HAPPY FEAST OF THE MOST HOLY BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI)!

Here's a little history about today's feast day, from the Sourcebook for Sunday, Seasons, and Weekdays, Liturgy Training Publications:

"This Eucharistic day began in a quiet Belgian convent in the thirteenth century, with the vision of a holy nun, St. Juliana. In her vision, she saw the moon, full and bright. It was glorious, except that one part of its disk was in shadow. The meaning of the vision was then revealed to her: the moon represented the liturgical year and the shadow, a missing feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. Juliana spoke to her confessor about what she had seen. Amazingly, within thirty-five years, Pope Urban IV had established the feast of Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ, in the Church's universal calendar. Hundreds of years later, in 1849, Pope Pius IX added the Feast of the Precious Blood celebrated on July 1st. Following the Second Vatican Council, the two liturgies became one solemnity in honor of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Corpus Christi is an expression of our faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. This celebration is also outward looking, carrying the liturgy out of the church and into the streets. We come together in all our diversity and we celebrate our unity."

Here is a prayer for the week:



God of the covenant, we are grateful that you have called us to be your people, in deep connection with you and with one another. Our participation in the Eucharist confirms this calling and our commitment to live it daily. Help us to remember this each time we approach the eucharistic table. We ask this in the name of your Son, in whose body and blood we partake.

Amen.

Today's Feast Day is also a great time to recognize all those who serve as Eucharistic Ministers. By offering the Eucharist, you recognize the Body of Christ in those to whom you minister and, ultimately, you act as the Body of Christ by fully participating in the life of the parish and the wider community. We are grateful for your ministry. We are also always in need of additional people to serve in this ministry. Please contact me if you feel called to serve.

Come spend an hour with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament! 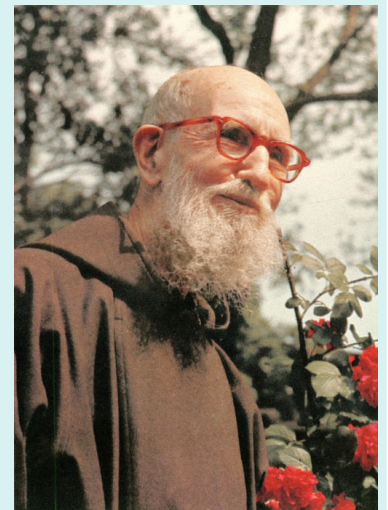

HEALTH MINISTRY

**Unused Prescription and OTC Medications
 Unused Wound Care Products Collection
 JUNE 10 - JUNE 23, 2018**

***Do you have unused medications or
 wound care dressings in your home??***

The Health Ministry at St. Jane will be collecting prescriptions and over the counter medications (OTC) as well as wound care products (dressings, tape, ace bandages, etc.) again. They will be taken to the *Soup Kitchen*, to the pharmacist there who assists with the needs of the less fortunate.

Please bring your unused medications and wound care products to the church office any time during the above dates.

Rules for medication drop off:

- ◆ Original prescription bottles with labels intact. We must be able to read the drug name, dosage, date, and pharmacy that dispensed the prescription. You can block out your name before bringing the bottles to church.
- ◆ Expired dates on labels are accepted. The pharmacist will determine if it is still usable.
- ◆ Unused over the counter (OTC) medicines are also accepted.
- ◆ NO LIQUIDS.
- ◆ NO NARCOTICS OR CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES
- ◆ Controlled substances are those with the potential for psychological or physical dependence. Examples include: narcotic painkillers such as Morphine, Vicodin, Oxycontin, Demerol, Tylenol III with codeine; anti-depressants, and ADHD drugs such as Ritalin.

Rules for wound care products drop off:

- ◆ Original packages, unopened if packaged as sterile.
- ◆ No liquids or ointments.

August 5th to August 12th, 2018

For those who are unfamiliar, MCREST stands for **Ma**comb **C**ounty **R**otating **E**mergency **S**helter **T**eam and was founded to provide temporary emergency shelter for homeless and displaced individuals. Their goal is to provide guests the opportunity for successful transition to independence.

MCREST has over 30 years of continuous service to Macomb County's homeless population and has grown to over 70 churches today.

St. Jane Frances, as a member congregation of MCREST, has offered our Parish as a place that will provide services to these guests that allow them to concentrate on making strides to be successful in this transition. We will provide a warm bed, three meals each day, shower facilities, laundry service, and transportation. Guests must agree to maintain sobriety, be drug free, and cause no threat to others.

To facilitate this activity we are organized into committees, each headed up by a coordinator. Their responsibility is to inform and work with the volunteers on the tasks needed to be performed.

