In many respects Lazarus, who was raised from the dead by Jesus, is a man of mystery. Jesus' raising Lazarus from the dead is found only in the Gospel of John – Chapters 11 and 12. After that, Lazarus is never mentioned anywhere else in the New Testament.

Since the raising of Lazarus is absent in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, the historical authenticity of this event has been subject to question. Why would Matthew, Mark and Luke have omitted the account of Lazarus being raised from the dead? Why is the Gospel of John the only biblical account we have of the raising of Lazarus? If anything, the opposite should have been true. John's Gospel was written almost 60 years after Jesus ascended back to the Father. Matthew, Mark and Luke's Gospels were written roughly 30 to 40 years after Jesus' Ascension. Could all three, Matthew, Mark and Luke, have forgotten such a miraculous event, leaving only John to recount the details? These are questions that beg for answers, but all we can do is wonder and ponder why this is the case.

We know that the first twelve chapters of John revolve around seven signs (we would call them miracles) of Jesus. The raising of Lazarus is the seventh and final sign. The raising of Lazarus serves as a transition from the book of signs to the book of glory in the Gospel of John. Yet after Lazarus has his "15 minutes of fame" he fades off into oblivion.

In today's world of celebrity news, Lazarus would have been famous. Who would not want to hear from someone who had been dead for a period of four days and then returned to life? The playwright Eugene O'Neill, in 1925, penned a sequel, or perhaps more to the point, a fictitious response, to what should have happened to Lazarus after he returned to life. O'Neill entitled his work "Lazarus Laughed". He had no intention of writing a theological treatise in regards to Lazarus but he tried to envision how Lazarus would have been viewed by the people who lived during the time that Jesus walked the face of the earth as one like us.

O'Neill imagined a celebrity figure, someone who commanded both wonder and admiration. In the play, at one point, Lazarus' fame gains the attention of the Emperor Caesar. Lazarus is summoned to Rome to be interrogated by the emperor. When Lazarus is asked what is it like to die, Lazarus laughs, a holy, loud and rather pompous laugh. Lazarus responds that there is no such thing as death, just the joy and ecstasy of being with God. The laughter of Lazarus was, however, no laughing matter; rather it represented a threat to Rome. People shuddered and trembled in deference to Rome's muscle and authority. The fear of death was what made the Roman Empire such a power. As a result Lazarus is sentenced to death by Rome and he goes to his death laughing. In effect, it is Lazarus who has the last laugh.

This is why, we, as Disciples of Christ, do not grieve as if there is no hope. We know that there is more to our existence than the time we spend in our earthly body. Does that mean we do not weep and lament when someone close dies? Of course not. We are told that "Jesus wept" at the death of His



## Canticum Novum - Time

Time is relative (according to Albert Einstein) and flows according to a set plan. Relatively speaking, time can get warped when it runs into different objects with gravitational properties. Church time is different. There is a theory that time stops during the liturgy. That it is placed in a vacuum of sorts, and is replaced with the presence of God. Especially true during the celebration of the Eucharistic prayer, we revert to a point in time where Jesus is present during the last supper, saying the words of institution through the person of our priestly celebrant who stands in His place. The Hebrew understanding of the word remember (zekher) is very literally interpreted. It really means that the moment is not only recalled, but relived as if we are placed in that moment for the first time.

The walk to Easter is filled with moments of remembrance from the Tradition of the bible. The woman at the well, the man born blind, and the restoration of the life of Lazarus, who is summoned from the tomb, wrapped in his burial clothes. Each of these people experience a rebirth. A second look at the riches of life lived with Jesus in our midst. My walk through Lent is always a time of discovery. It reminds, and makes me remember that my life needs Jesus in it to be fulfilling. I fall short more times than I like to remember. I miss my mark, maybe because I set the bar high, but I fall short and find myself on my knees feeling small. I ask for forgiveness and look for the opportunity to return the forgiveness I hope is bestowed upon me with reverence and renewed spirit. I recall the walk Jesus will make to Calvary. Beaten, scourged, and bleeding with the cross He will die on straining His back. Falling and getting back up on His way toward fulfilling His marvelous work. Holy week and the Triduum fill me with longing. The The words being so important that music gets sparse. accompaniment can sometimes confuse what we should be focusing our minds on. We adore the cross that is where our salvation lies. We hear the story of our faith during the Easter Vigil and awake to the resurrection the following morning resplendent with the cry "He's alive!".

I hope you will be joining us for all of the liturgies of Holy week and the Triduum. Easter time is my favorite time. The music is victorious with lyrics that recall the resurrection of Jesus. The weather recovers from the cold of winter to the promise of summer that spring carries. May God Bless your walk.

## Soup Kitchen Ministry serves lunch at St. Leo's



friend Lazarus. Perhaps He was also weeping, at least in some part, on account of the lack of faith of all who were angry with Him. Jesus had delayed for a period of four days before returning to Bethany. By that point, people had given up all hope of a miracle. Jesus, in effect didn't give the people what they wanted when they wanted it.

Each of us must one day face death. There is no arguing, no getting around this fact. If we are striving to live Christ-centered lives death should not bully us. Although we do not know anywhere near as much as we would like to know in regards to what happens after we take our final breath here on earth, we know that we are essentially spiritual beings who have an earthly body for only the shortest period of time. This is why, when life seems to get too hard, things as bad as they may seem, are not a cause for hopelessness. We continue to have eternal hope. God has truly defeated death and has power over it. The resuscitation of Lazarus (recall that he did die a second time), but more importantly the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, serves to validate that God's supremacy is far greater than physical death.

## WILL OUR KIDS HAVE FAITH?
