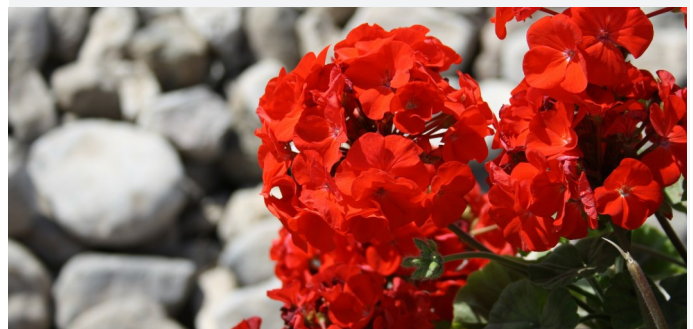
Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. Many of you may remember when it was celebrated on the Thursday before the Seventh Sunday of Easter. In our diocese (and many others) this solemnity is transferred to the seventh Sunday after Easter.

Here is a little background on today's celebration from the 2019 Sourcebook for Sundays, Seasons, and Weekdays:

"The distinct celebration of the Ascension of the Lord was unknown in the first three and a half centuries. The chronology of dating the Ascension to forty days after Easter exists only in the Acts of the Apostles. The original ending to Mark's account of the Gospel did not include the Ascension at all, and it can only be inferred from Matthew's conclusion. In his Gospel, Luke situates the Ascension on Easter evening, shortly after he appeared to the disciples and shared a meal with them. He interprets the Scriptures for them, showing that his Death and Resurrection have fulfilled them. He commissions them, but instructs them to wait until they receive the "power from high," that is his Holy Spirit. His final act toward them is blessing; theirs to him, adoration."

In the church calendar, we celebrate the "power from high", the Holy Spirit, on the feast of Pentecost, the week following Ascension of the Lord. Pentecost is the great feast that concludes the Easter Season, June 8th and 9th this year.

The liturgical color of Pentecost is RED, representing the tongues of fire that descended upon the Apostles and also representing the blood of the martyrs. In keeping with the spirit of Pentecost, on the weekend of June 8th and 9th, **PLEASE WEAR RED** and bring pots of **RED geraniums** to Mass to decorate the sanctuary. The Eden Club will then plant the flowers around the grounds of the church. Lord, send out your Spirit and renew the face of the earth!

HEALTH MINISTRY

**Unused Prescription and OTC Medications
Unused Wound Care Products Collection
JUNE 2 through JUNE 15, 2019**

Do you have unused medications or wound care dressings in your home??

The Health Ministry at St. Jane will be collecting prescriptions and over the counter medications (OTC) as well as wound care products (dressings, tape, ace bandages, etc.) again. They will be taken to the *Soup Kitchen*, to the pharmacist there who assists with the needs of the less fortunate.

Please bring your unused medications and wound care products to the church office any time during the above dates.

RULES FOR MEDICATION DROP OFF:

- Original prescription bottles with labels intact. We must be able to read the drug name, dosage, date, and pharmacy that dispensed the prescription. You can block out your name before bringing the bottles to church.
- Expired dates on labels are accepted. The pharmacist will determine if it is still usable.
- Unused over the counter (OTC) medicines are also accepted.
- NO LIQUIDS.
- NO NARCOTICS OR CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES
- Controlled substances are those with the potential for psychological or physical dependence. Examples include: narcotic painkillers such as Morphine, Vicodin, Oxycontin, Demerol, Tylenol III with codeine; anti-depressants, and ADHD drugs such as Ritalin.

RULES FOR WOUND CARE PRODUCTS DROP OFF:

- Original packages, unopened if packaged as sterile.
- No liquids or ointments.

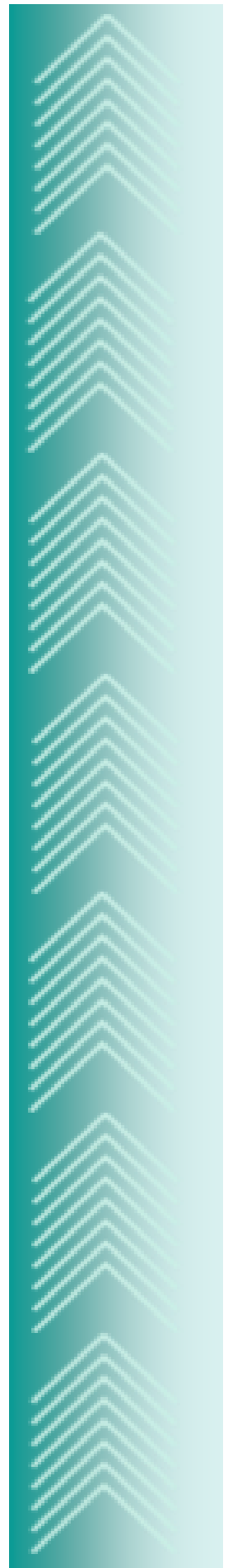
