FR. T'S TIDBITS: THE EASTER SEASON

As we draw near to the close of the Easter season I would like to share with you a prayer that is attributed to Blessed Oscar Arnulfo Romero, but pronounced for the first time by Cardinal John Dearden.

This prayer reminds us that God has a plan for each one of us and we are invited to participate in that plan. God is greater than we can ever imagine. As we bring to closure the Easter season let us be open to God's plan for us. It is not important that we understand His plan. What is important is that we surrender ourselves to His plan.

Fr. Tony Sulkowski Pastor Ext. 102 "Every now and then it helps us to take a step back and to see from a distance. The Kingdom is not only beyond our efforts, it is also beyond our vision.

In our lives, we manage only to achieve a small part of the marvelous plan that is God's work. Nothing that we do is

complete, which is to say that the Kingdom is greater than ourselves. No statement says everything that can be said. No prayer completely expresses the faith. No creed brings perfection. No pastoral visit solves every problem. No programs fully accomplish the mission of the Church. No goal or purpose ever reaches completion.

This is what it is about. We plant seeds that one day will grow. We water seeds already planted, knowing that others will watch over them. We lay the foundation of something that will develop. We add the yeast which will multiply the possibilities. We cannot do everything, yet it is liberating to begin. This gives us strength to do something and do it well. It may remain incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way. It is an opportunity for the grace of God to enter and to do the rest. It may be that we will never see its completion, but that is the difference between the master and the laborer.

We are laborers, not master builders; servants, not the Messiah. We are prophets of a future that does not belong to us."



A Simple Counting Prayer of the Ordinary

God is full of surprises. Every day in a thousand different ways, God can be found in the most unexpected yet ordinary places. Often times, we are so busy looking for God that we fail to see the Divine Presence in all that surrounds us.

Recently, I was having "one of those days" (for a couple days!) that everything seemed to be going wrong...the side mirror on my car needs to be replaced and keeps moving when I'm driving, the garage door wouldn't shut, wait hours for a repairmen who is there for less than 10 minutes, the microwave died, bought a new one and the cord is too short to reach the plug...But in each situation there was God....the mirror causes me to stop, get out of the car and experience the beauty, warmth and smells of the spring day (as I adjust the mirror); waiting for the repair man, I actually sat and relaxed for a few moments just being still, watching the birds in the backyard, the new microwave which was too heavy for me, allowed me to spend some time with my neighbor who helped me get it moved and remedied the plug situation. It was nice visiting and catching up on the family after a long winter. And the best was when my granddaughter "facetimed" (called) at bedtime and wanted to do nighttime prayers together because she was scared with the thunderstorm. Yes the Holy Spirit is everywhere, you just need to take the moments to find Him.

This prayer invites us to look at the ordinary and see the extraordinary right before our eyes. It is a prayer of consciousness. God enjoins us to "Be still and know that I am God." From the first glimmering light of dawn until blackness invades the night landscape, God is trying to get our attention to say "I love you."

Prayer: When you get up in the morning, count slowly from one to ten to remind yourself that today you are going to see the presence of God in at lest ten different things. Make a simple list numbered from 1 to 10. Throughout the day, stop for moments of awareness and jot down words or phrases about your observations. In the evening take a few minutes to review your list, and ask yourself, "How was God present to me today?" Reflect on only one item, on several items, or the whole list. Thank God for the gift of God's presence in the ordinary.

So, I am pondering the Feast of the Ascension, and how it relates to our ideas and thoughts of Church today. "Church" has changed a whole lot over the past 2000 (odd) years, from attending the synagogue on Saturdays and celebrating *agape* meals, through persecution of Christians which moved the Christian faithful underground, into eras of enlightenment, back into periods of darkness and abuses of "power", through the protestant reformation, a "cultural" Christianity, through even more schisms and separations to today.

Jesus lived. He loved us so much that He came and taught us, showed us truths, and gave us a prime example of how to live a good life. He suffered and died for us so that He could be raised from the dead by God the Father. He then spent a very short time (our Easter season) with His disciples again encouraging and moving them in ways that helped form the Church that has lasted for these 2000 plus years. To finally ascend to take His place with God the Almighty.

In the times of persecution, Christians literally put their lives on the line to go to Mass. Today we hear, "Oh, I'm busy today," or "I was too tired, so I prayed a prayer at home." Don't get me wrong, if you are sick, please stay at home to help other parishioners remain healthy, but don't use this as an excuse. I have watched countless parishioners with cancer and other physically debilitating issues, still make it in, to pray in community, and to thank God for the life He gives to us each and every day.

I do not like being preachy, but I truly wonder at times what direction the church is headed. Not the "Catholic Church", not "St. Jane Frances de Chantal Parish", but (as we explain to students in Faith Formation) the church of, "…where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." (Mt. 18:20) *This* church of the people of God, not the institution, or building, seems to be getting pushed aside, for the "god" of organized sports, the "god" of science, the "god" of making money.

Ecclesiastes 3 speaks of a time for everything (don't know this one? Look in the Bible, or hey listen to the song by the Byrds, Turn! Turn! Turn!, to get the gist). The Catholic Church has 52 Sundays and 6 extra days as Holy Days of Obligation.

Obligation:

an act or course of action to which a person is morally or legally bound; a duty or commitment.

A "possible" 58 hours out of 8,736 hours (24x364) in a year—that is less than 2/3 of one percent (0.664%) of "our" time to slow down, gather together and praise the God the made us. Sports, jobs, school, and other "obligations" require a heck of a lot more time than that, but somehow, Church seems to be, more often than not, the item cut from our schedule.

Hopefully, we can find that less than 2/3 of a percent, of our time, is worth the effort to give back in praise to the God who Created, then joined us, and suffered for us, just so that we may be allowed back with Him for eternity. Just a thought.


