Corpus Christi Mass



WHO CAN YOU SAVE WITH CPR?

The life you save with CPR is most likely to be a loved one. Four of five cardiac arrests happen at home. Statistically speaking, if called on to administer CPR in an emergency, the life you save is likely to be someone at home: a child, a spouse, a parent or friend.

In September, it will have been two years that I was asked to be the Faith Formation Director. Fr. Jerry Slowinski stood in the doorway to the Youth Ministry Office, and asked if I had ever thought of doing the job before. My answer, "Have I thought of it before, yes. Did I want the position—NOPE!" I gave, what I thought was a good reason why I didn't want to take on the position, but as I "tried" to sleep that evening, I remembered "letting God know" that he needs to lay it out there for me, plain as day, with no little "hints", because I don't *get little hints*, I need requests to pinch me (hard, sometimes) to really get the idea.

After 4-5 hours of thinking, praying, denying, praying, saying NO, justifying my NO, asking God, "why me?", thinking about it some more and coming to the understanding that I made the right decision when I said NO, I got about an hour of sleep. Before long, I found myself with Fr. Jerry, asking him why he even asked me. Even with my shortcomings (An extreme dislike of public speaking, a knowledge that I always was a HORRIBLE student, and knowing that my planning skills require a bit a planning) I was asked if I would do this, and I found that my "good reason why not" to act on the request was really more of an excuse to let myself off. Heck, I even tried again this year, I asked Fr. Tony if he was planning on bringing in someone else to fill the position. He asked if I was planning to go somewhere. "Well, no, I'm not planning on going somewhere..." "Well, okay, that's settled then." he said.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, is a feast of a mystery that our minds cannot fully grasp. Three persons, of One God; One God, in three persons. The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, something that we are called to believe in, even when we cannot fully explain it; BUT something that can answer all of our questions, the way that we *need* those questions answered (even when we didn't know that we had the questions to begin with.)

Just like the mystery of the Trinity, I still find the asking of me to fill this position as Faith Formation Director, a real mystery! I make mistakes, as do we all. I stutter step, and I trip into a glorious faceplant, constantly, but God give us the strength and courage to move forward! As we move forward in "not-so Ordinary" Time in our Liturgical Year, pray for me, for our catechists, for our young disciples and for each other as we trip and fall through life. Lend a hand to your neighbor, a smile (they're free), a word of encouragement, and start an "ordinary" good habit. Challenge yourself, out of the "ordinary" things and into some EXTRA-ordinary things this summer.

Give yourself a "commission" to expand God's kingdom on Earth. Try something new to challenge and change the world...
