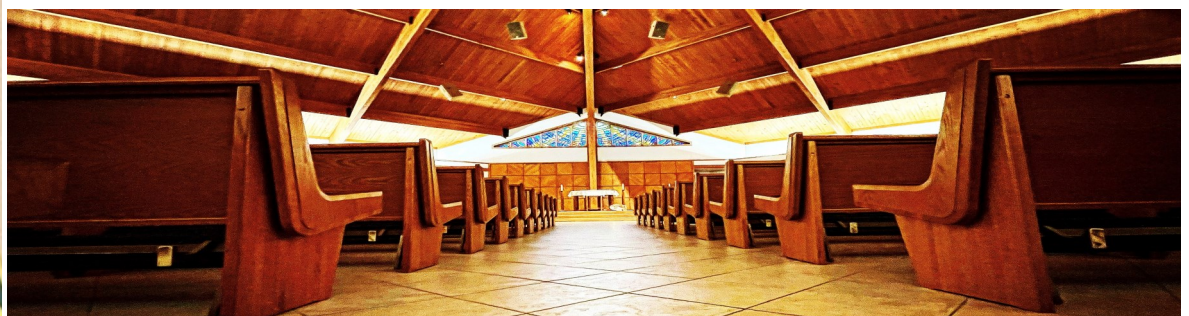

August 15th is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This year, because the Solemnity falls on a Monday, it is not a Holy Day of Obligation. As such, there will be no additional Masses. You may wish to spend some time in learning more about this

Solemnity. Last year we created an informative video about this beautiful feast. If you missed it last year or wish to review it again, please go to www.sjfparish.org. Another great resource for learning about our faith is found on the United States Council of Catholic Bishops website (USCCB.org). The following is taken from CatholicCurrent.org, a resource previously available from the United States Council of Catholic Bishops:

Mary was always a virgin, both in conceiving Jesus, giving birth to him, and remaining virgin ever after. God granted her this privilege to emphasize that this was a unique moment in history – the birth of Jesus who is the Son of God and the Son of Mary. The liturgy of the Church speaks of Mary as “ever virgin.” In the early Church some denied this, arguing that the Gospels speak of the brothers and sisters of Jesus, and thus maintained that Mary did not remain a virgin after the birth of Jesus.

But already in the fourth century, theologians pointed out that the Greek word for brother used in the New Testament can refer also to cousin. A second explanation was that these brothers and sisters were children of Joseph by a previous marriage. However, it is the constant teaching of the Church that Mary remained a virgin even after the birth of Jesus. In her virginity, Mary lived a life dedicated exclusively to her Son and his mission. Her example has been followed by some of Christ’s disciples who have lived lives of consecrated virginity and celibacy from apostolic times to the present.

In the mystery of her Assumption, Mary experiences immediately what we all will experience eventually, a bodily resurrection like Christ’s own. “The Immaculate Virgin...when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of death” (CCC, no. 966, citing LG, no. 59).

Finally, in Mary we behold what the Church is already like during her pilgrimage of faith – and what the Church will become at the end of the journey. “Mary figured profoundly in the history of salvation and in a certain way united and mirrors within herself the central truths of the faith” (LG, no. 65).

Today's Gospel has always been a confusing one for me, which is also true for many musicians on our AoD Detroit Musicians Facebook page. A couple of music directors posed the question "What

music do you choose to reflect 'mother against daughter and a son against his father'?" There were some interesting answers; numerous suggestions popped up, all having to do with unification, peace, or a change of heart.

We think of Jesus as a man of peace, yet today He says: "Do you think that I have come in to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, rather division. From now on, a household of five will be divided...."

Certainly perplexing...but after having pondered this, I believe the answer could be that there is a peace that settles in beyond the other side of division. Based on a first impression when we meet someone new, we either like them or we don't, or are non-committal. Sometimes, we can be very, very wrong about our first thoughts and go forward with that incorrect idea. When that happens, you can miss out on the true character of an individual because you didn't bother to look deeper.

From 1988-1990 I played a lot of golf in Bermuda after meeting a new-found friend, Madeline, who was a respected golfer and businesswoman on the island. We immediately clicked, then partnered up in many tournaments. I also got to know dozens of other women who journeyed there from the states. However, there was one woman, a constant participant, who seemed removed from everyone else...distant. Tall, blond, and elegant, she oozed wealth and some might think her 'stuck-up'. I asked Madeline about her, and she said, "Oh...her.....she never talks to anyone so we just leave her be...probably too good for us."

Not long after, circumstances led me to be seated next to her at the Champions Table when she, her partner, my partner (not Madeline, this time) and I had won our respective tournament divisions. What should I do? What can I say? Should I ignore her because of who or what I thought she was? Surprisingly, she quickly introduced herself to me and we had some great conversation throughout the evening. She was delightful. It turned out that she was an only child from an extremely wealthy background. She was detached from most people because some vastly wealthy families have fears of harm coming to their children. We became friends that night. She invited me to play in several events over the next few years near her home in Florida, also sharing her favorite adventures and introducing me to some wonderful and accomplished people.

Looking back, I consider how many life experiences would have been missed if I had believed the 'status quo' and not engaged in spirited conversation, given that golden opportunity. This applies to family members as well....sons and daughters who bring in friends, or a possible spouse, or parents who begin a new relationship after their spouse has passed away. Everyone deserves a chance to be revealed.

Perhaps the lesson here is that we need to communicate and get to know each other and this takes work. Surely division can come first, but we must search for friendship and peace as the end result.

A few things popped up that interested me but nothing was the right fit. Finally, a position was posted for Communications Facilitator here at St. Jane Frances. My first thoughts were, where is St. Jane Frances and I better stop what I am doing and apply for the job. I am blessed to say that I applied, I was contacted by Laurie Hall, I came in for an interview and I was offered the job all within the same week. I said YES!

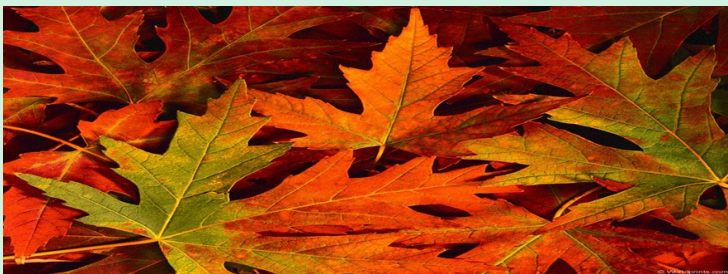
