FR. T'S TIDBITS: CHRIST IS ALIVE

In response to the October 2018 Synod on Young Vivit). (As an aside, on the pilgrimage I led to Italy last October, our group had the opportunity to attend the opening Mass for the Synod for young people with Pope Francis in St. Peter's square.) The document is reader friendly and written as a letter to a specific group of people—

namely young people.

found it to be a wonderful document that encourages young people to actively renew the Church. The document defines the age of young people as between the ages of 16-29. We often hear that young people are the future of the Church. In the document, Pope Francis, reminds and challenges young people by stating that they are the "now of God."

In paragraph 64 of Christ is Alive, Pope Francis explains the meaning of "the now of God." He says, "we cannot just say that young people are the future of the world. They are its present, even now; they are helping to enrich it. Young people are no longer children. They are at a time of life when they begin to assume a number of responsibilities, sharing alongside adults in the growth of the family, society and the church. Yet the times are

changing, leading us to ask— what are today's young people really like? What is going on in their lives?"

People, Pope Francis issued an apostolic Throughout the document, the Pope encourages young people to exhortation titled, Christ is Alive*, (Christus share the talents and gifts that God has bestowed upon them to renew the church. This document is written and directed to young people. I would encourage young people to read this document and discern what your gifts and talents are and how they will enrich the church. The Pope ends with a wish— that "young people keep running the race, as the church needs your momentum, your enthusiasm, your intuition, your faith."

As we journey towards the Feast of Pentecost may we call down I had the opportunity to read the Pope's apostolic exhortation and the Holy Spirit to enlighten our hearts and minds in our response to the needs and life of the church. I recall the words of Cardinal John Dearden as he returned from Rome after attending the Second Vatican Council. He would often say, "the more difficult the task, the more the Spirit will be given."


Next Sunday, the Church throughout the world prays for vocations. Will you make a special effort to ask the Lord for more vocations to the priesthood & religious life?

Happy Easter. He is Risen! Truth can be a difficult thing to grasp. As a matter of fact, as hard as I try to put into words a "brief" explanation of truth, I run into limitations of space, paper, time and even my own understanding. I have started this weeks writing 4-5 different times and have had to put each of these aside, because brevity escapes me when I attempt to describe truth.

In our Gospel reading, the Apostles encounter Jesus again, along the shores of the Sea of Tiberius (the Sea of Galilee). From the accounts in the Bible, 7 of the Apostles (those who were sent on the mission to spread the Word of God to the world) had gone back to a comfort zone for themselves - the trade taught to them by their fathers. They went back to the water to fish. How many times do I get uncomfortable, doing the work that I do, and want to just go back to the "comfortable" thing—machines and tools. Building is an easily controlled environment for me. I start at "A", progress through B, C, D and E and end up with an "F"—a finished project. The voice of God, in our lives, calls each of us to more than our comfort zones.

Jesus plucked His disciples from their comfort zones, challenged them, led them for a while, then sent them into a strange new world. A world full of temptation, a world full of "status quo", a world that says, "It's Okay; you are Okay." But Jesus' teachings resonated in the minds of the Apostles. They began to understand what Jesus meant when they heard (in last Sunday's Gospel),

"Peace be with you.
As the Father has sent me, so I send you." John 20:21

Jesus moved them (and continues to move us) beyond being okay! We are called to be good. Good people, good Christians, good parents, good students, good workers... Good. We are not to be mediocre, lukewarm or just okay. We are to be good at what we do and share what we do with others. Very few of us will be "the best" really and truly, "the best" is a fleeting title that will disappear. It is a man made term to let us feel good about ourselves. Being good resonates, it resounds again and again. It is what makes us virtuous.

Our first reading this week, is about the blossoming Christian Community. The Apostles were brought before the Sanhedrin (the council of elders) and told to stop preaching in Jesus' name and they left,

"...rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name. " Acts 5:41b

Where are you? Are you comfortable? Have you stretched outside of your comfort zone? How can you stretch outside of your comfort zone at work, at home, at school, at the parish, in your faith? Can you continue the mission of the first apostles, spreading the Word of God to the noisy world, the world that wants and longs for distraction? How can you "be good" for the world full of so much that is not good?

This is part of the "truth" that Jesus was leading His disciples towards. The truth that God is, was and always will be. The truth that we are God's hands and feet in the world. Can you be a single ray of light for someone this week, to help them see God in all that is around? Can you be Truth for someone?




