ⁱ We made many day trips to various areas in and around Jerusalem. From travelling to the Sea of Galilee to climbing Mt. Sinai to see the little town of Bethlehem it is a trip I will always remember. As a side note I made a second

trip to Israel ten years after I was ordained and celebrated Masses at the places important in the life and ministry of Jesus.

During that time we travelled all over Israel and walked in the footsteps of Jesus. The most memorable week of that trip was Holy Week. We celebrated Mass in the upper room on Holy Thursday, walked the Via Dolorosa on Good Friday, slept in the garden of Gethsemane, and visited the tomb of Jesus on Easter Sunday morning. It was a trip that I will never forget.

For those who have been to Israel, once you have been to the places Jesus walked and taught, the Holy Scriptures take on a deeper and richer meaning for you. You will never read or hear the Word of God proclaimed the same again. The Word of God becomes more meaningful because you visited the very spot where it happened.

I invite you to take part in the Holy Week liturgies from Passion Sunday to Easter morning. The liturgies are rich in tradition and each liturgy has its own distinction within Holy Week as they point us to the great feast of Easter. Again, I invite you to take part in all or some of the liturgies of Holy Week as we prepare for Easter.

Have a joyous and wonderful Holy Week.

NO EASTER VIGIL RECEPTION THIS YEAR

Traditionally, the reception following Easter Vigil is to celebrate and welcome the newly initiated – those who have prepared to receive the Sacraments through the RCIA program. Unfortunately, we do not have any souls to initiate this year, therefore, there will be no Easter Vigil reception.

It is not too soon to begin praying for God to send us seekers – people looking to form a

relationship with Jesus through the Sacraments of the Catholic Church. We will be forming an RCIA team during the summer months and, God willing, will begin preparing people for reception of the Sacraments at Easter Vigil in 2019. I ask you to please include prayers for a Spirit-filled group of people to come forward to form the RCIA team, but, most importantly, for our evangelization efforts to be increased so that we bring in those seeking initiation.

PLACING PALM BRANCHES IN THE HOME

After dinner, or at another time on Palm Sunday, the household gathers in prayer. All make the sign of the cross.

Leader: Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!

Leader: We have come to the last days of Lent. Today, we heard the reading of the Passion. That story will remain with us as we enter into the Three Days when we celebrate the mystery of Christ passing through suffering and death to life at God's right hand. "We are always carrying about in the body the dying of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our body. For we who live are constantly being given up to death for the sake of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may be manifested in our mortal flesh." The Word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

After a time of silence, members of the household join in prayers of intercession:

Leader: For an evening that is perfect, holy, peaceful, and without sin; let us pray to the Lord.

LITTLE WHITE BOOKS

The Little White Books for the Easter Season are available again this year in the Gathering Space. This year the book covers passages from the Acts of the Apostles with suggested reflections that are an excellent resource for daily prayer. It's important to take time each day to be mindful of God's presence in our lives and the great gift of the Risen Christ. A \$1 donation for each book would be appreciated.

HELP NEEDED: DECORATE THE WORSHIP SPACE FOR EASTER!

We will be preparing the Worship Space to celebrate the joy of Easter on Good Friday, March 30th, immediately following the Good Friday liturgy, approximately 3:00pm. If you can stay and help for an hour, we would be very grateful! No special skills or sign-up is needed, simply stay and we will put you to work!

TRIDUUM RITUALS

Lent comes to an end before the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. That liturgy begins the Triduum, the great Three Days that celebrate the central mystery of our faith. Triduum rituals invite us all to baptismal renewal. Here are some examples.

Washing of Feet: After the homily on Holy Thursday, we echo our master in the washing of feet. This ritual reminds us that our baptismal commitment means we are to be servants of one another. In the time of St. Ambrose in Milan, those who were baptized also had their feet washed, because of Jesus' words to Peter: "Whoever has bathed has no need except to have his feet



washed" (Jn 13:10). Many scholars have seen a baptismal reference in those words.



Veneration of the Cross: As part of our observance of Good Friday, we venerate the cross on which Christ died. The veneration challenges us to be willing to accept the cross, too, for it is the only way to resurrection. Through Baptism, we shared in Christ's death that we might come to new life. Every year we are called to deepen our

identification with His cross and resurrection.

Waters of Baptism: The core of our celebrations of the Easter Vigil is the Baptism of the elect. As we share in their joy on this holy night, we are all called to renew our own baptismal promises, to live in the joy of life in the Risen One. Lent comes to its fulfillment around the waters of the font.



All: Lord, hear our prayer.



