Fratelli Tutti

This past October, on the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, Pope Francis signed and promulgated his latest encyclical *Fratelli tutti*, (Brothers and Sisters all). I recall with great fondness the last time I visited Assisi was in 2018 with a group from St. Jane Frances de Chantal. We celebrated Mass in the church that St. Francis of Assisi built and later toured the town of Assisi. It was a most memorable trip.

I had the opportunity to read Pope Francis's latest encyclical and would invite and encourage you to use it for your reflection and meditation. It is very user friendly and easy to read. In reading the encyclical, the following insights are pertinent to our society, our world, and our spiritual wellbeing.

That we share in a common membership in the human family and that we are created in the image and likeness of God who is our Creator. *Fratelli tutti* reminds us that as members of the human family, we are called to be mindful that we are in fraternity with every human person.

The parable of the Good Samaritan is a reminder to each of us, that we are to care for those who are less fortunate than ourselves and that we are to be neighbors to those who are frail, suffering, and cannot care for themselves. We are invited to put into practice, the spiritual and corporal works of mercy. Pope Francis uses the phrase, "the art of the encounter" to mean that God places people in our lives, and through that encounter with people, we can learn something from each other.

We are called to see our mission as not limited to our own surrounding, but rather to experience a wider vision of our world, a global vision. That what happens in other parts of the world, does indeed have an impact upon us, whether directly or indirectly.

The dignity of the human person has to be forefront in our mind and in our action. We can agree to disagree, yet respect each other for the person that we are and can become. I am reminded of the words of St. Francis of Assisi who said; "At all times preach the Gospel, sometimes use words." In other words, fraternity is to be encouraged not only in words, but in our actions towards each other.

You can Google *Fratelli tutti* to find the document. I hope you enjoy the read as much as I did.

It is that the Gospel has changed; it is that we have begun to understand it better.

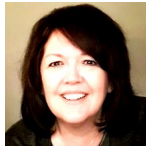

As we celebrate Independence Day this week, I wish you all a happy Fourth of July!

A team of people from the parish created a video in 2021 on freedom. You can view it on our website at sjfparish.org/thewayoffaith.

For those who are not internet users, here is the script of the video:

This year, Independence Day falls on a Sunday. As children of God, we see ourselves as both Christians and Americans. And we think of two different types of freedom: Catholic freedom and American freedom.

As children, we learned that Independence Day commemorates the signing of the Declaration of Independence. On July 4, 1776, we declared that the thirteen American colonies were a united, free, and independent union. We created national and state laws to provide the scaffolding to ensure that freedom.

A common perception of freedom is that it gives us the right to live however we want. But as creations of God, our freedom comes from Him, and not from any authority on earth.

As Catholic Christians, we were granted freedom when we were created by God in His image. He gave us dignity and free will, and Jesus taught us God's Great Commandment: to love God and neighbor. The freedom we experience as Christians is within the framework of the commandments—in embracing and living the virtues of faith, hope, and charity.

God's love for us is like a parent's love for a child. Children want the freedom to run around and explore their world. In love, a parent may provide that freedom by letting their child run around in a fenced-in yard. The child has boundaries but can still be free within them.

Children need freedom, but they also need guidance and protection to grow and mature. God gave us free will, but He also gave us intelligence and a conscience. He gave us the freedom to choose our own paths, but also the intelligence to choose to follow His guidance.

Our freedom as Americans was fought for and taken from the British monarchy. Our freedom as Catholics was given to us by God. Our freedom is a gift from God. How can we use that gift to build the Kingdom of God on earth?

In the words of Pope Francis, "There is no greater freedom than that of allowing oneself to be guided by the Holy Spirit, renouncing the attempt to plan and control everything to the last detail, and instead letting him enlighten, guide and direct us, leading us wherever he wills."

We find true freedom as children of God not in doing whatever we want, but in following the teachings of Jesus. We love God and neighbor and respect each person's human dignity. We understand that freedom cannot be freedom for one at the expense of freedom for all.

Are we Americans who were baptized Catholic, or are we Catholics who happen to live in America? And how does that change what freedom means to you?

OUR GROUP

Our group will be traveling as a combination of pilgrims from 3 parishes: St. Lawrence, St. Jane Frances de Chantal, and St. Rene Goupil. Mike Novak is the youth minister at St. Jane Frances and St. Rene Goupil, this is his 7th World Youth Day. His son, Jack Novak, is the youth minister at St. Lawrence, this is his 2nd World Youth Day. We are traveling under the group name of Macomb Unido. For most other participants, this will be their first World Youth Day. Our trip is 18 days. We will be leaving July 23, 2023 and returning August 9, 2023. We will be visiting 3 capital cities: London, Madrid, and Portugal. We will be arriving in Portugal early in order to visit Fatima before the huge crowds assemble. July 26-31 is Days in the Diocese. August 1-6 is World Youth Day. 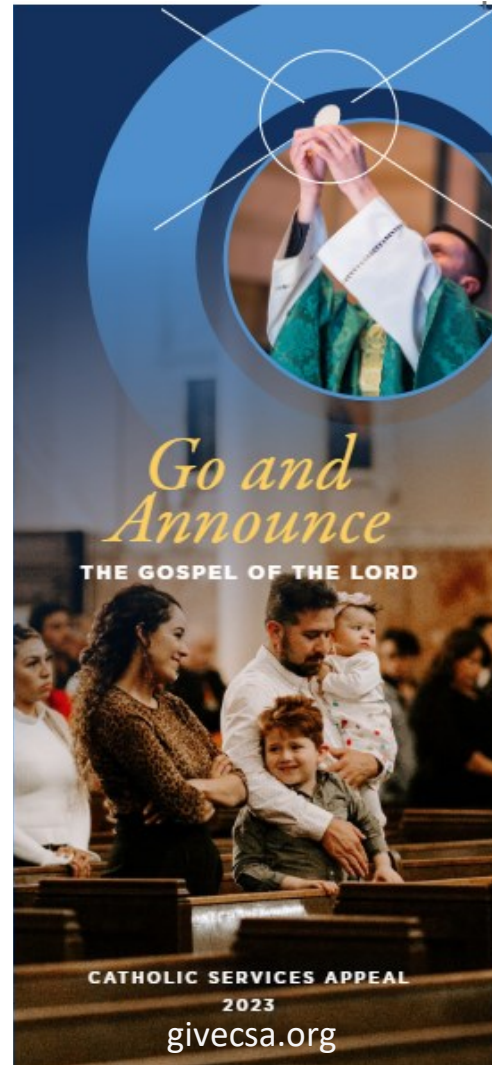
