ours.

Bon mot: Faith is to believe, on the word of God, what we do not see, and its reward is to see and enjoy what we believe.

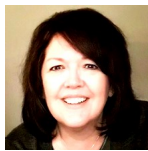

Our Lady of Fatima Feast Day May 13th

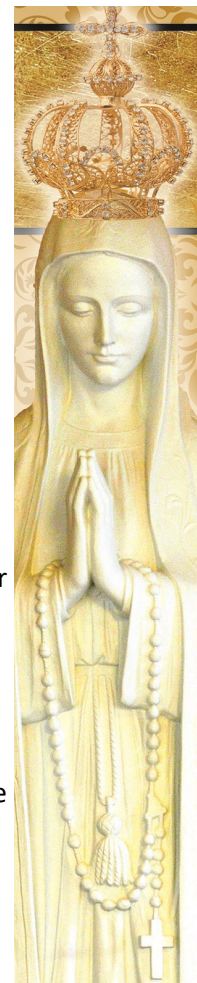
Mary appeared to three peasant children near Fatima, Portugal, six times between May 13 and October 13, 1917, and asked for prayers for world peace and an end to World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia. She entrusted the children with three secrets, regarding devotion to her Immaculate Heart, a vision of hell, and a "bishop in white" shot by soldiers firing bullets and arrows. Many connect the third secret to the attempted assassination of Blessed Pope John Paul II on May 13, 1981, and the pope thanked Mary for guiding the bullet and saving him. At the Vatican, Pope Francis has stood before the statue of Our Lady from the Fatima shrine and formally entrusted the world to Mary. "In Lucia's account, the three chosen children found themselves surrounded by God's light as it radiated from Our Lady. She enveloped them in the mantle of Light that God had given her. According to the belief and experience of many pilgrims, if not of all, Fatima is more than anything this mantle of Light that protects us, here as in almost no other place on earth. We need but take refuge under the protection of the Virgin Mary and to ask her, as the Salve Regina teaches: 'show unto us...Jesus.'"

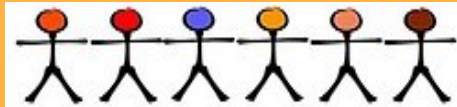
