Catechetical Sunday

With school well underway, we also begin Faith Formation at St. Jane Frances de Chantal. Mr. Michael Novak and the catechists are gearing up for an exciting year of Faith Formation. The Catholic Church will celebrate Catechetical Sunday on September 18th. Next Sunday we will bless the catechists and the students as they embark on a year of discovering new aspects of the Catholic faith and how to implement them into their daily lives.

The catechists are a great group of people who meet every month with the children and impart the faith of the Catholic Church and share their own stories and journey of faith. However the catechists rely on the parents of our children to share their faith and journey of faith with their children. The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that parents are the first teachers of the faith. Children learn by what their parent's model for them. As I mentioned in my homily two weeks ago, we learn by the examples people set for us. May we model our faith for our children and for all those we come in contact with. In his book titled *Spiritual Writings*, Leo Tolstoy said "a Christian knows the truth only in the sense that he or she shows it to others." As we begin the faith formation year let us share our stories of our own faith journey and in the process build up the Body of Christ.

The Catechism also reminds us that the faith community as a whole must also model and give good example by word and deed what it means to be a follower and disciple of the Lord.

The theme of this year's Catechetical Sunday is, This is my Body given for you, Luke 22:19. This theme reminds us that we are all called to give witness to our faith in Jesus Christ. We begin this Faith Formation year invoking God to bless the children and their families, our catechists and faith community with a spirit of wonderment and awe about their faith. May we be open to the prompting of the Holy Spirit in our lives and the lives of the community of St. Jane Frances de Chantal.

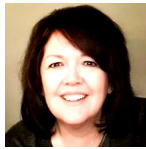

At the time of preparing this article, I was reflecting on a life of prayer with a friend who is going through some tough times. I know from my own experience that prayer is powerful and that we benefit from a con-

sistent and engaged prayer life. The Church encourages a life of prayer and we have several groups that meet for regular prayer at St. Jane Frances. All are welcome to join at any time. The following article is a repeat that still covers the basics.

Follow your own way of speaking to our Lord sincerely, lovingly, confidently, and simply, as your heart dictates. -St. Jane Frances de Chantal

I have often heard people say they struggle with prayer. We don't always know how to pray, what to pray, how to hear God's response. Our beloved St. Jane Frances, in the quote above, speaks to those issues. Find your own way to communicate with God. That is what prayer is, communication with God. There are as many ways to pray as there are ways to communicate, publicly, personally, spoken, silent, sung, or chanted. We know that God loves us and desires to be in relationship with us. Communication is key to a good relationship.

We can look to Jesus to teach us about prayer. The Gospels record many times that Jesus took time to pray: in the mornings and evenings, before ministering to the people, and before critical events in his life. We can pray the same way. If you don't now, try beginning or ending your day with a conversation with God. I'm sure we have all prayed at a critical moment in our lives; add prayers of thanksgiving for the graces and the challenges of our lives.

Whether you struggle with prayer or enjoy a full and active prayer life, take time today to reflect on this aspect of your faith. This might be a good time to try something new in your relationship with God. If you are interested in praying with others, we have four wonderful groups that pray together, the Rosary group, the Divine Mercy Chaplet group, the Intercessory Prayer Team and the Lectio Divina group. All welcome new members at any time and will gladly show you the ropes. For the Rosary and the Divine Mercy Chaplet, no registration is necessary, simply come to the parish and join the team in prayer. For the Intercessory Prayer team and Lectio Divina, these sessions are currently run via Zoom. If you are interested in joining, please email me and I will get you to the right person for access.

- The Rosary is prayed each Tuesday evening at 6:00pm in the Worship Space. Come for an hour of prayer time and stay for the 7:00pm Mass.
- The Divine Mercy Chaplet is prayed on the last Saturday of each month, following 4:00pm Mass, in the Chapel.
- The Intercessory Prayer team meets on the second and fourth Mondays of each month, from 1-2pm, via Zoom. This team prays for the needs of the parish as shared through our Intercessory Prayer box, as well as the needs of the world, the church, our parish, and other requests.
- The Lectio Divina group prays this ancient prayer form each Wednesday at 7:00pm via Zoom. Lectio Divina is a method of prayer in the monastic tradition of reflection on Scripture. The members read the readings from the upcoming Sunday, reflect on their meaning, then respond through prayer, action, and resting in God.

Additionally, we have Eucharistic Adoration with Recitation of the Divine Praises on the second Tuesday of each month from 1:00pm-6:30pm in the Chapel. Feel free to enter the Chapel at any point during that time. Please know that you can also come into the worship space any time the office is open to pray before the Blessed Sacrament in the Tabernacle or to light a candle.

A solid prayer life is a refuge in the storm that often swirls around us. May your communications with God be, as St. Jane Frances tells us, sincere, loving, confident reflections of what is in your heart.

It is impossible for this weekend to pass by without some reference to 9/11, the day that changed life forever in the United States. We all remember where we were and what we were doing on that gorgeous,

cloudless September day. I was at home with the TV on when I saw what was happening early on and thought of what might happen, since we had no clue about any of this kind of thing. I quickly drove to my restaurants to protect my staff and do what needed to be done whatever that might be and check on my dad, as well.

