A personal reflection

Pentecost has come and gone and we are in the midst of winding down to enjoy some summertime relaxation.

Pentecost weekend is also the time when the Archdiocese of Detroit ordains priests. Every year we have celebrated the ordination of the newly ordained. Sadly, this year no one was ordained for priestly ministry within the Archdiocese. What is even sadder is that no one seems to notice either way.

As I have said so often there is not a shortage of priests as so many like to think. If there were a shortage of priests, the spiritual needs of the people would not be met. However, the spiritual needs of the people are being met. For example, you have your choice of Mass time at any Church in the area. Yet, most priests say four Masses on any given weekend. I will agree there is a decline in the number of priests we have in comparison to thirty years ago.

Catholic families are smaller than they were years ago, yet one thing has not changed namely, that vocations to the priesthood and religious life start and arise from the family. As you encourage your children to pursue a vocation in the world, why not encourage them to look at a life of service in the Church as a priest or a religious vocation. It is a wonderful life and I have been blessed in so many ways throughout my priestly ministry.

I encourage and agree that it is important to pray for new vocations to the priesthood and religious life but it is also important to pray and support the priests that you already have. I've known many priests who have left the priesthood because the people of God were unsupportive and very demanding of their time and energy.

Recently Archbishop Allen Vigneron published a pastoral letter to the Faithful Year of Prayer for Priestly Vocations entitled **Forming Men of the Heart: A pastoral Note on a Year of Prayer for Priestly Vocations**. I would encourage you to read the Archbishop's letter. You can find it on the Vocation website: detroitpriestlyvocations.com.

St. Jane Frances de Chantal parish also published its own prayer card for the year of vocations. You can find them on the Welcome Desk in the gathering space. I would quote Pope Francis on the night of his election, as he addressed the people for the first time as Pope. He asked the crowd gathered in St. Peter's Square, **Pray for me**.

For the Feast of Corpus Christi last week, the choir sang a Prelude song, 'This is Jesus' prior to 9:00am Mass. Cantor Tom Harris and I also sang it for 11:30am Mass. There were a number of parishioners who came up afterwards asking about the song and where it came from. Here's the story: a few weeks ago I was asked to play and sing for a funeral at St. Joan of Arc for a former St. Basil choir member's mother. The St. Joan music director was very helpful and informed me that there were a couple of songs that they use at funerals. 'This is Jesus' was one of them and is used during the first part of Communion. Since the Body and Blood of Christ is so intrinsic to our faith at all times, I thought you might like to have the words to this song, perhaps adapting some of them to your daily prayers.

This is Jesus - (words and music by Jim Cowan)
Refrain: This is Jesus, Emmanuel, God is with us, in this sacrament....
 Come receive Him, adore Him, this is Jesus, our Lord.

Verses:
 Bright Star of David, radiance of God now become the Living Bread, the body of the Lord,
 Come in adoration, receive with trembling hands, the sacrament most holy, the banquet of the Lamb.

Drink of Living Waters, flowing from the Lord, take the cup of blessing, partake of precious blood,
 River of salvation, holy cleansing tide, fountain of redemption, flowing from the Savior's side.

Priest of highest honor, King and Sovereign Lord, unblemished Lamb of Sacrifice, Your very life outpoured; Royal Paschal Victim, true begotten Son, offered as our ransom, by the Holy one.

Also, this song was strongly recommended on the Detroit Catholic Musicians private Facebook (FB) page, so obviously it is being sung at many area churches. We use this page to communicate about what is going on in the diocese (music wise) and the page is often a great resource for information and support for each other or when special needs arise, such as finding elusive music, locating equipment and instruments, or when a substitute musician is required....and more. It is truly a great group and I'm proud to be a member.

Sometimes, the FB page solves a request or problem, so here's a 'Feel-Good' story for you. My long-time friend's 11-year-old granddaughter Isabella is a budding musician who loves to sing and she is quite good at it. To improve even more, her teacher suggested getting a keyboard so she can learn to play, which will help her to sing. The family is going through a very rough patch. Dad, age 44, has been diagnosed with a serious form of cancer, the treatments are quite expensive and the family has little money to spare. I was asked if I might be able to find an inexpensive keyboard for Isabella. I put out the request through a Detroit Musician's FB page and received a response from Music Director, Adam Morency, who subbed last year at St. Jane Frances. Apparently they were cleaning house, so last week, a (big and strong) friend and I drove out to Trenton and picked up a full-size digital piano. We took it to Isabella's house and set it up while she was at school. Later that day, her mom sent me the video of her daughter's first look at her 'new' piano.....and it was pure joy, with a lot of dancing and twirling involved!

With all of the bad news circulating everywhere in the world and in our own communities these days, it does wonders for the heart and soul when you can help someone. I highly recommend it!

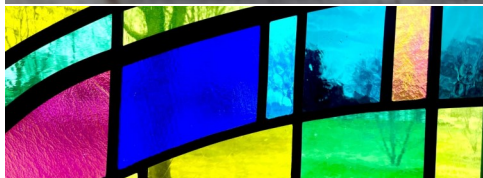
