How are you doing with your prayers for seekers? If you need a little inspiration, here are some thoughts:

Pray that God will send his Holy Spirit to those who recognize they are missing something, but don't recognize yet what it is they are missing. "I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. I will put my spirit within you so that you walk in my statutes, observe my ordinances, and keep them. You will live in the land I gave to your ancestors; you will be my people, and I will be your God." (Ezekiel 36:26 - 28).

Pray for more people to come to Christ. There is only one way to salvation, through Christ and Christ alone. "Jesus said to him, 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me'" (John 14:6). Remember, too, that Christ is the one who calls us. (see Matthew 11:28-30).

Pray that God would open people's hearts to believe the gospel. God is always calling us, always seeking to bring us to Himself. We must respond. So pray that God would open the hearts of these unbelievers so they can in turn believe, just as Lydia did. "The Lord opened her heart to pay attention to what Paul was saying" (Acts 16:14).

Pray to the Saints. Here is a prayer from the Catholic Household Blessings and Prayers:

O God, you made your name known to us through the Apostles.

By the intercession of St. Jude,

Let your Church continue to grow

With an increased number of believers.

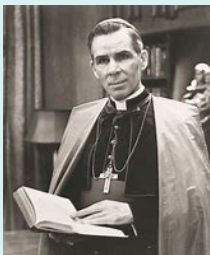
Grant this through Christ our Lord. AMEN

According to the General Directory for Catechesis:

The maturation of the Christian life requires that it be cultivated in all its dimensions: knowledge of the faith, liturgical life, moral formation, prayer, belonging to community, missionary spirit. When catechesis omits one of these elements, the Christian faith does not attain full development”(no. 87, cf. nos. 84-86)

Knowledge of Faith

(See the Catechism, nos. 26-1065; General Directory for Catechesis. Nos. 84-85, 87)

- ◆ Recognize that the goal of all catechesis is to have a communion with Jesus Christ, to draw us near to him
- ◆ Explore the Scriptures, the teachings of Christianity, the creeds and doctrines, the current teachings as presented by the pope, bishops...

So how do we do this here? This fall we will have opportunities through:

- ◆ Bishop Baron Series on the Mass (Monday evenings)
- ◆ Coffee and Catholicism (Twice monthly on Tuesdays)
- ◆ Lectio Divina (Wednesday evenings)
- ◆ Women’s Morning of Reflection (November 16th)

Are there other ideas or ways you would like to increase your knowledge of Faith?

Liturgical Life

(See the Catechism, nos. 1066-1690; General Directory for Catechesis, nos. 84-85, 87)

- ◆ Understand, live and bear witness to the *paschal mystery*
- ◆ Acquire the spirituality, skills, and habits of *full, conscious, and active participation in the liturgy*

How can you do this?:

- ◆ Attend Mass, attend Adoration
- ◆ Become involved in the Mass—become a Eucharistic Minister, Lector, Choir member, Minister of Hospitality...
- ◆ Become involved in the sacramental life of the church by joining the Baptismal team, RCIA, taking Eucharist to the Homebound...

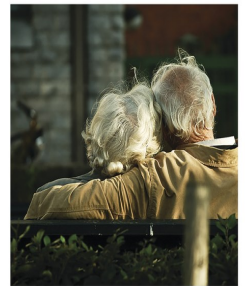
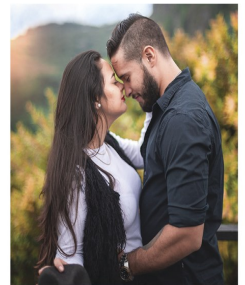

COLOR ME!



Sodom and Gomorrah, Paul speaking to the Colossians about our relationship to God (the Father) through, and because of, Jesus (the Christ) and Jesus teaching the disciple's how to pray as John (the Baptist) taught his disciples; these are the general descriptions of this weekend's readings. We see God's mercies offered throughout an entire community because of (at least) ten righteous souls (Gn 18:32), but we know only one family was saved because there were no more righteous souls in the community. We hear about our sins and how through Jesus' blood and subsequent death, we are reborn to the Father through Baptism and "obliterating the bond against us, with its legal claims, which was opposed to us, he (Jesus) also removed it from our midst, nailing it to the cross;"

(Col 2:14)

Jesus' sacrifice for us was whole. Our sins died with Him, and we were/are raised again to eternal life because of Him, how often I forget, because our belief is based in Faith but my experience is in the world.

In the Gospel we hear how Jesus began teaching His disciples "how" to pray, with the pray that we now know as The Lord's Prayer or as the Our Father; however, Jesus continues with a lesson that teaches us that the words are not *all* that there is to prayer (or life). Each of us messes up daily (if your like me, it's more like hourly and sometimes more frequently than that), but because we know of God's mercy, we strive to be better, to take "the road less travelled" (the "high road") - often time the more difficult path, fraught with distraction, danger (of death—physically and death to our spiritual journey), not because it looks fun, or because it's a good challenge, but because Jesus shows us that God is the God of Mercy, of Forgiveness, of Love, and we are to strive towards Him.

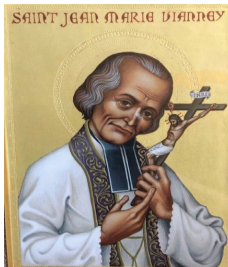
Because God loves us, even when we do not express our love for Him or each other properly, we are shown that sterling example, and are called to work our way towards that perfect example. Paul reminded us, that laws "bind us" and because of these bindings, we owe for our transgressions. God forgives, therefore we are called to forgive (but teach as well) about the transgressions that are perpetrated against us. There is the balancing act for us, as human beings, who tend to see through our eyes, and experience through our flesh, if we "get away" with something because we were not punished for our wrongs, will we continue in our wrongdoing, or will we realize that we did wrong and correct our path? Will we seek the "good and righteous" path, or stagnate in our erroneous footsteps?

Come, join us as we journey that path. Walk with us and support us through our errors, as we will continue to support each other. I look forward to continuously seeing "old" friends, and to meeting new friends on this trek towards our God. Pray for each other, help each other up when we stumble, and encourage one another to grow in Love.

Learn about saint relics!

The Church recognizes relics as being one of three different classes; First Class, Second Class, and Third Class. First class relics are the earthly mortal remains of saints, and are classified as being sacred relics. These remains could be any part of the body, be it bone, flesh (either skin or organs), and even hair. A second class relic differs from the first class, in that they are the possessions or tools that were owned or used by a saint during their lifetime. Items such as articles of clothing, vestments, jewelry, scepters, bibles, and hand tools, could all be considered to be second class relics, so long as they were used by a saint. Third class relics are the only form of relic that the Church permits for sale. A third class relic is any item, new or old, that has made contact with the remains of a saint, or pressed against their tomb or reliquary; in other words a first class relic. This could include burial cloths that were used during their funeral process, the soil from which they were buried in, the remains of their casket, or newer items such as cloths, pendants, that have been blessed by God when placed against the first class relic. Third class relics are worn, carried, or kept in the home, for protection, divine guidance, and assistance from their patron saint. Do you have a favorite saint you have a relic of?



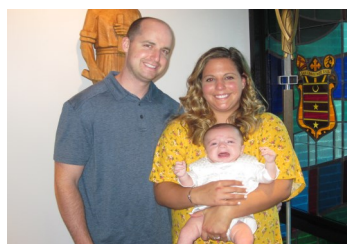