We watched the EMS teams, the police, firefighters, chaplains, and volunteers. In real-time, it was the true picture of hundreds of brave souls running toward danger, destruction, and possible death when everyone else was running away. No one knew what was forthcoming while the mayhem continued to escalate.

As this surreal situation unfolded and before the buildings collapsed, I realized those towering structures could not withstand such force and fires and that, my God, all of those people inside! There would be thousands of lives lost, and their families destroyed. I could only imagine the terror enveloping those on the upper floors of both towers when they finally realized there was no hope of rescue or escape. Did they feel abandoned by everyone, including God, or whomever they worshiped? I can only trust that they made peace with God and their loved ones during those final moments in this world.

It is fitting that today's Gospel is the parable of the prodigal son. When a loved one leaves your home, do you ever truly know if he or she is coming back? If you're lucky, they do. If the circumstances in which they depart are not optimal or are downright ugly, with fights, disagreements, or words spoken which you don't really mean, at that moment you probably don't want to see them any time soon. However, after you've had a few moments to rationalize or think about it, you want them back, no matter what. They are your flesh and blood. You need to make things right.

The prodigal son demanded everything from his father, even though he did not yet deserve anything, received it and then squandered it all. Yet, the father still welcomed his son back with open arms after all the years he was 'lost'. Well, the other son wasn't so thrilled!

Can we do the same? Can you think of someone who has hurt you and get past all of it to welcome them back into your good graces? As God's children, we must do it and we must forgive. Because, sooner or later, we'll hurt someone in the same manner and will want their forgiveness as well.

Of the almost 3,000 killed in the World Trade Center towers on 9/11, with over 400 being emergency workers, there's no doubt some of them left for work that morning leaving unresolved arguments and problems involving spouses, children, friends, or co-workers as they walked out the door. I cannot imagine that the ones left behind haven't wished, hundreds of times, for those encounters to have been different or pleasant; that the last words spoken or heard by their departing loved ones might simply have been: "Have a great day and I'll see you later.....Love you.....God bless you.....Bye!!"

Consider those words, or something like them, to be your send-off phrases as your loved ones go out into this ever-uncertain world of ours.

Time
Luke 15:1-32

SIMPLE GOSPEL EXPLANATION FOR KIDS

This gospel shows us how much God loves each and every one of his children. He will leave all the rest to find us if we are lost. The story of the prodigal son reminds us of the beautiful truth that we ALL sin and need forgiveness. The wasteful son and his self-righteous brother both made mistakes, and the father loved them both. In the same way, God loves us no matter what, and promises to forgive us when we are sorry. Jesus has made the way for our wrongdoing to be erased and replaced with grace!

ACTIVITY

HIDE AND SEEK VARIATIONS: If you have the space for it, play a game of hide and seek or sardines. To play sardines, one kid hides, and everyone else counts. When a searcher finds the hiding kid, they hide with them until there is only one child left looking for the hiding place. They get to hide next. If you don't have the space to play hide and seek or sardines, play hot and cold. Have a child close their eyes. Meanwhile, the other kids will work together to decide on a hiding place for a stuffed animal or small toy. When the child comes in, they have to find the hidden toy. The other kids call out "hotter" if the searching child is getting closer to the toy and "colder" if the searching child is moving in the wrong direction.

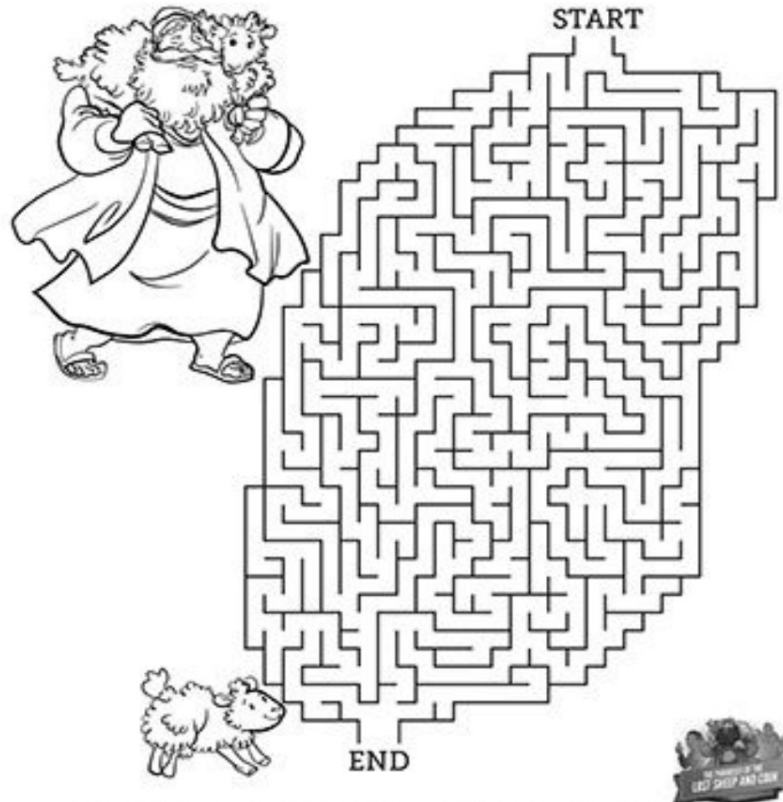
