For many Christmas visitors, a barrier for coming to church is not knowing anyone or not knowing what to do. When we exercise unusually gracious hospitality, we are communicating to them that they are welcomed. Even with a great message, it would take an extraordinary amount of courage and perseverance to become part of a community if one doesn't feel welcomed. If we all commit to hospitality to our Christmas visitors, we will be preparing the soil so that the message of the Gospel can more easily be received by everyone!

Christmas is a time to "show-off" our parish and to see ourselves as parish ambassadors at the Christmas liturgies. What can you do? Here are some examples:

- Be ready to greet others at Christmas Mass.
- Invite people (your friends, family) to Christmas Mass.
- Leave closer parking spaces for guests.
- Sit in the middle of the pew, leaving the coveted end seats for late-comers and guests.
- Smile at guests when their phone rings or when their baby cries. DON'T EMBARRASS GUESTS!
- Greet visitors with "I'm so glad you are joining us!" "Thanks for coming!"
- Ask them "Do you have any intentions for which I can pray?"
- ♦ Welcome people around you to your parish.
- Invite people to explore the Welcome Center for ways to connect with the parish.
- Guide non-Catholics (or visitors) to where the Order of Mass can be found in the hymnal.
- ♦ Sing loud!
- ♦ SMILE!!



HEALTH MINISTRY STRESS AND BLOOD PRESSURE

In addition to the emotional discomfort we feel when faced with a stressful situation, our bodies react by releasing stress hormones (adrenaline and cortisol) into the blood. These hormones prepare the body for the "fight or flight response" by making the heart beat faster and constricting blood vessels to get more blood to the core of the body instead of the extremities. Constriction of blood vessels and an increase in heart rate does raise the blood pressure, but only temporarily; when the stress reaction goes away, blood pressure returns to its pre-stress level. This is called situational stress, and its effects are generally short-lived and disappear when the stressful event is over.

- Give yourself enough time to get things done.
- Learn to say "no." Don't promise too much.
- Know your stress triggers
- Practice gratitude.
- . Know what brings you pleasure and find ways to enjoy the experience
- Spend time developing supportive and nurturing relationships.
- Give yourself the gift of good self maintenance.
- Don't overeat, don't consume alcohol or smoke.

We have prepared, we have waited, we have gone shopping and taken advantage of many deals, all in preparation for a holiday called Christmas. We show our love to one another by giving and receiving gifts, by spending time with one another in close quarters, gathering around together and kibitzing. But is this what we are gathered for? This can only be part of it. There HAS to be more, or else the real *meaning* of our gathering turns into a birthday party for someone who isn't even present.

We do the above to express our love for one another. Family, friends, community, we gather and celebrate. As Catholic Christians, we gather in unison, with other Catholic Christians around the world, for a Eucharistic Celebration between the evening of the 24th through the afternoon of the 25th of December, but what is it that we are really celebrating in thanksgiving (*eucharistia*) for?

We are thankful for love. Love of one another, given and received, yes. Love of previous generations who gave (many times their very lives), that we may live to celebrate in a country that allows us to publicly celebrate, yes. But most importantly we *need* to remember that we celebrate God.

God needs no celebration, His very existence IS celebration. God doesn't need us, yet He Loved us so much that He took on our imperfection, our human form, just so that He could be judged, suffer and die; for us, collectively, for you and I individually, for each and every human being. But that wasn't even it! He ROSE FROM THE DEAD, and shepherded His Church—our Church—in it's infancy so that we could know and remember these things!

For years and years (on both sides of my family), each of my Grandfathers or the eldest members of the family would share the scriptural story of the birth of Jesus either from Matthew (1:18-2:12) or from Luke (2:1-20). These memories, stories and examples of faith are what help me through my (many) times of doubt in the past, and continue to guide me as I witness and see God's Love in the world more and more.

This season, let us BE God's Love to each other, and spread His Hope, Peace, Joy and Love IN and TO a world that is searching for something that is just outside of it's understanding. Let me know how I can help, on our journey, as we explore this crazy path of life!

In the spirit of Christmas I thought you might enjoy some history about holiday traditions. Did you know......

- F.W. Woolworth, founder of his namesake stores, began selling glass Christmas tree ornaments in the 1890s. Obviously sales went well!
- Christmas trees date back to the 1780s when German Hessians brought the tradition back from Germany. In the U.S., 25-30 million real trees are sold annually at an average cost of \$73.24. O Tannenbaum indeed!
- In 1890, James Edgar, of Massachusetts, tailored a Santa costume for himself. He entertained children to drive business and thus, a tradition was born.
- In 1917 stationery store owners Joyce and Rowley Hall, of Hallmark fame, ran out of tissue paper. They found a stack of 'fancy French paper', and at 10 cents a sheet, it sold out immediately..... the birth of wrapping paper.
- Black Friday? In 1950, Philadelphia police used the term to describe the chaos on the day after Thanksgiving as shoppers flooded the city in advance of the annual Army-Navy football game to buy their holiday treasures.
