JUST A NOTE

Often times I receive the question about music and its role in the Mass. More times than not, I am always asked about why Catholics don't zealously participate in the congregational singing at Mass. My response is: if Catholics only realized that the God who loves them is intently listening at every Sunday Mass. "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them." The angels and the saints are singing, and we have an opportunity to join in God's praises. Such a great opportunity is missed at most Sunday Masses. I'd like to offer some suggestions that might help encourage you in full, conscious, and active worship at Mass.

What can you do to start making a difference? Change your own focus. Realize the music is about God, not about us. Here are seven suggestions for entering more fully into Mass:


- Start singing. If God has given you a great voice, praise Him with it. If He has given you a poor voice, plague Him with it.
- When you enter a church and kneel to pray, picture the God who loves you. Use your imagination to see beyond the walls and ceiling. Ask your guardian angel to help you praise God well.
- Speak often of the truth about Mass: Where we are, what we are doing.
- Pray for your musicians.
- Look for better music and encourage better music.
- Learn the songs well enough that you can sing them with your eyes closed. After all, you're not singing to your neighbor.
- Consider joining the choir.

HEALTH MINISTRY MEMORY SCREENING

Saturday, May 5, 2018 AT ST. JANE FRANCES DE CHANTAL 1:30 – 4:30pm BY APPOINTMENT ONLY CALL 586-977-8080 - OR STOP IN THE CHURCH OFFICE

This screening is affiliated with Alzheimer's Foundation of America.

A memory screening is a simple and safe evaluation tool that checks memory and other thinking skills. It can indicate whether an additional check up by a qualified healthcare professional is needed. The face-to-face screening takes place in private and will be done by a parish nurse. It consists of a series of questions and/or tasks designed to test memory, language skills, thinking ability, and other intellectual functions. Results of the memory screenings are confidential. A memory screening is not used to diagnose any particular illness and does not replace consultation with a qualified physician or other healthcare professional.

These questions might help you decide if you should be screened. If you answer "yes" to any of them, you might benefit from a memory screening.

- Am I becoming more forgetful?
- Do I have trouble concentrating?
- Do I have difficulty performing familiar tasks?
- ◆ Do I have trouble recalling words or names in conversation?
- Do I sometimes forget where I am or where I am going?
- Have family or friends told me that I am repeating questions or saying the same thing over and over again?
- Am I misplacing things more often?
- Have I become lost when walking or driving?
- Have my family or friends noticed changes in my mood, behavior, personality, or desire to do things?

If a memory screening indicates possible problems, the person should follow up with a doctor or another qualified healthcare professional as soon as possible for a complete medical evaluation.

Follow-up is important to identify the cause of the memory problems. Memory problems could be caused by Alzheimer's disease or other medical conditions. Some memory problems can be readily treated, such as those caused by vitamin deficiencies or thyroid problems. Other memory problems might result from causes that are not currently reversible, such as Alzheimer's disease.

> I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing.

> > John 15:5

Each of us, no matter how insignificant we might feel, come from the same place, the same Creator, the same brotherhood. Man has made differences "matter". Man has said that one person is "greater" than another. Man has chosen to accentuate (and continues to do it to this day) and hold these differences high overhead. Jesus lets us know that each one of us is but a branch. Each of us can and does bear fruit, so long as we remember Him that we come from.

If we are ALL branches, we are ALL more similar than we are different. We are made up of the same "stuff". Some are smaller than others, some a little rougher around the edges, but none of this tells us what kind of fruit we will bear. Each of us as a branch have little "offshoots" of branches, just like the things that we add to our lives. Those offshoots might be my bowling team that I am a part of, the school that I go to, my job, the places that I like to hang out with my friends at. The main shoot of the branch is our family, and inside, under the bark, feeding it all (just below the surface) is the nourishment and the structure of our lives, our Faith.

When our faith is compromised, our family will lose shape. If we allow our family to get pulled away from us, we run the risk of weakening our nourishment layer. If we have too many "offshoots" (things that take up many little parts of our lives) all of our energy goes to all of the "little" things, and not enough nourishment and energy is used in the production of good fruit in our lives. That's when a few of those offshoots need to be pruned away.

We live a balancing act. It's never perfect, but we constantly need to keep trying to balance everything in life, keeping God at the core, family surrounding and nourishing that life, and those little offshoot branches under control so that the fruit of our lives will be given the chance to show off it's color, flavor and help the next person who will use that fruit to nourish their lives and grow.

In the second reading, Saul pruned the unneeded stuff from his life, and began to be around good people. He then became one of the most prolific writers of the Bible! Thank you Saul (now known as the Apostle Paul) for sharing your fruit!




