From the Diocese of Boma/CMB: The Diocese of Boma is in the west part of the Democratic Republic of the Congo. It has a population of about 1,193,000, of whom 69.9% are Catholics. The diocese has 315 native priests and 45 parishes of which 6 are under construction. Priests walk long distances to visit villages, spending weeks or 1 month celebrating Mass from one village to another in order to help children and those who have walking problems. In most villages, Masses take place outside because of the lack of churches.

Beside this, our Bishop Most Reverend Cyprien MBUKA is working on building new Parishes and new churches in order to reduce the distance between them for our priests and people. Though the priority is now to build new parishes, Bishop Cyprien is also fully involved in human development projects such as schools, hospitals (clinics), and wells to provide drinkable water.

Your prayers and generosity will bring relief to our priests and our people, but also contribute to a full development of our people. May the Lord bless each of you!

My father and I had a garden in the backyard when I was young. He taught me to prepare the soil, choose vegetable seeds that would have a chance of growing in our climate, arrange the planting so there was room for everything, plant the seeds and then tend the garden so it would bear fruit. I remember the absolute joy in seeing tomatoes, cucumbers (LOTS of cucumbers) and green beans ready for picking and eating. I also remember wondering why the lettuce and carrots were not as fruitful (lots of rabbits in Harrison Township). I remember weeding and maintaining that garden, the amount of work that went into the entire enterprise. But mostly I remember learning that the end result wasn't truly in my control.

Today's Gospel may seem to lead us to believe we can just scatter seed on the land and, voila!, the land will yield fruit. I think the lesson here is not that we should sit back and do nothing, but that the end result isn't in our control...it is God who prepares us, guides us and leads us to Him. Though we cannot see the end result, the future, we continue to plant our seeds, make our plans, and move forward toward the harvest.

Here at St. Jane's we have some exciting opportunities to look forward to!

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA) RETURNING TO ST. JANE IN SEPTEMBER 2018!

Father's Day TIPS because we LOVE YOU!

You've probably heard this over and over but NEVER STOP TRYING TO IMPROVE! Gentle reminders about 6 (+1) ways you can refocus on your health, courtesy of the CDC:

- Get Enough Sleep— Aim for seven to nine hours per night.
- Stop Smoking—if you quit now, you'll lower your risk for cancer, COPD, and other smoking-related illnesses.
- Exercise More—Try to fit in 2 ½ hours of aerobic activity, plus muscle-strengthening exercises, each week.
- Eat Healthy—Your diet should include a variety of fruits and vegetables daily.
- Reduce Stress—You'll feel much more relaxed if you avoid drugs and alcohol, connect socially, and find support.
- Get Regular Checkups—You need to know your blood pressure and cholesterol numbers, because if they're elevated, your risk for heart disease and stroke goes up. You also need screening for colorectal and prostate cancer: Positive outcomes are more likely with early detection.

Build your relationship with The Lord daily.—Prayer, devotions, regular attendance of church and fellowship with immediate and faith family.

Our MCREST Program has formed committees headed up by coordinators whose responsibility will be to work with and inform approximately 175 volunteers of tasks needed. The committees are:

- Children's Activities
- ♦ Clothes' Closet
- ♦ Evening/Security Monitors
- Greeters
- Guest Registration
- ♦ Inventory Packing
- Laundry
- Morning Monitors
- Overnight Monitors
- Personal Valuables/Donations
- Set Up and Take Down
- ◆ Telephone
- Transportation

ABOUT THE GOSPEL:

The Gospel this week, speaks of our faith being like a mustard



seed. It begins in a small way, but when taken care of grows to be very large.

IN CHURCH:

Look around the church before (or after) Mass. Look for "little" things that you might normally overlook. How do these "little" things play a part in the Liturgy that we celebrate. Do they play a part in Mass? Look for similar items next time you visit another Catholic Parish.

