Ambiguity and Change

During the early months of the pandemic I had the opportunity to do a great deal of reading. One of the books that I read was written by Fr. Jack Castlelot. Fr. Jack

Castlelot was a world renowned biblical scholar. His field of expertise was the New Testament. He wrote extensively about the books in the New Testament and was one of many biblical scholars whose examination of the Sacred Scriptures was compiled in the Jerome Biblical Commentary. A commentary used by those who are studying the Sacred Scriptures in depth.

As a young seminarian at St. John's Provincial Seminary in Plymouth, Michigan, I and those studying for the priesthood, had the honor of being taught by Fr. Jack Castlelot. He shared his knowledge of the Sacred Scriptures and "broke open the Word for us".

I recall the first day that our class arrived at St. John's Provincial Seminary. We had a rector's conference that evening and Fr. Jack went to the lectern and began to speak. He said, gentlemen when and if you are ordained priests there are two aspects as priests you will have to deal with namely, ambiguity and change.

As I reflect upon my thirty-five years of priesthood I can honestly say there has been a lot of ambiguity and change within the church as well as in society. There have also been some challenging and disappointing times as well. The Archdiocese of Detroit has begun a new chapter in its history of service to the people of God. The Family of Parishes will allow the sharing of resources in light of our present situation namely the decline in priests. It should not be something we fear but to see it as an opportunity for parishes to work together.

As I mentioned two weeks ago in my homily, **Enjoy being Catholic**. We are invited to share our stories and build up the Body of Christ. Our life experience gives us much to share with the people whom God places in our lives, and He does place them in our life for a reason.

We all experience the ambiguity and change that life presents to us, we can't avoid it, it is a part of our life's journey. The challenge that it places before us is, do we see ambiguity and change as an opportunity to grow in our faith and in our understanding of the present situation. Hopefully we do.

If there is one thing that this pandemic has taught us is the uncertainty of life and that we are a people of hope. The Scriptures give us that hope to see beyond our present situation. The quote from St. Pope John XXIII echoes that thought when he said: "It is not that the Gospel has changed, rather it is that we have begun to understand it better".

Bon mot: Sacred Scripture is set up as a kind of lantern for us in the night of life.

Today's Gospel reading is the familiar story of Jesus visiting Martha and Mary. The two women take on different roles, Martha "burdened with much serving" while Mary sits with Jesus and listens to him teach.

Martha seeks Jesus' intervention to get Mary to help her so that the activity of serving could be shared. She likely walked away disappointed in his response.

Both women show hospitality to Jesus in their own way and both forms of hospitality are important. We know when we invite guests to our home that we will often need to provide them with both refreshment and company. That is what is expected. Jesus was far more intent on sharing his mission than he was on refreshment and responded to Martha in that way. Jesus identifies the listening of Mary as "the better part" or the focus on his mission that will lead to greater faith and knowledge of the divine nature in order to better form her life to God. Many of us can relate to Martha's feelings. She articulated that she was frustrated that Mary was not helping. Maybe Martha was worried that Jesus would perceive her as unwelcoming or inhospitable if she didn't provide him nourishment. Maybe she wanted to hear what Jesus had to say and felt she was missing out on something. Maybe she was simply frustrated that she couldn't seem to stop herself from "doing" rather than "being." Of course, her intention was to show love through service, as she had been taught to do as a woman in that time and society.

Martha's request of Jesus seems reasonable based on her position in society and his as a teacher. As is usually the case, Jesus surprises Martha, rebuking her request and teaching her something at the same time. Hopefully Martha understands that Jesus is offering a different way to be, one where a focus on God is far greater than a focus on the simple things of this world.

I used to be very aligned to Martha in my life, always bustling about to get things done and done right. In the last few years, I have found that I am called more to learning and less to accomplishing tasks or in meeting artificial or imposed expectations of perfection. So much of our lives are spent, as Jesus points out to Martha, "anxious and worried about many things." There are many lessons from this Gospel selection, one of which could be a call to let go of the expectations of the world, the need for everything to get done or be done properly. We human persons, created in the image of God, are called to reflect God in our lives. Jesus taught us what that means and gave us, through the Holy Spirit and the sacraments of the Church, the tools needed to accomplish this.

This week as you reflect on the Scripture and allow it to impact your life, take some time away from the ordinary tasks of the day and evaluate how well you listen to Jesus. Try to take time to sit beside the Lord and listen to him speak!

We live in a world of uncertainty and never know what will happen from one day to the next. None of us can escape all the news being thrown at us non-stop, but what we can do is focus on the better portion God gives us to take our minds off of the 'now'.



Today's Gospel about sisters Martha and Mary is a favorite of mine. I see guite a bit of myself in Martha, the sister who does all the work, the cooking, the preparation, the serving, and worries about Jesus, her guest, being comfortable. Her sister Mary simply sits at the feet of the Master, listening to Him speak. When Martha complains, the Lord mildly admonishes her and says "...there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her." Last week, I was in charge of a huge charity golf outing to benefit the military and veterans Freedom Centers at the airport. If you have ever ran a golf event, you know how much work is involved......a lot. When it is held at a military base and you need to clear over 150 people through security, your workload just increased ten-fold. At Friday's event, so much went wrong from an organizational standpoint: Security said they were unaware of a golf event, they didn't have our list; volunteers arrived late, didn't read their instructions; two teams simply didn't show up; the tees weren't put in the proper places.....the list goes on. My 'Martha' was coming out. Solving one crisis after another, I never ate lunch or dinner, though I did play golf. Despite all that, everyone seemed to have a great time, with no knowledge about what was going on behind the scenes. Funds were raised, prizes won, camaraderie enjoyed, networking evolved and new friends were made......all in all, the event was a success.

And so, last Sunday, putting aside all the work on my plate for this past Navy Week and the Great Lakes Navy Band concert performances, writing deadlines, worrying about upcoming medical tests, returning phone calls and emails, I decided it was time to let my 'Mary' come out... time to let the Lord speak to me. He started talking at about 6am, with a glorious sunrise. Then, He got me to church on time, with little traffic. Then I saw the smiling faces of parishioners, my faithful choir, and fellow staff members, hearing all their hellos and warm greetings. He provided balmy temperatures, the bluest of skies all day, along with a faint breeze. It was perfect.

After church, I was invited to a friend's cottage on Russell Island, which is near Harsen's Island. In order to get across the channel, you take a private ferry and are at the mercy of the schedule. A visit last year proved there was no way to make the 1pm sailing. Instead, God spoke again, "Don't rush. Use this time to enjoy the day, the flowers, the river, the warmth, the wind.....the journey.....everything I've created for your benefit." I popped open my sunroof and let the light shine on down.

Arriving at the dock at about 1:15pm, God spoke again. "Look at the view and the waves as they crash into the shore, creating noises among the seawall; and look at that bird flying around with the most beautiful bright orange-hued feathers. I created all of this. For you....for all."

Now, I truly felt like Mary, sitting beside the Lord. I was at peace, a rare sensation these days. The Lord is there to provide for us....if we only stop for a moment, sit at His feet, and listen.