In addition to volunteers, we will also need food, clothing, paper products, and miscellaneous items so that we can facilitate this program. We will have a display at a future date for these items.

ABOUT THE GOSPEL:

The Gospel this week , covers, once again, Jesus' Passover Meal with His disciples. We see again that Jesus is The Passover Lamb, so that we may be allowed to enter *Eternal* life with God (Jesus and the Holy Spirit).

IN CHURCH:

This week we celebrated the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Have you been to the meal of Thanksgiving (Eucharist)? Before (or after Mass) sit in contemplation of Jesus, with us through time, present in the Eucharist.

QUESTIONS FOR THE WEEK:

- ◆ How has our communal, Eucharistic Meal affected you, as an individual this past week? If it hasn't, how can you use this tool of grace for the world?
- ◆ When was the last time you spent in adoration of the Most Holy Body and Blood? Practice the art of adoration. Stop by the parish for 5 minutes and spend the time in silence at the Tabernacle, with Jesus.

FAMILY PRAYER:

Lord Jesus, may we come to better understand the gift of Your most Precious Body and Blood that you have given to us, and may we gain strength through the week because of it!

QUESTION TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT WEEK, IN PREPARATION FOR MASS:

- ◆ What is your understanding of Original Sin? In what Sacrament, do we enter the Church, receive the Holy Spirit and begin our journey with God?
- ◆ Who is your brother, sister, mother? Can they be more than "just" your biological parent or sibling?

I have always struggled with prayer! I feel that there is something that I am supposed to "do", and that I never know what to say. I had a friend (earlier this year) tell me about his experience during Adoration, and I was just a little jealous that I didn't "get" an experience like his. Now as I think of it (months later) I remember to re-read 1 Corinthians 12 (chapter 12), and think that just maybe I am not called to hear or feel any certain emotion or "answer" in prayer. I (just like each and every one of us) am called to simply **pray**.

Minds fixed on God, our daily "task list" flutters in and begins to take over our conscious thought... Push it away and let God be. I have to pick up milk and eggs and... Push it away and let God Be. I have to get out to watch my nephew play... push it away and let God BE. This is how my prayer goes. When my mind continues to "interrupt" it's time to break out a repetitive mantra, or even a rosary to help my mind focus on a rhythm, and let God be, right there, in the rhythm.

God is with us always! Good times, bad times, easy days, hard days, when I'm feeling up (and tend to ignore God because "I'm" doing good) and when I'm down (and suddenly "remember" God and ask for help). He is (as the poem Footprints in the Sand reminds us) always with us, often walking side by side, many times carrying us, but always with us. Our next opportunity to experience Jesus in "organized" Adoration is on June 12th from Noon until 6:00pm

Give it a shot! Stop by for 5 minutes after work or school, stop by when you are out picking up groceries (beforehand so that your perishables don't spoil), or even as you are on your way to a sports practice. Spend a half hour (don't think you have that much time?) or even 5 minutes in the Chapel, contemplating God, realizing the gift of Jesus' sacrifice for us, saying a prayer for someone who NEEDS or prayers, or even a request for help for yourself. Do not be discouraged if immediate signs aren't apparent or if you didn't "hear" what you wanted to hear. Just be present with God.

Just as we tell younger children, "Practice makes perfect", and the more we simply "be" with God, the easier it gets, the less stressful the experience can be, and the stress in our lives can really and truly be offered to God, who is always there for us. Allow him the chance to carry you for a bit. I hope to see you at Adoration, at Mass, at MCREST, at the Parish Picnic, at one of the MANY events that volunteers from the community put on, just for each one of us!

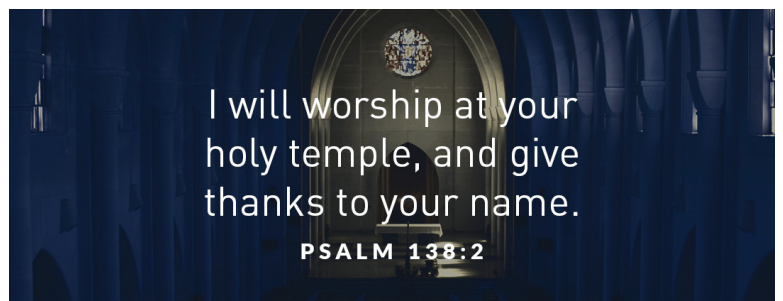

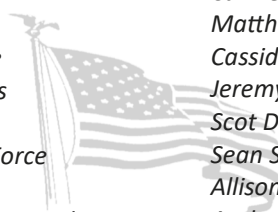
