We recently completed our third six-week Bible Study, this time on the Acts of the Apostles. The group has enjoyed exploring portions of Acts along with the first part of the Book of Genesis and selections from the

Gospel of Mark this year. In these six-week sessions we read aloud the passages assigned for the week, then discuss the insights that have come from reading and praying with the Scriptures.

We discuss the cultural settings, the connections between the Old and New Testaments, and how God speaks to us today through the Scriptures. We will take the summer off and then return in the early Fall with a series entitled "Relating to Others as Jesus Would." This series is a little different, considered a "theme" book, including selections from the Gospels of Mark, Luke, and John. The Scriptures reveal how Jesus related to his family, to those who were seeking a relationship with God, to sinners, strangers, friends, and those who rejected him and sought to put up barriers to his teaching.

In this time when disunity is often the central focus in our society, we can look to Jesus and his relationships for guidance and wisdom. In this exploration we will discuss how we can learn from Jesus' experiences with others and put what we have learned into practice.

The series we use is very understandable and organized to provide both fascinating insight to the Scriptures as well as a lot of opportunity to discuss and share. If you are interested in joining in, we meet on Tuesday mornings, 10:00am—11:30am. Our next session will begin September 20th and run through October 25th. If there is enough interest, we can also add an evening session, so please let me know if you would like to participate but are only available in the evenings. If you have further questions or would like to see the booklet that we use, feel free to contact me. Reading and reflecting on Scripture provides a wonderful way to get to know God and enter into deeper relationship with him. Join us as we grow in understanding God's word together!

On this Father's Day we honor God (as always) but we also acknowledge our fathers, grandfathers, uncles or any men who help guide our lives....including our priests. They all have huge responsibilities

toward their families and we pray that they find the patience and spiritual guidance they need to be the best they can be.

Today is also the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) and the Psalm reflects a priestly theme: "You are a priest forever, in the line of Melchizedek." The Lord said to my Lord, 'sit at my right hand until I make your enemies a footstool; the scepter of your power the Lord will stretch forth from Zion...Rule in the midst of your enemies. Yours is a princely power in the day of your birth in holy splendor; before the daystar, like the dew, I have begotten you. The Lord has sworn, and He will not repent: "You are a priest forever, in the line of Melchizedek."

Dads and other father figures are so vitally important in our lives. I remember my Dad, also known as The Buckaroo, with great fondness, respect, and love. It has been 13 years since his death on July 26, 2009, but he's always close in mind and heart.

Growing up in Detroit, I thought I was the luckiest kid in the world. Now, I know it. Dad was a Detroit firefighter who also worked odd jobs to bring in extra cash. We didn't have much money or all the things-n-stuff kids have today, but we never noticed it. I recall a conversation with Dad a few months before he died when he said, "I guess I could have saved more money and done more things, but you know, everything....every dollar I made went to you kids." When you think it's wonderful giving kids everything money can buy, then go into debt doing it, think again. It is not the money you spend on your kids.....it's the time you spend with them. And that, we had plenty of.

We never wanted for anything. We had plenty of good, nutritious food to eat. Mom cooked, gardened, and canned. Dad often cooked at the firehouse, Engine 6, by the Eastern Market. He had the gift of gab and knew all of the vendors and merchants, bragging about his four kids. The kindly vendors would send food and treats home with him. We always looked forward to Dad's arrival because we never knew what he'd have. That was over 50 years ago but those days are still very clear in my mind.

Just as God is there for us in everything we do, Dads, the best thing you can do for your kids is to be there. Long after the fancy toys and computer games are gone, they'll remember the time you spent – or didn't spend – with them. And Dads, please pay special attention to your daughters. The guidance and encouragement you give them will provide the self-esteem needed for the rest of their lives. Strong women who have had great relationships with their dads will not normally end upon a bad path.

Happy Father's Day to all the men. May you enjoy a relaxing day filled with family...and good food!

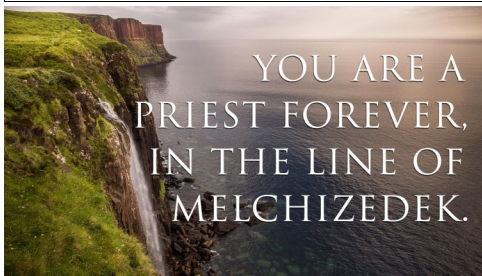

2022 Cruise-In Car Show

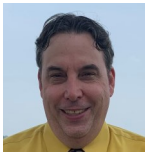

This past weekend I went up north to open up our cottage for the summer along with my wife, youngest son and a niece who loves spending time at the property in Alpena. When we purchased the place almost a decade ago, we knew it was perfect for us. My wife loves nature and the woods and I grew up going to a cottage on the shores of Lake Huron in Forest,

Ontario, Canada. Our place up north has an acre of woods behind it and out front, across a dirt road, is the sugar sand beach and waters of Lake Huron.

As we opened up the cottage, it needed a little work. Yeah, the usual cleaning, but also some minor repair. Nothing abnormal, just small projects that let you work together to come up with solutions and complete the tasks at hand. We carved out a path in the woods and cleared areas for the cabins. But the chapel was built first. I felt we owed homage to God for allowing us to have this beautiful slice of paradise and needed to build that first out of reverence to Him. The other structures followed. We have since added trestles, a lighthouse, a fowling course, two axe throwing official targets and more recently, a grotto for Mary, another for Joseph, and a sluice for kids to mine gemstones. This summer, we will probably be adding more attractions.

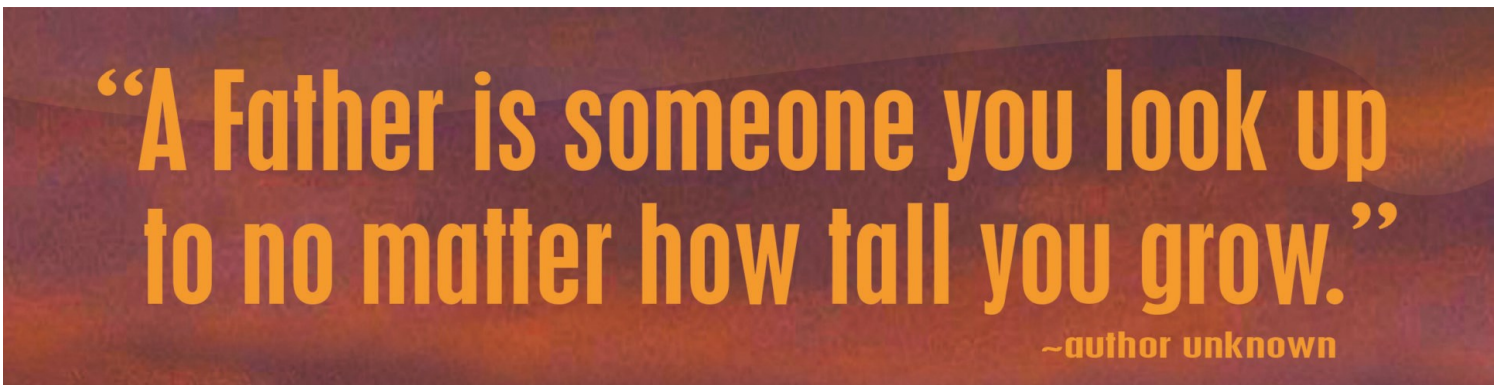