OUESTIONS FOR THE WEEK:

- How did your faith begin? Did you learn from a parent, a grandparent, maybe a neighbor. Have you nurtured your faith, taking care to keep it watered and fed, or has it gotten a little dry?
- ♦ What can you do to re-energize your faith? This week, read scripture (intentionally) a little more that you "normally" would. Listen to a Christian radio station. Spend 5 extra minutes in prayer each day. Talk with someone about your experience, or journal about it to help you see what happens.

FAMILY PRAYER:

Lord, let our Faith be like the mustard seed. Help us to start small, and witness great growth in our lives.

QUESTION TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT WEEK. IN PREPARATION FOR MASS:

- ♦ Do you know who John the Baptist is?
- Why is John special to Jesus? What did John do for Jesus?

Last week's first reading told us again of the Fall of Man(kind), and we know that because of mankind's insistence on entering into a sinful nature (a nature that we **know** God does not want us to enter), we have chosen to suffer a temporal and sometimes painful life. Sometimes it is our choice that leads us onto this path, but many times we can trace the cause (of our effect) to another person's choice (and sometimes vice versa). Is this "fair?" Maybe, maybe not, but the fact remains, that this is our reality, and we must decide what to do with it. Will we let the circumstances weigh us down and burden us to the point that we will crumple under it's weight, or will we use it to advance our strength and fortitude for the obstacles that are yet to come?

This week we hear in the first reading the *end* of a story from the prophet Ezekiel. The story, at the beginning of the 17th Chapter, tells the people of a natural event that many had probably witnessed and had seen come to pass, an eagle taking a branch, dropping it in fertile soil and the branch taking root to become a tree again. Then the story correlates the eagle to an enemy king, conquering the people of Israel and taking them to a different land. Finally, the part that we heard at Mass, tells us that God *is* the Eagle, *is* a King, that will take us from what we might know, plant us in fertile soil and tend to our growth. However, it also explains that not only does God raise up, but He also brings low things that are raised up, explaining that He alone is the One True God.

We heard the Gospel speak of "faith like a mustard seed" growing from the tiniest of things to an unbelievable size and we also heard Paul in his 2nd Letter to the Corinthians speak of courageousness. That Courageousness that he speaks of, **is** the courageousness of Faith. Believing *without* seeing, and acting accordingly towards the good of Man(kind). We are each called (in faith) to serve one another, to support each other, and continue our own growth, so that we may pass it on to the next generation (or even to our neighbors who might have yet to believe). A lofty goal, that many of us (myself at the absolute TOP of the list) do not feel worthy or even prepared for, but find ourselves at that point where God has decided to give us that little kick in the rear that we might have needed.

We all contribute to the salvation of our neighbor, not in direct action as Jesus Christ did (once for all time), but by sharing the gift that Jesus gave to humanity, in the best way that each of us may know. For some, it may be a hug; for others, lending an ear to hear; some may have an understanding of philosophy and theology. Each of us shares differently, but we are ALL called to share.

Here at St. Jane Frances (and in the Archdiocese of Detroit and beyond) we have a fantastic group called the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. (Google him and see what you learn.) Our chapter helps people in our area who are in need in a variety of ways—with food, support, and directing them to proper social service organizations where they can get more support for the specific situation that they are going through. This group of individuals can ALWAYS use help. When each person pitches in (even in a small way) it spreads the work out and makes the amount of work easier to manage. This is the same for everything that we do here. Helping someone by moving a box may not seem like a lot, until you've been injured and cannot move that box, or reach a high (or low) shelf. By doing "little" things, we become mustard seeds of Faith of others. Be a mustard seed...



On Monday, June 25th, we begin our yearly Vacation Bible School. As our volunteers prepare and get ready for our students and guests to learn more about our Savior, we ask you to pray, this week, for those who will lead our students as station leaders and helpers. Pray that God be on their minds to stretch and share His message with our young Catholics and friends.

NEXT WEEK, we can pray for those attending, that they may learn and grow, as they take hold of their Faith and spread it to their community and beyond.
