Because of the pandemic we were unable to host the annual missionary cooperative that takes place in every parish throughout the Archdiocese of Detroit. I am happy to welcome Fr. Larry McCulloch to St. Jane Frances de Chantal.

Fr. Larry McCulloch, M.M. will be at the parish the weekend of August 6th-7th for the annual missionary cooperative appeal and collection for the Maryknoll Fathers and Brothers. Fr. Larry McCulloch will celebrate and speak at all the Masses. Fr. McCulloch served as a Maryknoll missioner in Central America and China and is now retired but helping in Mission Education and Promotion.

Fr. Larry is from Detroit, Michigan, and was ordained at Maryknoll, New York in 1970. He says he always wanted to be a missioner because he wanted to see the world, but do something for God at the same time. His missions took him to El Salvador, Nicaragua in Central America where he spent sixteen years. More recently he served in Taiwan and Mainland China where he worked as a University Chaplain and helped to found a series of schools for handicapped children. He will be speaking about how you, your family, and your parish can help spread the Gospel of love and life to the world.

May we keep in our prayers and thoughts all those men and women who serve the universal Church as missioners throughout the world. And in many parts of the world, missioners place their lives at risk to proclaim the message of the Gospel.

Today we celebrate the second World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly!

This is a Church-wide celebration that will be held each year on the fourth Sunday of July,

close to the feasts of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus. Pope Francis explained that he instituted the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly because "grandparents are often forgotten, and we forget this wealth of preserving roots and passing on" what the elderly have received. He emphasized the importance of grandparents and grandchildren getting to know one another, because "as the prophet Joel says, grandparents seeing their grandchildren dream," while "young people, drawing strength from their grandparents, will go forward and prophesy."

In a press release following the announcement in January of last year, Cardinal Kevin Farrell, Prefect of the Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life, wrote that "The pastoral care of the elderly is a priority that can no longer be postponed by any Christian community. In the encyclical Fratelli tutti, the Holy Father reminds us that no one is saved alone. With this in mind, we must treasure the spiritual and human wealth that has been handed down from generation to generation."

Below is a home prayer service, provided by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, that you can use to honor and bless the grandparents and elderly in your life.



This blessing may be used at special family visits (such as holidays), at the beginning or end of a visit, or at another appropriate time. If possible, the oldest grandchild might serve as the leader.

When the grandparents, parents, and children have gathered, all make the sign of

Leader: Blessed be God, who is faithful through all generations.
R/. Blessed be God forever.

The leader introduces the blessing in these or similar words:

Grandparents are cherished members of our family. They bring gifts of wisdom, experience, and love and share with us their life of faith. We thank God for their example and ask that he bless them with happiness and good health.

Then the Scripture is read:

Listen to the words of Psalm 128:
Happy are you who fear the Lord,
who walk in his ways!
For you shall eat the fruit of your handiwork;
happy shall you be, and favored.
Your wife shall be like a fruitful vine
in the recesses of your home;
Your children like olive plants

around your table.
Behold, thus is the man blessed
who fears the Lord.
The Lord bless you from Zion:
may you see the prosperity of Jerusalem
all the days of your life.
May you see your children's children.
Peace be upon Israel!

(The family Bible may be used for an alternate reading, such as Ezekiel 37:24b-27.)

Reader: The Word of the Lord. R/. Thanks be to God.

After a time of silence, all join in prayers of intercession and in the Lord's Prayer. Then the leader prays:

Lord God almighty, bless our grandparents with long life, happiness, and health.
May they remain constant in your love and be living signs of your presence to their children and grandchildren.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.
R/. Amen

All make the sign of the cross as the leader concludes:
May God bless us and keep us all the days of our lives.
R/. Amen

"Lord, teach us to pray....." How do you pray? People often think there is a right JJacobs@sjfparish.org way and I'm not so sure there's any unique or correct way, other than to quietly sit with the Lord, first, putting forth your

thanks, then offering your needs to Him and patiently waiting for an answer. Asking for money or favors or specific wants – as kids ask their parents for everything – is probably not what was going on in the minds of the inquisitive disciples from today's Gospel.

From that request came our beloved 'Lord's Prayer'. It's a very short but powerful prayer and every Christian knows it, and hopefully lives it. However, what the Lord says after that is a guideline as to how we should live in this world and treat other human beings.

One song that will be used this weekend is "Increase Our Faith', a very beautiful melody with a dramatically quiet refrain: "Lord, increase our faith. With all our heart, may we follow You. Teach us to pray, always, always." The verses also speak directly to today's Gospel: "So I say to you, ask, you will receive; seek and you shall find. Knock, it shall be opened to you". Whoever asks, they shall receive; whoever seeks shall find; whoever knocks, the door will be opened. If you, with all your sins, know how to give, how much more will God give to all those who cry from their hearts?

So how does this apply to daily life in our own times? We don't normally have strangers, or even friends, literally knocking on our doors at all hours of the night. Perhaps there might be emails, texts or phone calls at odd times when someone is in need. But sometimes a need is there and doesn't make itself readily known or obvious.....you have to find it and then figure out how to fill it.

Such a need manifested itself back in the fall of 2016, in mid-October, a couple weeks before the Navy ship USS Detroit (LCS-7) was commissioned. For four years our committee planned and prepared, according to the Navy's guidelines: setting up meetings, networking, dealing with the political, veteran and military groups, scheduling parties, dinners, tours and more. And then there was Commissioning Week itself. As Special Events Chair, most of that fell under my watch. I thought we'd covered everything, but then three weeks prior, one glaring error surfaced as we talked to more veterans. What special event was planned for those who had served?

The answer? Nothing. There was no mention of any celebratory veterans' event in the Navy playbook. That wasn't right and John, the Commissioning Committee Chair agreed, but there was nothing in the budget, so unless I could put something together quickly – with no money – it wouldn't happen.

But something did happen, something miraculous, especially at the scale this needed to be: "Ask.... and you shall receive", and wow, hat in hand, I got to work asking. Within a few days, a popular downtown brewery donated a large space, various food purveyors and restaurants donated all the food and most beverages (and the venue allowed it, no small feat in itself!), the Detroit Red Wings sent players, sound equipment and street hockey games, a bus company donated transportation services, including special vehicles for the disabled, to transport anyone to the ship for tours, photographers donated their services, museums sent military displays....and the list went on. We had over 350 veterans attend this event, along with some caretakers from assisted living facilities. All of this for zero dollars.

When the ask is right and the cause is just, sometimes you simply have to forge ahead, even if you don't know how you are going to accomplish your purpose. I can, however, guarantee that the first thing you do is to ask for God's blessing and He will always provide. That's what I did.








EUCHRE NIGHT WELCOME SUMMER!

TODAY'S GOSPEL FOR KIDS Sunday, July 24, 2022: 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 11:1-13: The Lord's Prayer

SIMPLE GOSPEL EXPLANATION FOR KIDS

Sometimes we have prayers that we like to use or say. But sometimes we have a hard time coming up with the right words to say when we pray. We might be uncertain or confused. The good news is that the Bible helps us! There are some great prayers we can find in the Bible. Jesus gave us a great blueprint for prayer. In the New Testament, some of His disciples were asking Him how to pray, and He gave them some words to try. We call this "The Lord's Prayer", and we can use it to help us pray.
