FR. T'S TIDBITS: A LENTEN PROJECT

I hope your Lent is going well. There are many ways in which we can deepen our spiritual life throughout this season of Lent. During this season of Lent we are also called to remember those who are in need of our prayers.

The Knights of Columbus council of St. Jane Frances de Chantal have a program they call the Travelling Chalice. As you may recall, families sign up to take the chalice home for a week and pray as a family for vocations to the priesthood, religious life and the deaconate.

As we pray for priestly and religious vocations within the Church asking God to touch the hearts and minds of people to serve the needs of the church, we also pray for those who have responded to God's call. We pray for Pope Francis, for Bishops, for retired religious men and women, and retired priests who have served the church for decades. In our prayer we remember pastors and associate pastors who are at present serving the needs of the people in parishes across the Archdiocese of Detroit. We remember in a special way those religious men and women who are sick, infirm and dying.

This Lent I invite you to sign up to take the travelling chalice home for a week. Place it in a prominent place where you will see it and say a short prayer for vocations. That prayer can be as simple as, "Lord, call men and women to serve your Church." The signup sheet is on the Welcome Desk in the gathering space.

In an address that St. Pope John Paul II gave to a group of young people he said, "Good Shepherd, teach the young people gathered here, teach the young people of the world, the meaning of 'laying down' their lives through vocation and mission."

Each of us are given a vocation to share in service to the mission of the Church—namely to proclaim, to manifest and make known the love that Jesus Christ has for all of us.

Bon mot: Live Lent, Live Life.

Are you Looking for an opportunity to give back to the parish and the community? Become a Lifestyle Coach for a Diabetes Prevention Program to be offered at St. Jane Frances in June!

The CDC-led National Diabetes Prevention program (DPP) is a lifestyle change program for preventing type 2 Diabetes. Lifestyle Coaches are trained facilitators who deliver the National DPP lifestyle change program. They are trained in the national curriculum and possess strong interpersonal and group facilitation skills. As the facilitator for the program sessions, the Lifestyle Coach fulfills several key roles:

- ◆ Providing information and support
- Facilitating and fostering relationships with and among participants
- Providing guidance in setting goals, identifying and overcoming barriers
- Delivering the evidence-based curriculum as it was designed
- ♦ Conducting weigh-ins of each participant at every session
- ♦ Reviewing participant self-monitoring records
- Submitting program data to the CDC in conjunction with their site coordinator

Henry Ford Macomb Faith Community Nursing Diabetes Prevention Program is seeking a candidate to be the Lifestyle Coach for our community of St. Jane Frances. Lifestyle Coaches do not have to be health care professionals. A stipend is offered and training is provided. 

<u>ABOUT THE</u> GOSPEL:

Family Corner

Sunday's Gospel reveals

Jesus as fully human and fully divine. The devil tempts Jesus in the desert, promising him human power and earthly goods. Jesus shows us how to resist temptation by holding tightly to the promises of God found in Sacred Scripture.

IN CHURCH:

Locate the Stations of the Cross in church. Spend some time looking at each one and imagining being there with Jesus.

<u>QUESTIONS FOR THE WEEK;</u>

- What are some temptations you experience? How does the Church help you to strengthen yourself against them?
- What did Jesus mean that people do not live on bread alone?
- This first full week of Lent, what have you turned your attention from or what did you promise to turn it towards?
- ♦ What are some ways that you can grow to be more like Jesus this Lent?

FAMILY PRAYER:

Pray the Lord's Prayer together. Focus on the words "lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil."

QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT WEEK, IN PREPARATION FOR MASS:

- ♦ Can you remember some times that Jesus prayed?
- ♦ Where are your favorite places to pray?

This year, the annual CYO Camps clean-up is happening the weekend of April 12th-14th.

Individuals as well as families can participate. You can help one day, two or all three days that weekend, and they will give you food and a place to sleep if you'd like to stay. See the bulletin next week for the flyer of the event! Give it a thought, and try something different this Lent!

Fasting, abstaining from meat, fish on Fridays, "giving something up"; this is what I remember about Lent from my childhood. As I grow older, Lent begins to take on different meanings. Preparation, turning my little "sufferings" into sacrifices, focusing my mind on the suffering of Jesus, and trying to pay better attention to those around me and what they are experiencing. Jesus, fresh from His baptism by John, felt the call to go to the desert. He spent time preparing for His public ministry, by being alone but with God, and nothing more to distract Him. That is what we "try" to remember during Lent.

Not many of us can take 40 days and nights completely "off", but something we can do is free up our schedule just a little bit. Instead of stopping for coffee in the morning on the way to school and/or work, have the coffee maker at home brew a simple pot 15 minutes before you get up in the morning. Get that cup, sit in you favorite chair and thank God for the day he has given you. 3-5 minutes. Doesn't sound like much, but I don't think much of listening to the radio sitting in the drive thru either. It is these short little interludes that we can repurpose towards something so much more. The money that is saved can be put towards something better as well. Donate it to someone who could use a meal, save it up and buy a friend a bible. Use that "extra dollar" to get an aid to help you pray or get some meditative music online or on cd. Each of these things help us in holiness (growing closer to God).

Jesus was able to turn the devil away at each temptation. Would I be able to? I can only hope that my willpower would be strong enough to do so. If we remember that it is God that strengthens and emboldens us, we will realize that God has already given us the gifts that we need to overcome those temptations, and no matter how hard it gets, He has graced us with faith. If we keep that faith, we will not be overcome.

Lent has us rethink our lives and repurpose our time and resources. As we start this Lent and ready ourselves for that remembrance of God delivering us from the sting of death, the fear of nothing beyond this world, we remember what it took to do this for us. Not just a lamb from either the sheep or the goats, but The Lamb, The Son of God who sacrificed Himself for us as a whole, and for you and I as individuals. Walk the way of the cross with Jesus this Lent. Visit someone in need, help someone who needs help, do these "little" acts of kindness and remember that Jesus gave so much more than a little time. He sacrificed His very life so that we might live in freedom from sin. It's time we took advantage of this gift and passed this Good News on to others and remember it more fully ourselves. Happy Lent!


