HAPPY FEAST OF THE MOST HOLY BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI)!

Here's a little history about today's feast day, from the Sourcebook for Sunday, Seasons, and Weekdays, Liturgy Training Publications:

"This Eucharistic day began in a quiet Belgian convent in the thirteenth century, with the vision of a holy nun, St. Juliana. In her vision, she saw the moon, full and bright. It was glorious, except that one part of its disk was in shadow. The meaning of the vision was then revealed to her: the moon represented the liturgical year and the shadow, a missing feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. Juliana spoke to her confessor about what she had seen. Amazingly, within thirty-five years, Pope Urban IV had established the feast of Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ, in the Church's universal calendar. Hundreds of years later, in 1849, Pope Pius IX added the Feast of the Precious Blood celebrated on July 1st. Following the Second Vatican Council, the two liturgies became one solemnity in honor of the Most Holy Body and Blood of

Christ. Corpus Christi is an expression of our faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. This celebration is also outward looking, carrying the liturgy out of the church and into the streets. We come together in all our diversity and we celebrate our unity."

Here is a prayer for the week:



God of the covenant, we are grateful that you have called us to be your people, in deep connection with you and with one another. Our participation in the Eucharist confirms this calling and our commitment to live it daily. Help us to remember this each time we approach the eucharistic table. We ask this in the name of your Son, in whose body and blood we partake.

Amen.

Today's Feast Day is also a great time to recognize all those who serve as Eucharistic Ministers. By offering the Eucharist, you recognize the Body of Christ in those to whom you minister and, ultimately, you act as the Body of Christ by fully participating in the life of the parish and the wider community. We are grateful for your ministry. We are also always in need of additional people to serve in this ministry. Please contact me if you feel called to serve.
