St. Jane Frances de Chantal has some very special people who dedicate their time and JJacobs@sjfparish.org talent to make our worship services spiritually enriching, and I thank them all! My role in Music Ministry allows me to

work with these fine folks: the Choir, the Bell Choir, and Instruments of Praise (IIP). As with anything else during Covid, our music program took a hit but, through the grace of God, we are getting through it. Not only are my music ministry members hard working and loyal, but they are involved in many other areas at St. Jane Frances. All of them are very caring and compassionate and when one member suffers, we all do.

Last week I highlighted our Cantors, who are also part of our choir. They do a bit of extra work when we have Cantor rehearsal every 2nd Sunday of the month, practicing Psalms and responses. You may not realize that our Gather III hymnbook doesn't carry all of the Psalms, so other versions must be found for them to try. All of their voices are different and we work to fit their vocal range to the selected Psalm.

The choir works hard from September to June. Yes, they get the summer off from Wednesday rehearsals and Sunday morning warm-ups, but do wish to sing and praise God at Mass on Sundays, some members even singing at both masses. Currently, some are still not singing with us due to Covid concerns, but I know they are there, in heart and I wish them all well.

Joyce and Chris are the Choir librarians who keep our music filed away properly and then there's Bob, Joyce's husband who assists with that. Janet and Andrew are a husband-wife team who are also active in German cultural dance; Janet is a world class baker and Bell Choir member, and Andrew does marvelous work with wood and carpentry. Chris (Parish Nurse and Health Ministry member) and Bill 'Cos' are another husband-wife 'tenor' team, who went on the recent pilgrimage to Israel with Fr. Tony (yes I did excuse them from choir that weekend!) and you'll read about that experience soon. Jan and Bill are Cantors as well as lectors. Then there are sopranos: Mary E (Cantor and recent proud Grandma), Merisa, who is a new VP for the Michigan Council for the Blind and Visually Impaired, librarian Chris, and ultra high soprano/descant singer Marge, who also sings with the Motor City Chorale. Tom, choir comedian and long-time member who cantors at 11:30am masses, rounds out the Bass section. Communications Facilitator & Christian Service Coordinator James Torres now joins us on occasion, with his wonderful baritone voice. The altos are Mary H, just back from vacation, and Fawn, who heads up the Bell Choir and Youth Chimes Group; she is also our very creative lead percussionist. Jeanette and Leslie hopefully will be back soon. Leslie's gifts also include handmade crafts; she made the lovely bag in which I haul my music around. Alex heads up our IIP Group. He is a dedicated and fine musician (Viola) and researches the readings months in advance to help plan music for the first and

VOICE CARE: In the past, Dr. Adam D. Rubin has helped me with voice issues. He recently wrote a book, 'The Vocal Pitstop: Keeping Your Voice on Track'. In it, he shares some tips which I've used to try and keep my voice healthy. As mentioned last week, the voice is a very unique creation and a special gift from God. Without it, we can lose a lot and so, we must take care of our voices. Here you go:

- \*Avoid shouting, screaming, yelling, or talking in loud environments. Whispering is a no-no too.
- \*Drink plenty of water; it lubricates the throat and vocal apparatus.
- \*Don't smoke and do try to avoid second-hand smoke or other airborne pollutants or inhalants.
- \*Avoid alcohol, or other acidic drinks which dry out your throat.
- \*Take 'voice naps'. Don't talk when you can avoid it. Get regular sleep and res as well.
- \*If you notice vocal changes or acid-reflux symptoms, get thee to a doctor!


