FR. T'S TIDBITS: BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Today, the Church celebrates the Baptism of the Lord. For some it is the conclusion of the Christmas season depending on what part of the world you are in. For Poles and many European countries the end of the Christmas season is the Feast of Candlemas (or as many of us know it, the Presentation of the Lord).

The Church in her wisdom gives us this octave after Christmas to reflect upon all that has happened, namely, that Christ is born into the world. For some it may be easier to believe than for others. This octave of Christmas allows us to process and to meditate upon the fact the God sent his Son into the world to redeem us and that God loves us unconditionally and is very merciful.

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is a time for us to recall and renew our baptismal call—to serve the church and each other through the proclamation of the Word of God, and more importantly, living out our faith in our home, our family, our workplace, and community. Living out the Gospel calls us to internalize the Word of God we hear proclaimed to make it our own and share the Word with others. The Worship Commission will be making plans to begin using the bells as soon as they are repaired.

This Christmas season ends with a beginning — we celebrate Jesus' baptism and initiation into his ministry.

Today's celebration of the Baptism of the Lord gives us much to contemplate. My first thought is that we can celebrate the reality that our baptism links us to Jesus and to all who have gone before us in faith. Jesus was baptized just like we were – we have a shared experience and, indeed, a shared identity. Our baptismal certificate is a bit like an identification card - it tells us to whom we belong and to what we are called. Have you looked at your baptismal certificate? Do you know the date of your baptism? Have you celebrated that date?

We can also contemplate Jesus's response to his baptism. Saint Luke's account of Jesus' baptism reminds us that the ceremony is just a short moment in time, the meaning of which is determined by how we live it out. Baptism was the beginning of Jesus' mission, just as our baptism is the beginning of our mission. If we were baptized as an infant, it takes some time to grow into and discern our mission as members of God's community. For most of us, that mission continues to unfold throughout our lives, and we, like Jesus, must pray and listen to the Scriptures. How does baptism affect the way I live my life? Do I recognize that I am empowered to be an instrument of peace and justice to all I meet and to invite others to join me?

Which brings me to my last point – after he was baptized, Jesus was praying. There is a subtle difference between Saint Luke's account of Jesus' baptism and the accounts of the other three evangelists. Luke says that after Jesus was baptized by John and before the Holy Spirit descended upon him like a dove, Jesus took the time to pray. From the beginning of his ministry to his death on the cross, Jesus communicated to his Father through prayer. Jesus taught his disciples to address his Father through prayer. Prayer is an essential part of Christian life, even for Jesus himself. Do I pray regularly? Does prayer help guide me?

There is a lot to think and pray about this week. Here is a short prayer you can use to get started:

Gracious God, at his baptism, you called Jesus to be a new, living sign of your justice and peace. Give us the courage to live our own baptismal call and to evangelize others to join us. We ask this in the name of Jesus, your beloved Son. Amen.



The Denis Connection started with an idea I had after my brother passed away. His name was Dennis and I feel he died of loneliness. It made me realize that since I was the only person who spent time with him, one person is not enough. People need people.

I named the ministry after my brother and it stands for "Delivering Encouragement, Nurturing and Increasing Socialization". We started as a visiting ministry but have now expanded to providing transportation to appointments and errands. In this day, many people have their family out of the area, working full time, or sometimes are estranged.

There is no judgment or shame in asking for help; that is why we are here. We currently have 28 volunteers and since our start in May 2016, we have served 35 clients. There is no cost to you for these services.



Our second graders are preparing for their First Reconciliation later this month, and our Level II Confirmation Prep candidates have rounded the curve towards making their Confirmation.

Pray for each of our fellow disciples, that they may hear God's call in their life, and live that call to the fullest! This week begins the first week of "ordinary" time in our Liturgical year. This ordinary time begins as we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus, the man, who with His baptism, got ready to begin His public ministry. How fitting for each of us to know, that when *we* are Baptized, *we* are getting ready for our public ministry! Sealed and anointed in Christ, we are welcomed into the Church's family (formally) and sent to "work."

First, we begin "working" by forming our relationships with one another, and learning about God through the example of Jesus, as well as our parents and each of the members of the church family. We learn good habits (which can become virtuous) but we can also learn bad habits (which can become vicious). We make mistakes, but hopefully we learn from our mistakes, listen to those around us for different ideas and examples, and do not get rigidly "stuck" in our limited ways of seeing and understanding our faith.

As we gain knowledge, understanding, and experience, we grow in wisdom. We gain courage to use these gifts that we have grown in, and we set the example of being able to rightly judge situations that we find ourselves in, and make decisions to grow closer to God. When we grow closer to God, we grow in holiness, and while we know that God is beyond our understanding and knowledge, we still seek to be like Him. This all begins with Baptism for us.

The first of the Sacraments, Baptism gives us an indelible mark (a mark that cannot be removed) on our very selves. We have been chosen by God to minister for Him, each of us in our own way. By our own choice, we choose the effectiveness of our ministry. Do we give the simplest explanation, or do we seek out challenges for ourselves, and seek to make ourselves and each other better? Do we continue to grow in the seven gifts that the Holy Spirit gives to us in Baptism and seals in us when we choose to Confirm our faith, or do we simply "let it slide" because we are "too busy?"

The beauty of our Catholic Faith is its complex simplicity (and its simple complexity!). **We** get to choose where to take it, but we are responsible for continuing our growth. We choose to reconcile ourselves when we do wrong, or we choose to maintain separation. God is always there urging, nudging, prodding (in my case, more often kicking my rear in gear) us to the path that only He can see, laid out before us. Do we have faith to follow? I often need to know why, and I want to see where I am headed, but I am learning, more and more, to trust that God has laid the groundwork for me. Every opportunity is presented and I have but to accept that challenge, learn from my mistakes (and successes), and keep moving forward.

One of the choices that we have for our first reading this week is quite the challenge.

I, the LORD, have called you for the victory of justice, I have grasped you by the hand; I formed you, and set you as a covenant of the people, a light for the nations, to open the eyes of the blind, to bring out prisoners from confinement, and from the dungeon, those who live in darkness. Isaiah 42:6-7

Through our Baptismal call, we have each been given the tools. The question is, have we learned how to use them properly, effectively and efficiently? It's up to each one of us. I'll see you on the journey!
