## FR. T'S TIDBITS: CHALICE OF A PRIEST

Recently someone saw my chalice and asked me what the history was behind it. The sacristans who set up for Mass have seen the names engraved on my chalice. However, I realized that the congregation may not have seen or even known that every priest has his own chalice.

My chalice was given to me by my mother's side of the family, The Jakubiak family in 1985 at our annual family reunion. I had two requests with regard to the chalice: that it be simple and not ornate, and that it not be too expensive.

The stem of the chalice has the symbol of wheat. The base of the chalice has a small cross. The names engraved on the base are people who have had an impact upon my life and my preparation for the priesthood.

Joseph and Francis Jakubiak , my great grandparents Anthony and Mary Jakubiak, my grandparents Daniel Harland, my cousin who died at the age of 4. Anthony Sulkowski Sr., my father Phyllis Sulkowski, my mother

Esther Flores, a woman who was like a second mother to me.

On the bottom of the chalice are also the initials R.M.F., a good friend.

Every time I preside at the Eucharistic celebration I remember those who have gone before me. I also thank God for their influence on my life.

## **ABOUT THE GOSPEL:**

Today we celebrate the Transfiguration of Jesus. Jesus takes three of

his friends up a mountain where he changes in appearance and his clothes become dazzling white. They hear God say, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." They wonder what all of this means.

## <u>IN CHURCH:</u>

Think of yourself as a disciple, especially when the priest consecrates the host and elevates it as the Body of Christ. The Apostles probably felt that way when they saw Jesus shining on the mountain.

## **<u>QUESTIONS FOR THE WEEK</u>:**

- How have you decided to Change and Grow during Lent this year?
- When does deep change happen in people's lives? Have you glimpsed God in your life?
- What can we change in our lives, to grow closer to God?

## FAMILY PRAYER:

Lord, help us to remember we also are God's beloved children.

## <u>QUESTION TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT</u> <u>WEEK, IN PREPARATION FOR MASS</u>:

- What are some ways that your family prays together? Do you talk to Jesus or just say a prayer that you memorized?
- Have you ever hurt someone and not known it? What should we do when we hurt someone?

## **REMINDER:**

K-6 Faith Formation & Confirmation Preparation sessions begin again this week. We'll see you all on Monday or Tuesday! Seriously? God asks Abraham to sacrifice his son? An old man, who didn't have children with his wife until they were *well* past child bearing age (Abraham was 100 years old and Sarah not too far behind)! God tested and tested, made promises for wonderous things, and then asks Abraham to sacrifice his son, just as he was reaching the age of "manhood".

A friend of mine had taken a class with a 15 page syllabus, and demands on the time of the students as if the students did not work or have any other classes. Within 3 class periods, the size of the class had gone from 25 grad students, to about 8. On the forth class meeting, 2 more had withdrawn from the course and my friend was on the fence. The instructor walked in, looked around, nodded his head and said something to the effect of, "There we go. This is a more reasonable size, and I now know that you all are serious about your education and this class! Throw out that first syllabus, here is a 3 page one that we will be using instead."

During many events over the years, I've been a part of Icebreakers and mixers where we are asked, if you could change one thing in your life, what would it be? I have really thought this over, and I think that I would not change a single thing. The good stuff, the bad, the easy, the hard, struggles, pains, blessings, everything that I have done has helped me grow into who I am now. I have my "moments", as anyone that knows me can attest to, but so does everyone. Not one of us is perfect. We are all on the journey together, helping (and testing) one another through life. If we were not tested, we would never know where or how to improve.

Abraham's test is quite extreme, but God is always asking us, "How much are you willing to give me?" as a test. "What more can you give me?" is our measuring stick of where we are and how we can be closer to God. Is it making a point of coming to Mass more often? How about making an effort to be a part of a group (Youth Ministry is a great group, wink, nod, hint, hint) or a study of some sort? 30 minutes in front of the Blessed Sacrament in prayer, in quiet, is where we are called to sstttrreeeetccchh ourselves this Lent. Not with some crazy ideal notion, but with a simple, reachable, maintainable goal that will help us change our lives and draw us closer to God.

At the end of Lent, will we be a new person, or will we fall back to what we used to do? Can we make a "little" change and transfigure our lives in a way that someone might say, "Hey, I've noticed a change in you. What's going on?" Jesus physically appears different to his disciples, and they noticed a change in him. Can we change who we are and what we do (for ourselves and others) to be more like Christ?

If you have suggestions for change, let us know. If you need suggestions for change in your life, or even if you need help, ask. If you'd like to be a part of something but don't know where to start, stop by the Welcome Desk after Mass, or call the Parish Office, as that first (and often hardest) step on this leg of the journey. Happy Lent, I'll see you on the road!
