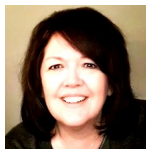

In today's Gospel we hear of the sending of the seventy-two disciples, tasked with traveling to all the towns Jesus intended to visit, serving as laborers for the harvest. This version of the "sending of the disciples"

story is only found in the Gospel of Luke. Jesus appoints these disciples and sends them out in pairs in a kind of "dress rehearsal" for the mission they will be sent on following his resurrection. They are to go without provision, in peace, to cure the sick and proclaim the kingdom of God. I imagine the disciples had a great deal of trust in Jesus and the impending coming of God's Kingdom to willingly leave home with nothing.

It could be that Jesus wanted his disciples to experience all that the call to mission entailed while he could provide support and encouragement in person. In this experience, they were prepared for the work of spreading the Good News to all the ends of the earth, making disciples of every nation. Like the disciples, we too are called to the mission, to the harvest, to bring peace, comfort, understanding, and forgiveness to people around the world. We are called to announce that the kingdom of God is at hand, a task that is not any easier now than it was for the first disciples. Endowed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit, we are able to labor fruitfully, witnessing to the power of God by living out Jesus' commandment to love God and neighbor. Created in the image of God, our very nature leads us to seek to be the hands and feet of Christ in the world today. We are the laborers Jesus speaks of; we are commissioned to witness to the kingdom of God on earth for the purposes of an abundant harvest in heaven.

Ask yourself this week: What will I do in order to labor for the harvest?

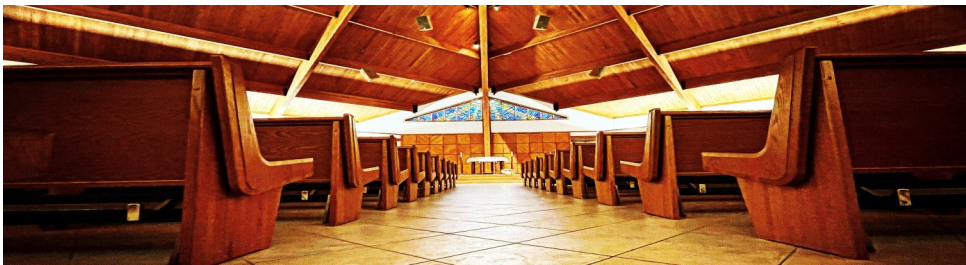

Did you ever wonder how the music is selected for each weekend? Just like anything else, it is a process. Musicians have liturgical resources we consult, like GIA Quarterly, which lists at least a couple dozen songs or more for each weekend. However, those songs come from all sorts of hymnals and I must limit the choices to what we have in our Gather 3 Hymnal. I also ponder all the readings, the Psalm and how they relate to each other on that particular Sunday.

Foremost, my goal is to encourage congregational singing. You all do a marvelous job! It is important that songs are somewhat familiar...but I also cannot select the same songs week in and week out. That's why sometimes you may hear an unfamiliar Prelude or second Communion song; this allows a little advance listen so you can sing it later. Certain songs lend themselves to special feast days or liturgical seasons, and that is why you will only hear 'Jesus Christ is Risen Today' during the Easter Season and Christmas songs at Christmas. May and October are traditional months for Mary, and an occasional Marian hymn may be used. Advent and Lent have their own selections as well.

We are now in Ordinary Time, which lends itself to a broader use of music. Our hymnal has hundreds of songs and at weekly choir rehearsals, the choir often learns many new ones so they can help lead you. And yes, sometimes the music changes on Sunday if Fr. Tony's homily touches on a nuance I didn't find. The point is, liturgical music is fluid and there are numerous rich and beautiful songs we can sing on any given Sunday. So, even if you don't know a particular song very well, sing out anyway....it is simply another way to praise God.



SEND IN THE SWIFFERS



Have you noticed how sparkling clean the church and gathering area are? This is all thanks to our wonderful teams of volunteers called the Swiffers. The Swiffers do light household duties to include: cleaning the altar area and pews, wiping the windows on the entrance doors and vacuuming the gathering space.

Teams clean once a month on Thursdays starting at 9:00am. All cleaning supplies are provided and it usually takes each team less than 2 hours to make our worship space look beautiful.

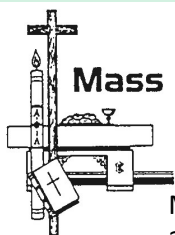

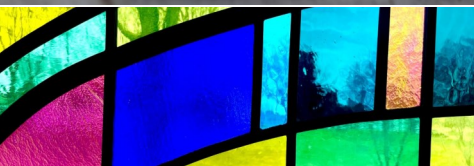
