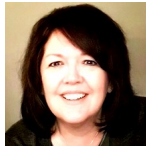

Are you Interested in learning more about the Bible in a casual, sharing atmosphere? Join our Bible Study group!

We are almost ready to return to Bible Study after the summer break. Each Bible Study session lasts six weeks, meeting each of those weeks on Tuesday morning from 10-11:30am. For our next session we will return to the Book of Genesis, verses 25-33, Jacob's Blessing. "Jacob's story shows us how God's love prevails through the conflicts and failures of a troubled family. In Genesis 25-33: Jacob's Blessing, authors Kevin and Louise Perrotta guide readers through Jacob's story, showing how this ancient biblical account still speaks volumes to us today."

The series we use is very understandable and organized to provide both fascinating insight to the Scriptures as well as a lot of opportunity to discuss and share. Our next session will begin September 19th and run through October 24th. If there is enough interest, we can also add an evening session, so please let me know if you would like to participate but are only available in the evenings.

The guide includes the Scripture passages, insights from Church fathers and saints, questions for discussion and reflection, and prayer suggestions. It doesn't matter if you have never studied the Bible before or if you are experienced with Bible study, all are welcome!

Reading and reflecting on Scripture provides a wonderful way to get to know God and enter into deeper relationship with him. I look forward to sharing Scripture with others, growing in understanding God's word while sharing our different viewpoints!

All are welcome...please RSVP by calling the office or sending me an email. Please also plan to bring a copy of the book which is available for \$7.95 on Amazon; simply search for the title: "Jacob's Blessing (Six Weeks with the Bible)".

August 15th is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses will be at 8am and 7pm.

Here is some information about this Solemnity, taken from CatholicCurrent.org, a resource from the United States Council of Catholic Bishops:

Mary was always a virgin, both in conceiving Jesus, giving birth to him, and remaining virgin ever after. God granted her this privilege to emphasize that this was a unique moment in history – the birth of Jesus who is the Son of God and the Son of Mary. The liturgy of the Church speaks of Mary as "ever virgin." In the early Church some denied this, arguing that the Gospels speak of the brothers and sisters of Jesus, and thus maintained that Mary did not remain a virgin after the birth of Jesus.

But already in the fourth century, theologians pointed out that the Greek word for brother used in the New Testament can refer also to cousin. A second explanation was that these brothers and sisters were children of Joseph by a previous marriage. However, it is the constant teaching of the Church that Mary remained a virgin even after the birth of Jesus. In her virginity, Mary lived a life dedicated exclusively to her Son and his mission. Her example has been followed by some of Christ's disciples who have lived lives of consecrated virginity and celibacy from apostolic times to the present.

In the mystery of her Assumption, Mary experiences immediately what we all will experience eventually, a bodily resurrection like Christ's own. "The Immaculate Virgin...when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of death" (CCC, no. 966, citing LG, no. 59).

Finally, in Mary we behold what the Church is already like during her pilgrimage of faith – and what the Church will become at the end of the journey. "Mary figured profoundly in the history of salvation and in a certain way united and mirrors within herself the central truths of the faith" (LG, no. 65).

Have you considered strengthening your prayer and contemplative life with a retreat? If you have not been before, I highly recommend it. There are many different types of retreats – one day or multiple days, silent or not, focused on a specific topic, or simply self-guided. There are three retreat centers in our area that provide a variety of retreat experiences: Manresa Jesuit Retreat House in Bloomfield Hills, St. Paul of the Cross in Detroit, and the Capuchin Retreat Center in Washington Township. Check their websites for schedules and locations.

While there are many retreat options, a short weekend retreat at the Capuchin Retreat Center that is for either women or men, or both, sounded like a great choice! Here is the information from their website (www.capretreat.org):

“Our theme for the 2023-24 season is: *‘In his footsteps – A weekend retreat with St. Francis of Assisi.’* By delving into our Franciscan tradition, we will unravel the life of St. Francis and explore key events in his conversion and ministry.
