### FR. T'S TIDBITS:

We are in the midst of Ordinary time. What is Ordinary Time? The definition of Ordinary Time is taken from the *Documents on the Liturgy*. "Apart from those seasons having their own distinctive character, (eg. Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter), thirty-three or thirty-four weeks remain in the yearly cycle that do not celebrate a specific aspect of the mystery of Christ. Rather, especially on the Sundays, they are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects. This period is known as Ordinary Time."


In our day to day life we celebrate all that God has blessed us with and the people with whom we share our gifts and talents. It is in our *everyday life* that we see and experience God. However, we must see with the eyes of faith the experiences of our life as God given. We are created in the image and likeness of God and we are called to project those experiences to others so that they too can see God's hand in their life.

One example I use often is the food baskets that we prepare for the needy at the holidays. It is very easy for us to give at those times of year. The need is always in the fore front of our mind at Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter. However that need is year round, during the ordinary times of the year.

Ordinary Time is not all that ordinary. It can be a challenging season, unlike Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter, seasons that already draw us in and point us toward celebrating a specific aspect of the life of Christ. In the season of Ordinary Time the onus or responsibility is placed on us. We are challenged to see God in our daily life, to celebrate the Word made flesh - to be disciples of the Lord seeing the Lord's presence in all aspects of our life and in those we come in contact with.

You may notice this weekend that we are using the "Christmas and Easter" communion cups. Our common communion cups are beautiful implements used in the celebration of Eucharist and have served us well, but they are in need of a bit of refreshing. The process of refreshing the cups is called "replating" and is an expense that comes up approximately every 7 years.

We would like to manage the cost of replating by offering parishioners the opportunity to "sponsor" a cup. The sponsored cup will be engraved on the bottom with the name of a loved one. It is a nice way to honor a loved one's memory or to leave a lasting reminder of thanksgiving to God.

The price to sponsor a cup is \$250.00. The cup will be engraved on the bottom with the sponsor's choice of one of two messages:

In memory of Jane Doe or In thanksgiving for John Doe

These cups will continue to be used for many years and will serve the entire community of St. Jane Frances. If you would like to participate, simply come into the office, complete a sponsor form, and leave a check made out to the parish for \$250. The cups will arrive back by Easter when we will begin to use them at all weekend Masses. **The deadline to submit paperwork is Sunday, February 18**<sup>th</sup> so we can have the cups back in time for Easter.

works with couples, facilitates family and marital therapy, offers immigrant stress support, and provides Christian counseling.

His treatment philosophy is based on his belief that genetic predisposition is not a desting but is a risk. "I believe in the freedom to shape our fate and that we have the power or refusing to be a toy of fate," said Wrobel. "One's responsibility for choices, heroism of admitting mistakes, and wisdom of learning from those mistakes creates the basic ingredients of apt use of the freedom given us by God. Our weaknesses are not our destiny — the boldness of proceroning them is."

Dr. Wrobel's professional history includes serving with the IMPACT Employee Assistance Work/Life Program, Evergreen Counseling, Change is Possible Counseling Services, North Suburban Counseling Associates, Oakland University Graham Counseling Center, Polish Psychological Clinic, Metro Medical Practice, and Balance and Harmony Counseling.

Dr. Wrobel is the author of Contact: The Tale of Human Longing for Fulfilling Communication and Language and Schizophrenia.

SPEAKER: Sr. Solanus Casey Danda, SOLT TOPIC: Ignatian Discernment of Spirits

Are you confused about God's will in your life, or are you feeling far from Him? Does prayer feel dry to you? Do you feel indifferent about your faith? Perhaps you're experiencing great joy & peace, or you feel on fire for your faith & close to God. Are you facing an important decision? The discernment of spirits is the art of sifting through spiritual experiences in order to distinguish what is from the Lord and what is not.

Sr. Solanus Casey Danda, SOLT will be talking with us about using St. Ignatius' Rules for Discernment of Spirits to help us to become more aware of the inner movements of the heart, to recognize which are from God, and to discern how to respond to them, which can be especially helpful when making important decisions. This weekend, as I listen to the Gospel and get frustrated with the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading, I'd like to put myself in the shoes of Simon's (aka Peter's) Mother-in-Law, sick in bed with a fever. The last time I had a fever, I was miserable and I made those around me miserable. When I threw out my back, there were weeks of excruciating pain, indescribable to anyone unless they have been at that point, followed by months of manageable tearing the phonebook in half pain, to constant rehab that goes on each and every morning when I wake up.

Oh what I would have done to have someone show up and heal me quickly! *Or* did God put that individual or group of people in place for me and I just didn't realize it? Months of chiropractic visits to loosen muscles I neglected and pushed too far, to teach me a price is paid for what I do and have done to my body. Patient family members helping me stand, helping me sit, walking next to me to be sure I make it ten feet to a different chair or to lay down. Friends who would call to check-in and see how I was doing. Friends and family who would give me easy work to keep me going through those lean months.

I had to learn. Had Jesus come along and healed me, I very well might have never seen the people who were right in front of my eyes, or known the blessings that He had already bestowed. I'll admit it, I am a bit dense, obstinate, and rigid. Things "should" happen a particular way and that's the way I make them happen, but the world around me doesn't beat to the rhythm of Ben's drum. (Thank God for these huge favors!) God knows me better than I know myself. He knows that Ben needs experiential learning, hands-on, do it a few times until you figure it out lessons. He knows it takes time with me.

I suspect Jesus didn't want people to come to Him to just get healed, because soon, that's all they'd do, never learning their lesson - never learning how *not* to get into those predicaments in the first place. Jesus also wants the whole world to experience the saving power of God, not just one small group of people. So Jesus wakes up early, prays about it, and only then does He go beyond this small village.

St. Paul wrote that he felt entrusted by God to share the Gospel, the Good News - the news that we no long need to be weighed down by sin. The news that Jesus came for me, for you, for everyone, so we do not have to pay the rightly deserved price for our sins, but rather we get the opportunity to learn, to change, to feel forgiveness and to show and teach others the same. We are allotted more time to move our hearts back towards God and to walk by our sisters' and brothers' sides to help them those last few feet. Sometimes we do this willingly. Other times we get plucked from the crowd, like Simon of Cyrene, to aid a stranger in bearing their cross.

I now think I "get" the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading (I Cor 9:16-19, 22-23). If I use my gifts to help others come closer to God, not for money (or power), but for that other person's sake, I am rewarded with so much more than I can ever imagine. Remember the last verse of St. Paul's letter that we read today, "All this I do for the sake of the gospel, so that I too may have a share in it." I want to share happiness and great experiences with people that come my way. Stop and shake a hand, give a smile, a hug, a wish-you-well sentiment. Let's not be in such a hurry to get to the next thing on the list. Jesus granted us time, let's use it to further His mission, and enjoy the journey. I'll see you around, God willing!

- ◆ Who does Jesus help in your life? Where can you help? At home? At school?
- What does it mean to serve others? Do you know someone who serves others?

Ordinary Time is only with us for another week and a half. Have you made it extraordinary? Stop and say hello to someone at Mass, that you have seen, but don't know the name of. Introduce yourself and make a new friend.

As Lent is around the corner, let's begin to think of what we can do for Lent instead of what we can give up. Maybe pray an extra 5 minutes a day? Meet someone new every Sunday, and find our new friends from the previous weeks? There is so much that we can do as a community to make everyone's lives a little happier!


