



3. to the faithful who, due to their age, disease or other serious reason, are impeded of moving, if repentant of all their sins and having the firm intention of performing as soon as possible, the three conditions mentioned below, in front of a small image of Our Lady of Fatima, spiritually unite in the days of the apparitions to the Jubilee celebrations, offering with trust to God all-merciful through Mary their prayers and pains, or the sacrifices of their own lives.


To obtain the plenary indulgence, truly penitent and animated with charity must fulfill the following three conditions:

Our speaker/retreat director, Deacon Keith Strohm, promises to be interesting, engaging, and good humored, as he will lead us towards our goal of "Empowering Discipleship".

CHECK OUT THE NEW COAT OF ARMS!

Last weekend, the Archdiocese of Detroit released a new coat of arms. "Today's design reflects our Catholic identity in southeastern Michigan: a God-given identity that is now uniquely and completely ours as the Archdiocese of Detroit. Through symbols, color and font choices, the Coat of Arms portrays our stories." There are 5 major themes/symbols to check out in the crest. For more information on the crest, its symbols, and the Pastoral Letter from Archbishop Vigneron, please visit: aod.org

The Crest and Miter: The shield denotes the crest of Jesuit missionary priest and martyr St. Isaac Jogues. Our Archdiocese was founded by missionaries and God continues to call us to become missionaries of Christ. The crest is adorned with a miter, the headdress of a bishop and representing the jurisdiction of the Archdiocese of Detroit as a diocese established by the Pope and given to the care of our Archbishop.

The Cross and Stars: The three stars in the shield represent the three persons of the one God -- Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The miter atop the shield is marked with a cross representing Christ's redemptive sacrifice.

Saint Anne: Saint Anne embraces her daughter, the young Blessed Virgin Mary, who is being taught the Jewish faith and anticipation of the Messiah. This symbol affirms the importance of Sacred Scripture as well as the primary role parents play as their children's faith educators. St. Anne is also the patroness of the Archdiocese of Detroit.

The Door: An open door represents our mandate to go out to share and proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ. Affectionately known as "God's Doorkeeper," venerable and soon-to-be Blessed Father Solanus Casey (1870-1957), is Detroit's most recognizable model of hospitality, welcoming those in need, which he did for many years as a porter at St. Bonaventure Monastery in Detroit. The door in the crest is adorned with a cross. Our missionary journey is made by Way of the Cross.

The Great Lakes: The Archdiocese of Detroit spans six counties in Michigan, nestled among the Great Lakes. Like the movement of the Detroit and St. Clair Rivers, the Gospel is powerful and ever-flowing, conquering obstructions in its path. Importantly, our entrance into the Christian faith is through the cleansing water of baptism

August 6th to August 13th, 2017

For those who are unfamiliar, MCREST stands for Macomb County Rotating Emergency Shelter Team and was founded to provide temporary emergency shelter for homeless men, women and children who are drug and alcohol free in Macomb County. Their goal is to provide guests the opportunity for successful transition to independence.

MCREST has over 25 years of continuous service to Macomb County's homeless population and has grown to over 90 churches today.

St. Jane Frances, as a member congregation of MCREST, has offered our Parish as a place that will provide services for up to 30 guests that allow them to concentrate on making strides to be successful in this transition. We will provide a warm bed, three hearty meals each day, shower facilities, laundry service, and transportation. Guests must agree to maintain sobriety, be drug free, and cause no threat to others.

To facilitate this activity we are organized into sub-committees, each headed up by a coordinator. Their responsibility is to inform and work with the volunteers on the tasks needed to be performed.

In addition to volunteers, we will also be in need of food, clothing, paper products, and miscellaneous items so that we can facilitate this program. We will have a display at a future date for these items.


