### 40th Anniversary of our First Mass

In June of 1977, the first Mass for our parish was celebrated at Flynn Junior High with 84 families attending. We have since grown into two other worship spaces. The first was where the Fr. Page Activity Center and upstairs meeting rooms are now. Below is a letter from Fr. Page back in 1988 that speaks of the vision for our parish and a picture from the first Mass!

#### St. Jane Frances de Chantal Community History 1978 – 1988

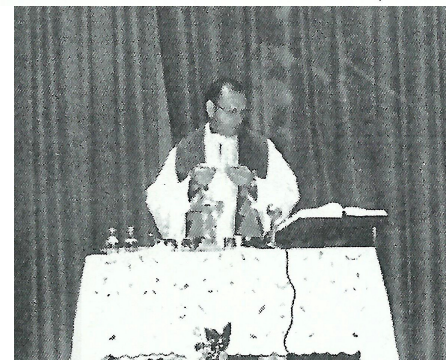
I, Fr. Page, came to this parish with a particular vision of what I would like to see happen in a community. The vision was no different than the vision of Pope John when He decided to open the doors and windows of the church. I wanted to create that same feeling of openness and honesty in the community I was about to serve.

One of the important concepts that came from the documents of the Second Vatican Council was on the Church. The Church was no longer considered to be the building that accommodated the parishioners when they came to hear the word of God. The Church was "The People of God". The parishioners themselves, that is what made up the Church. With that concept in mind, I decided to establish a parish that would truly demonstrate that idea. I believed that the people were of the most importance, not the building itself. I wanted to see the community grow patterned after the early Christian Communities where the love of God and love of one another was the force that bound them together. This is exactly what Christ taught and expected of his followers. I was convinced that this could be accomplished in our day no matter how large our parish became. Maybe this could be better described as a dream, but I had to try.

I was convinced too that the pastor set the tone of the parish and that each member of the parish was an extension of his attitude and the atmosphere he establishes. The tone I set out to bring into reality was that of Christ and His message of mutual Christian love. This builds community; this builds church.

I came to serve you as individuals and families, to administer the sacraments, and when required, reconcile individuals with Christ and his church.

In the final analysis, you are the church, you are the one's who will show that this community is open, caring, loving and friendly toward any new members coming into this area. They look to me, I look to you, Christ looks to us to carry out His message.

The life you save with CPR is most likely to be a loved one. Four of five cardiac arrests happen at home. Statistically speaking, if called on to administer CPR in an emergency, the life you save is likely to be someone at home: a child, a spouse, a parent or friend.

**Unused Prescriptions and OTC Medications  
Unused Wound Care Products Collection  
June 4-17, 2017**

**Do you have unused medications or wound care dressings in your name?**

The Health Ministry of St. Jane Frances will be collecting prescriptions and over the counter medications (OTC) as well as wound care products (dressings, tape, ace bandages, etc.) again. They will be taken to the *Soup Kitchen to the pharmacist there who assists with the needs of the less fortunate.*

Please bring your unused medications and wound care products to the church office any time during the above dates.

**Rules for medication drop off:**

1. Original prescription bottles with labels intact. We must be able to read the drug name, dosage, date, and pharmacy that dispensed the prescription. **Please block out your name** before bringing the bottles to church.
2. Expired dates on labels are accepted. The pharmacist will determine if it is still usable.
3. Unused over the counter (OTC) medicines are also accepted.
4. NO LIQUIDS
5. NO NARCOTICS OR CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES  
Controlled substances are those with the potential for psychological or physical dependence. Examples include: narcotic painkillers such as Morphine, Vicodin, Oxycontin, Demerol, Tylenol III with codeine; anti-depressants, and ADHD drugs such as Ritalin.

**Rules for wound care products drop off:**

1. Original packages, unopened if packaged as sterile.
2. No liquids or ointments.
