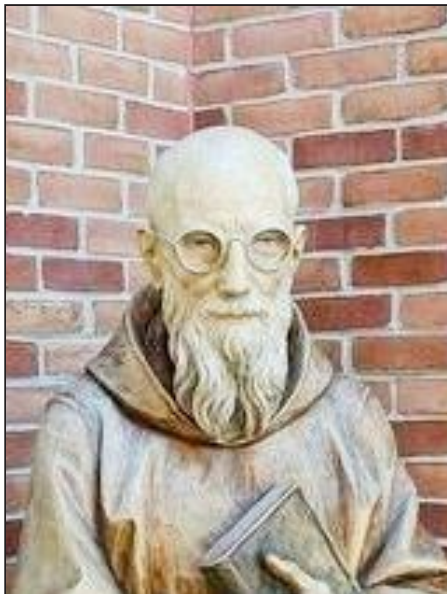

This screening is affiliated with Alzheimer's Foundation of America.

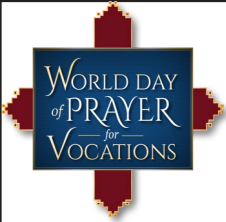
A memory screening is a simple and safe evaluation tool that checks memory and other thinking skills. It can indicate whether an additional check up by a qualified healthcare professional is needed. The face-to-face screening takes place in private and will be done by a parish nurse. It consists of a series of questions and/or tasks designed to test memory, language skills, thinking ability, and other intellectual functions. Results of the memory screenings are confidential. A memory screening is not used to diagnose any particular illness and does not replace consultation with a qualified physician or other healthcare professional.

These questions might help you decide if you should be screened. If you answer "yes" to any of them, you might benefit from a memory screening.

- ◆ Am I becoming more forgetful?
- ◆ Do I have trouble concentrating?
- ◆ Do I have difficulty performing familiar tasks?
- ◆ Do I have trouble recalling words or names in conversation?
- ◆ Do I sometimes forget where I am or where I am going?
- ◆ Have family or friends told me that I am repeating questions or saying the same thing over and over again?
- ◆ Am I misplacing things more often?
- ◆ Have I become lost when walking or driving?
- ◆ Have my family or friends noticed changes in my mood, behavior, personality, or desire to do things?

If a memory screening indicates possible problems, the person should follow up with a doctor or another qualified healthcare professional as soon as possible for a complete medical evaluation.

Follow-up is important to identify the cause of the memory problems. Memory problems could be caused by Alzheimer's disease or other medical conditions. Some memory problems can be readily treated, such as those caused by vitamin deficiencies or thyroid problems. Other memory problems might result from causes that are not currently reversible, such as Alzheimer's disease.

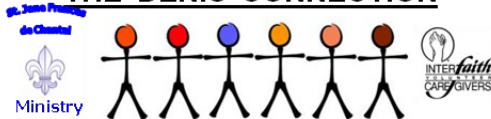


Sunday, April 22, 2018 WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

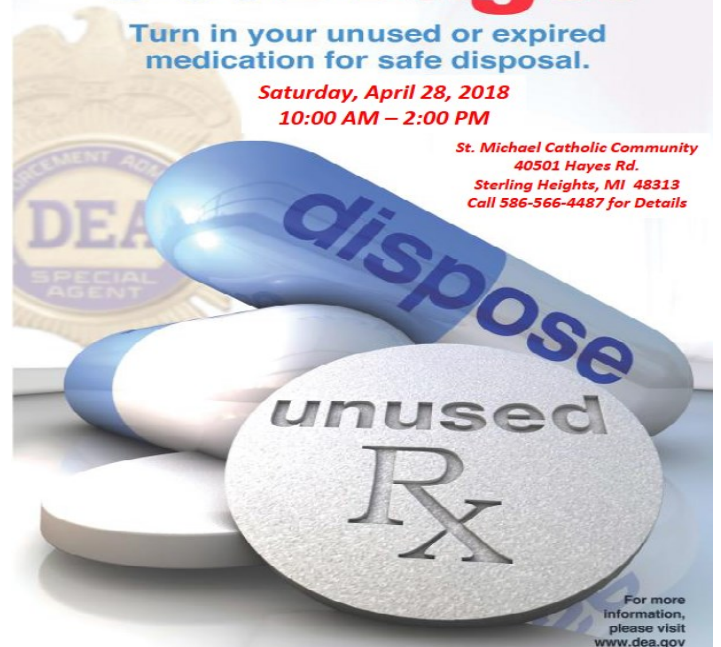

- ◆ How is the relationship between a shepherd and sheep like the relationship between Jesus and his Father?
- ◆ What makes a good leader? How are you like a good shepherd?

FAMILY PRAYER:

Teach us, Lord, to hear your voice and answer you.

QUESTION TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT WEEK.

IN PREPARATION FOR MASS:

- ◆ How are you "rooted" in your faith?
- ◆ Do you see any "fruit" in the practice of your faith? Are there things in your life that need to be "pruned" away to let in some light?
- ◆ What have you done, or what can you do, to nurture and care for your faith to help it bear good fruit?
- ◆ Is faith only about coming on Sunday?

My view of a shepherd was that of a rough and tumble character - someone who could handle themselves in a variety of situations. Rarely did I view the shepherd as a caring individual, but...

As I prepared the opening for our Faith Formation groups this week, I reflected on Jesus as the Good Shepherd, and my vision of a parent figure came to mind - an individual that *loves* and *cares* for those they are in charge of; someone who would go to great lengths to keep their "charges" safe, fed and well cared for; someone who loves those charges so much, that they will seek out the lost and go to extraordinary lengths to teach those individuals how to survive (pretty much) independently.

Sometimes "Tough Love" is necessary, as not all individuals accept kind lessons. I (personally) was, and still am, an experientialist. I need to have my hands in the mix, to succeed (and even fail) because of my "own" work. We will not always have someone around to care for us, to encourage us and even "gently" nudge us (with a kick in the rear end) to enter into situations that might make us uncomfortable. Years later (as an adult) as we look back, we can see that these nudges weren't done to cause us pain or embarrassment, but to help us grow!

God granted humankind free will. Humankind has taken the free will and twisted it to benefit "me" and "my cause". This is part of our "fallen" tendencies. "Fallen," because while we were created in the Image and Likeness of God, we decide to stray from that image - we stray from perfection. God in His great benevolence (well-being and kindness to our "autonomy" over ourselves) allows us to make mistakes. He lets us fall, to (hopefully) learn our lessons. Me, I have got to fall a few times, stub a toe, and bleed a little to learn. That's me, but I am growing in my understanding of how the world works, and that is how I learn best. Not everyone learns this way, so we need to be flexible.

Speaking of flexibility, can you imagine being a shepherd, in a field with the herds this past weekend? Sleet, ice, rain, snow, driving winds all buffeting us and those that we are trying to care for, out in the open, lucky to find a cave to hide in. The world just beating us over and over. We would *have* to remain flexible, ready to change, ready to move at a moments notice, ready to sleep huddled amongst the herd to help stay warm. Live in the imperfect conditions with our charges really experiencing *them*.

Jesus did that for you and me! Left the perfection of being (with God), to come and live amongst the imperfect in imperfectly imperfect conditions. To teach and lead, and still allow Himself to be falsely accused, to take a beating, and even suffer death for those imperfect beings, so that they have the opportunity to once again join the perfection of God.

Shepherd—still rough and tumble but soft and caring as well—truly GOOD!

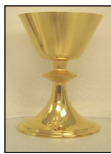
