Soon, we will begin a new season in the

Church's liturgical year. On March 6th we will begin the season of Lent, a season of self-denial, discipline and preparation for the great feast of Easter. The theme of our Lenten journey at St. Jane Frances de Chantal is **Live Lent**, **Live Life**.

Soon you will receive a postcard that will provide you with some of the events that will be taking place here at the parish. These events are a means to prepare us for our Lenten pilgrimage of forty days. I personally prefer the season of Lent to the season of Advent. There is less preparation during this time and the days are getting longer and spring is just around the corner, and with Easter comes new life.

I have always told people, life is what you make it. You can either see the glass half full or half empty; the choice is ours and ours alone. As we prepare for the season of Lent may we not see it as a season to "get through." Rather, may it be a time of self discovery, a time of prayer, a time of seeing the hope that is ever present in the world. I know that at times it can be difficult to see the hope that is present in the world, but it *is* present. Looking at the world with the eyes of faith, hope shines through the darkness of the world.

I am reminded of the Easter Vigil. As we sit in a darkened church, the first words we hear as the Vigil begins are "Christ our Light," and our response is, "Thanks be to God." In our preparation of the great feast of Easter may we be the light of Christ in our own part of the world, in our families, workplace, our community and in our lives. We are the light that can shatter the darkness; we are the light that can lead others to a deeper relationship with the Lord.



"Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful." (Luke 6:36)

In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches that we are to love our enemies, be good to those who hate us, bless those who curse us and pray for those who mistreat us. We are to, "Do to others as you would have them do to you." This is the Golden Rule we were taught when we were young. Many of us are still struggling to learn these lessons. When we are faced with injustice, we can be resentful. When someone mistreats us, we want to return the favor. In those situations, we might ask ourselves, is that how God treats me? When I act without kindness, when I am unmerciful toward others, does God stop extending his mercy to me? Does God cut himself off from me? Does God stop loving me? Scripture tells us that God is with us always.

We are called to be merciful not just because it is the right thing to do, but also because God is merciful. But there is another implication. Since we are created in the image of God, and God is merciful, we are created to be merciful. This is not some additional feature that Jesus is expecting from his disciples or us. This is part of our constitution, our humanity. To be human is to be merciful. The world presents plenty of opportunities to be merciful. Let's keep trying.

How am I showing my mercy, my humanity to others? Am I the body of Christ in the world?

<u>ABOUT THE</u> <u>GOSPEL</u>:

Family Corner

In Sunday's Gospel, Jesus reminds us to be kind even to

those who are not kind to us. This is very difficult, but if we want to be like Jesus, we need to love our enemies and those who would hurt us. Jesus loved everyone, even those who crucified him.

IN CHURCH:

When we offer the Sign of Peace at Mass, we are not just greeting those seated near us. By this gesture, we say that we believe true peace is a gift of Christ's Death and Resurrection and that we desire reconciliation with Christ and the community.

QUESTIONS FOR THE WEEK;

- Do you need to ask forgiveness from God or another person? What is holding you back from doing so?
- How do you respond to hatred around you? Which of Jesus' teachings do you think is hardest to do? Why?
- What should we do if someone calls us a hurtful name? Is this easy to do? Why?
- How does Jesus' teaching to love our enemies challenge you?

FAMILY PRAYER:

Lord, we find it hard to be kind when someone is not kind to us. Help us to see others as you do, so that we will not be tempted to judge them or be unkind.

QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT WEEK, IN PREPARATION FOR MASS:

- This week, did you promise to do something, and decide to do something else instead? Did you break your word?
- Who are good friends? What kind of friend does Jesus tell us to be?
- What does a "good" person look like? Do they act different that other people? How?

Pray for all of our young disciples who are preparing for a sacrament this year!

This week's Gospel (Good News) reading, continues the story of Jesus preaching and ministering to the people of Galilee. If you look on the computer, you can find the area of Galilee. If we guestimate a straight-line distance from the lowest portion (of the vast area known as Galilee) to Jerusalem, the religious center of life in Jesus' time, as around 60 miles or so, that would be a minimum three day journey. Of course the land is not flat, and rivers can flood at times, so the shortest travel time would increase based on the path used, the time of year you were traveling in, your traveling companions, and where in Galilee you were coming from.


Why bring this up? We see in this example that the people of Galilee were very much like you and I, even though they were still "near" Jerusalem. To get there would require a fairly sizable amount of money, time, and a lot of faith (compared to today)! You couldn't go online to book a room, you (sometimes) had an animal to carry your luggage and if not, YOU had to haul your own luggage the whole way. This meant that you really didn't know for sure how far you could travel on any given day, and if there might even be a place to stay when you took a rest. A faithful Hebrew family might make a pilgrimage to Jerusalem once a year, for the Passover (Pesach), the Feast of Weeks (Shavuot) and/or the Festival of Tabernacles (Sukkot). This could put a strain on the families' finances (and sanity) if the travel was rough, so we can only imagine that travel to the Holy Temple might have become less important to some families that just couldn't take time away. THIS is why I can see Jesus' ministry in the Galilean area being so important!

When we get our first job and begin earning money, it becomes quite easy to fall prey to the allure of money. If we are good at a sport (or art, an instrument, singing, etc.) we can fall into the allure of the praise and prideful "look at how great <u>I am</u>" attitudes that we see in society today. Jesus challenges us (in this continuation of His <u>Sermon on the Plain</u>) to live outside of these "things" that society and our human nature hold as valuable. He didn't just preach it, He lived it!

The final line of the Gospel speaks volumes:

"...the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you." Luke 6:38b

If each of us knew, really knew, that we will be judged by the way we judge others and how fairly we treat one another, wouldn't we try (I mean *really* try) to be better to those around us? I cannot force change on another, but I can do my best to be an example, so that those that see me can be even better than me. I'll see you on the journey, and if I don't hold a door open for you, feel free to slug me in the arm and inform me of what I "should have" done.