When we participate in the reading of the Passion, it is hard to say the words, "Crucify him." It

reminds us that we all choose to sin and that Jesus loves us anyway. He loves us so much that he died and rose for us and our salvation.

IN CHURCH:

Focus on the Passion of Jesus during Mass. Follow along carefully and say the crowd responses strongly. Consider what it would have been like to be there when Jesus was crucified.

QUESTIONS FOR THE WEEK:

- ♦ When have you gone along with the crowd, even when you knew it was not the right thing to do?
- Who walks with you in your life journey? Have you spoken with a Godparent or a Godchild lately? Give them a call this week.
- How do you welcome new people at school or at work? Do you treat them special or like a stranger? How can you welcome new people differently?
- What are some ways that you show Jesus respect in your home? Do you have the same respect for Him in public?

FAMILY PRAYER:

We want to choose you, Jesus! Show us how to do what is right, even when others want us to do what is wrong.

QUESTION TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT WEEK, IN PREPARATION FOR MASS:

- How are you preparing for the Risen Lord?
- What have you changed in your life this Lenten season, that you will continue to work on for the rest of the year?
- ♦ When was the last time you heard the story of Salvation? Look on page #8 and prepare for Easter Sunday by reading some of the story!

Not everyone is called to proselytization. What does this mean? Merriam-Webster.com defines it as:

to induce (to move by persuasion or influence) someone to convert to one's faith. But, what each of us is called to, is Evangelization:

to preach the gospel to ... One another.

None of us is immune, the last time I checked, I am just as imperfect as the person next to me. I am not the "best" at preaching the Gospel at all times, but I have a great role model. He spent much of his life in obscurity, until he was challenged by his mother. His name... Jesus.

"Of course, Ben, you work at the Church, you're supposed to say that." But you see, through years of living, personal research, and speaking with others, I have given thought to and weighed out many different ways to live my life. None are perfect, as a matter of fact, all of them have pros and cons associated with them. The life of the world tends to say, "Enjoy now! Treat yourself, and live your life to it's fullest." Sounds good right? Unfortunately, there is a very limited definition of "life" in this example. It's often seen through biological life, breathing air, blood pumping through our veins, electrical impulses firing through our brains and nervous system. So long as these three criteria are met, we are living. But is that really "Living"?

Jesus shows us, through word and action, a different way of life. Living as The Creator designed us to live. Humanity chose the more painful path of life, so since we are descended from those first humans who chose the painful "more" of life as we know it, we continue on this same path, BUT we still get to choose HOW to react to different stimuli that affects us, and how we proceed with our lives. No more poignant of an example is given than that of Adam and Eve.

Two humans given free will, allowed the choice to follow a single rule or to not follow that rule. Live in perfect freedom and stay away from one temptation, or go to that temptation (with no practice to resist temptation). We know the story, we know the consequences, we know the choice made.

Jesus, in his public life, was tempted quite often. He was given choices, He chose the counter cultural path of true faith, of true obedience to God. He followed the spirit of the law and truly loved God, first and foremost, and He treated his neighbor as He wanted to be treated, even when we betrayed Him, over and over, even giving Him up to be put to death. Still He prayed for me, He prayed for them, He prayed for you, NOT for Himself.

First Jesus entered Jerusalem (like a VIP), riding in on a carpet of cloaks and palms. He was pushed and tempted to act and behave like royalty, special, set aside from others, but He still chose a servants path. To follow this path He had to pray for the strength to continue on that right path laid out before Him, but He could have turned around and left us hanging out to dry, still not washed clean, just wet from the stuff we find ourselves swimming in each day. But He CHOSE to be there for us, and He showed us a more perfect path in life.

He also showed us a life after our earthly life. A life with God, a state of perfection unattainable be ourselves, the next life only available through God's grace, mercy and forgiveness.

As we enter Holy Week, why don't we enter into the story together? Hear, witness and participate in the story ourselves and share it with the next generation. See Jesus wash the feet of His disciples, celebrate a Last Supper, take part in out own prayer in the garden, walk the Way of the Cross with Jesus, hear again (with new ears) the story of The Anointed One (Christ), and read and hear of our Salvation History, through our celebration of the Ultimate Passover. The Angel who once visited Egypt will once again come and exact an earthly decree of death on everyone, but if we really hear and believe, that same angel passes over our spiritual nature and when those last moments of time come, and our Earthly Bodies are reunited with our Heavenly Souls, it will be in (with) the perfection that IS. The I AM. God, Three-in-One, Almighty, Creator, Omniscient, Omnipotent, Alpha, Omega, Beginning, End, Savior, Redeemer, Yahweh, the UN-Namable...

I desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel and then throughout the world."

Pope St. John Paul II declared the first Sunday after Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday.
