Fr. T's Tidbits: The Lost Sheep (Lk.15:1-32)

In the Gospel from St. Luke we recall that familiar story of the lost sheep, the one who leaves the flock of ninety-nine and wanders off and the shepherd who leaves the ninety-nine and goes in search of the one who has wandered. He searches until he finds it and when he does find the one who was lost, he rejoices.

This is a familiar story to all of us. The "pearl" of most homilies is that God went in search of the sheep that had wandered from the fold. And we would be correct in preaching on God's love for those who are lost.

However, the question that is often raised is; what about the ninety-nine sheep who did not wander off. That is the focal point of this reflection or meditation. Let us center our attention on the ninety-nine who did not wander off. If the Shepherd is God and the sheep are seen as the people of God. Does not God love the ninety-nine as much as He loves the one that is lost or wanders off? Of course He does, however the one that was lost was in need of God's attention more at that particular moment than were the ninety-nine who did not stray.

There are times when parents need to give more attention to one child than to their other children. Does that mean that they love their other children less? Of course not. What it does mean is that someone in the family needed more attention at that precise moment than the others.

We can look through the daily newspapers to see there are people who are more in need of God's attention today than I am.

I think of the men and women in the military protecting our country. They are more in need of God's attention today than I am.

I think of people undergoing chemo treatments. They are more in need of God's attention today than I am.

I think of people who will die alone today. They are more in need of God's attention today than I am.

I think of those who were affected by the hurricane. They are more in need of God's attention today than I am.

I think of parents who lost a child. They are more in need of God's attention today than I am.

I think of those people who will go without food. They are more in need of God's attention today than I am.

As we reflect further other people will come to mind that need God's attention today. There are days that I do not really need God's attention. It does not mean that He does not love me, I know He does. However, there are days that I really need His attention and I know He is present to and for me and together we will get through the turbulent moments of life.

May we lift up in prayer those people who are most in need of God's attention today, knowing that God loves us and will never abandon us.

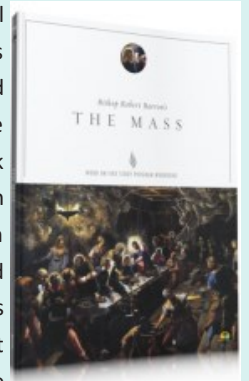

I really like finding out how things work. I'll take things apart and put them back together (Okay—reality check—I work at putting them together and finish the job 60% of the time). Regardless of the completion of the task, I learn valuable information. Sometimes it is how something works, how it is assembled, a lot of the time it is how not to do something. What I feel that I learn most of all, is how, as humans, we tend towards the habitual motions and tendencies out of comfort, efficiency and let's face it a touch of laziness.

With most things, a lot of effort goes into the original planning of almost everything, and as we progress on through repetition and through time. We can dig a groove that is difficult to get out of, or we can change up small things to widen our mindset and the approach to our daily lives, to be sure that can be flexible and ready to act in the moment without too much of a disruption along our journey.

This week's readings (as well as last week's Gospel) speaks heavily to the human condition of doing what "I" want and what will be best for "me". When we focus on the "me" and "I" we lose sight on "we", "us" and the larger picture of the society and the world around us. It is very easy to dig a hole around "me", which can very soon become walls that require more effort to scale, than the effort we would have needed to just focus outside of ourselves from the beginning.

Jesus teaches his followers (which include us, here) a little bit about habit and the virtuous life.

*The person who is trustworthy in very small matters
is also trustworthy in great ones;
and the person who is dishonest in very small matters
is also dishonest in great ones.
Luke 16:10*

When we strive for the Good, others see this in us. It emanates from us and is almost like an ethos around us that is attractive to others of like minds. Then as we all look out for one another, when one might falter, there are many around to help support the one who faltered, and they can get back on the straight path much easier.

The opposite is almost that mirror image. When we focus on "me" other like minded individuals come around, not in support, but in knowledge that if one of this group falters, it is much easier to swoop in and take from the one who has misstepped to bolster their own "me" centric life. Now, the one who was simply tripped up, now finds themselves almost crushed by the weight of others rushing in to take care of, not the one that has fallen, but themselves.

Most of the things that I will take apart, are already broken, on their way to the trash can, or have not worked in a while. If I am able to fix them, great! If I am unable to repair them, I can salvage useable things from them. Now my task is to stop collecting the usable "things" and pass them on to others that can (and will) utilize them better than I will be able to. Take the things that you learn, pass them on to someone else, and go about learning new things. Keep the Ultimate Good in focus and as the goal for life, and God will place things in your path to support and help you on the way. See Jesus in one another and help others Encounter His good in the world!

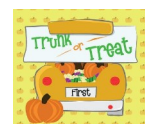
