From the Diocese of Boma/CMB: The Diocese of Boma is in the west part of the Democratic Republic of Congo. It has a population of about 1,193,000, of whom 69.9% are Catholics. The diocese has 315 native priests and 45 parishes of which 6 are under construction. Priests walk long distances to visit villages, spending weeks or 1 month celebrating Mass from one village to another in order to help children and those who have walking problems. In most villages, Masses take place outside because of the lack of churches.

Beside this, our Bishop Most Reverend Cyprien MBUKA is working on building new Parishes and new churches in order to reduce the distance between them for our priests and people. Though the priority is now to build new parishes, Bishop Cyprien is also fully involved in human development projects such as schools, hospitals (clinics), and wells to provide drinkable water.

Your prayers and generosity will bring relief to our priests and our people, but also contribute to a full development of our people. May the Lord bless each of you!

# JUST A NOTE ON PENTECOST

"Come Holy Ghost, Creator Blest," the text we sing today, is attributed to Edward Caswall, born in 1814, at Yately in Hampshire, where his father was a clergyman. In 1832, he went to Brasenose College, Oxford, and in 1836, took a second-class in classics. His humorous work, "The Art of Pluck," was published in 1835; it is still selling at Oxford, having passed through many editions. In 1838, he was ordained Deacon, and in 1839, Priest. He became perpetual Curate of Stratford-sub-Castle in 1840. In 1841, he resigned his incumbency and visited Ireland. In 1847, he joined the Church of Rome. In 1850, he was admitted into the Congregation of the Oratory

at Birmingham, where he has since remained. He has published several works in prose and poetry.



#### TIPS FOR A GOOD DONATION EXPERIENCE

#### **Before Donating:**

- ♦ Get a good nights sleep
- ♦ Have a good breakfast or lunch
- Drink extra water & fluids to replace the volume you will donate
- Eat iron rich foods—red meats, fish, poultry or liver, beans/legumes, iron fortified cereals, peas, spinach, apricots, raisins, prunes, whole grain breads
- Avoid fatty foods, such as hamburgers, fries or ice cream before donating. Tests for infections done on all donated blood can be affected by fatty materials lipids-that appear in your blood for several hours after eating fatty foods. When this occurs & required testing cannot be performed, the blood may need to be discarded.

#### **During Donation:**

- Wear clothing with sleeves that can be raised above the elbow
- Show the staff any "good veins" that have been used successfully in the past to draw blood
- ♦ Relax
- ◆ Take the time to enjoy a snack and a drink in the refreshments area immediately after donating.

#### After Donation:


- Re-hydrate by drinking plenty of fluids over the next 24-48 hours
- Avoid strenuous physical activity or heavy lifting for about 5 hours after donation

The Shroud of Turin has long been venerated by the faithful and is believed by many to be the burial cloth of Jesus of Nazareth. The Shroud is one of the most scientifically studied religious icons in history. The Center for the Study of the Passion of Christ and the Holy Shroud has developed a moving and informative exhibit on the Shroud of Turin, including a full-length photographic image of the Shroud. In addition, on display will be a large crucified corpus showing the wounds of Christ corresponding to the passion narrative in the Gospel accounts and the wounds shown on the Shroud. Holidays (Holy Days), are days that are "supposed to be" special to us. Days that we set aside as a day of rest, as a special day to be with family, and recognize the gifts that we have <u>already been</u> given. Nowadays, it seems like we often expect more gifts, especially on these days. Last week I mentioned that approximately 0.664% (less than 2/3's of a percent) of our year, we are asked to set aside to recognize, adore and worship God and the gifts that He has already given to us.

If we really set the whole Sabbath aside to be with family, for God, as He asked, that would be 14.3% of our year. (Approximately 52 Sundays divided by 364 days in a year—sleep time is lumped in for easy calculation). If we each got 7 hours of sleep each night (really?), this sleep equals about 29.1% of our time. So, that means that we spend (on average) twice as much time sleeping as we would purposely setting aside time to enjoy each others company in rest and recognition of God's wonder in the world. Don't get me wrong, I am just as guilty as anyone in this regard! Heck, I work almost every Sunday, but I really try to take an hour or so to spend time eating dinner with Mom, Dad and my Papa.

Pentecost, the Festival of Weeks, the second "feast" or "festival" of the Lord mentioned in *both* Leviticus (Chpt. 23) and Deuteronomy (Chpt. 16) when our Hebrew ancestors celebrated, and gave of, their harvest; from the harvest's "first fruits" to the end of harvest time (approximately 50 days later) when the growth cycle of the grains (of the time) would often be done. A constant giving of thanks for the gifts of God. As we have moved away from an "agricultural society" I know that I "know" very little (in retrospect) of the cycle of sowing and reaping, tending and nurturing of entire crops. Knowing when, and when not to, fertilize, water well, water little, prune back, and care for the harvested crops that will sustain us through the cold dark months of little growth (wintertime in our area).

Christ died on the Cross on Good Friday, ushering in the *need* for the Church. Our example of how to live, and our greatest intercessor was gone, humanity needed to pass on His teachings—the true birthday of the Church (Good Friday) - our "First Fruits" of the faith. Fifty days later, as the (Jewish) Apostles, of the Christ, gathered to celebrate their Festival of Weeks, after experiencing loss, but gaining more faith than ever in being with the Resurrected Jesus, and then "losing" Him again when He ascended to Heaven, God gave *them* the final (and everlasting) gift of Himself through the Holy Spirit, so that the actual harvest of souls, of lives for God, could begin.

Do we give praise and honor to God in the world, or do we enter into the world's practice of spreading rumor and gossip? Do we thank God for the gifts given to us, or do we spend more time asking for more and not recognizing what we already have? Do we use the Spirit, given to us at Baptism, to spread the seeds of the Good News, or do we begin to "expect" others to do things for us? Join us in celebrating Pentecost this year, by diving deeper into faith, and challenging one another to live more like the example given to us by Jesus the Christ!

This Sunday's Gospel reminds us that we are ot alone. "The

Advocate" was sent by God,

to us, to help us. Jesus breathed the Spirit unto His disciples, and we receive the Spirit through Baptism.

- ♦ How have you seen the Spirit (the Holy Spirit) work in your life?
