Fr. T's Tidbits: Remembering those who have gone before us

As we see the close of October we begin the month of November a month in which the Universal Church remembers those who have died. At St. Jane Frances de Chantal as well as in every parish those who were buried from the parish this past year will be remembered. We will recall the many ways in which those who have died have influenced and touched our lives.

On one of my trips to Argentina we arrived to celebrate the Day of the Dead, commonly known to us as All Souls day. The Day of the Dead is a holiday in South America as in most of Europe. It is a day to celebrate the lives of those who have gone before us. The celebration takes place at the graves of the loved one. There is usually a picnic lunch with music and dancing and food for all to enjoy. It is a joyful celebration of life and of memories. It is a celebration of faith.

It is important to remember and to pray for those who have died. An older priest once told me years ago that it is important to pray for those who have been called home by the Lord because someday others will be praying for you. Death is indeed a part of life and I believe what surprises us about death is that it we don't know when it will come.

As we celebrate the Feast of All Souls let us reflect upon the many people in our lives that have walked this journey with us, those who have left their imprint on our life and on our vocation in life. We are where we are at and are doing what we are doing because of someone's influence in our life. We do not journey through life alone many people join us in our joys and challenges. Some are with us for a lifetime, others may be with us for a short part of the journey, yet everyone we come in contact with leaves their mark with us.

The Church reminds us of the importance of prayer. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that we are encouraged to pray, "As in the prayer of petition, every event and need can become an offering of thanksgiving. The letter of St. Paul often begins and ends with thanksgiving, and the Lord Jesus is always present in it: Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Jesus Christ"; Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving."

Oh Lord, Eternal rest grant unto our brothers and sisters. May the Light of your face be upon them!

For me, this weeks readings are all about equality. From many, many sources, equality is defined as: *“the state of being equal, especially in status, rights and opportunities.”* Equal is defined as, *“alike in quantity, degree, value, etc.”* There is a difference between equal-ness and same-ness. I won’t bore you further with more definitions, I trust we all have the capacity to look up a word, or to ask the “right” people, how the word is properly defined.

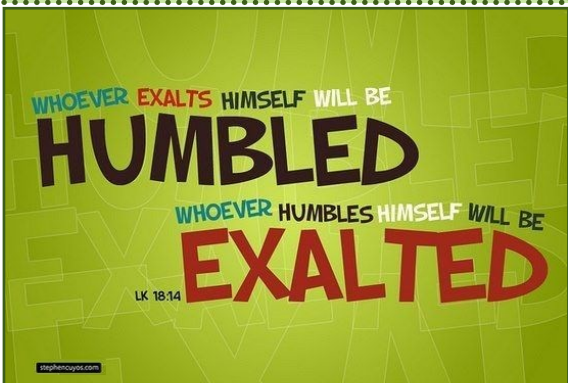
Equality speaks of similarities—alike-nesses, while same-ness evokes identity (at least in appearance and physicality) according to the definitions that I was reading (from the reputable sources). I like to use real dictionary definitions, because “Ben” definitions often tend to deviate from the real meaning of words. Equality does not mean likeness in ability, function, and level of personal responsibility, rather, it seems to me (oh boy, here comes the Ben-ism) it speaks about our very humanness, and our relationship with God and each other.

In Paul’s 2nd Letter to Timothy, he writes from imprisonment, realizing that to really get to the crux of Christ’s message, we need to humble ourselves to be able to understand one another, some more than others. Then we, who are strong enough and able, must climb that mountain of truth with others that struggle to do so. Paul said, in 2 Tim 4:17 *“But the Lord stood by me and gave me strength,”* and so we must do as well. If the Almighty stands next to us, are we greater? Do we get to remain in the safer position and ask everyone else to labor for us?

Jesus’ parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector (Lk 18:9-14) is a teaching of how we should behave. Not looking at ourselves and our accomplishments, comparing how “good” we are/have been with others. This is difficult in the world that we live in today! We get slammed from every angle with images, opinions and statements that are NOT fact but are posed as if they are factual. We need to start within ourselves, see our failures alongside of those of others that we tend to see much easier. In our weakness we see equality.

It is at this point that we may begin using our strength, of character, of knowledge, in humility to advance not just “me”, but us. We share the load, we work with and off of each other, we ask for help and we give help. God is about unity not divisiveness, so when we do our part and confess, as the Tax Collector did, to our weaknesses, help will rise to help pull each of us from our lows. If we do not share our weaknesses, people will not know how to help.

Let us know how we can help, what we can do. If you have a question, I can guarantee that at least 5 more people have a very similar question out of our 1400 families! I look forward to the journey with you!
