FR. T'S TIDBITS: UNLEASH THE GOSPEL

The Archdiocese of Detroit celebrates the one year anniversary of the promulgation of Archbishop Allen Vigneron's pastoral letter entitled Unleash the Gospel. It is a wonderful document that encourages and challenges the people of God within the Archdiocese of Detroit to live out their baptismal call to proclaim the Gospel in their daily life.

I will admit that I struggled to understand what it means to "unleash the Gospel." After reading and rereading the pastoral letter it dawned on me that each of us have to come to our own understanding of what it means to unleash the Gospel.

I was speaking with a priest friend of mine at the board meeting that I attended a few weeks ago. He had just received a new assignment in his diocese which will involve uniting four parishes into one. He said that he sees his new ministry

as shepherding the people of God to a new reality. For me that is the definition for unleashing the Gospel. To shepherd the people of God to a new reality. Living in the present and proclaiming the Gospel within the present situation.

Evangelization is not a new concept in the Catholic Church. It has been happening since the days of Jesus. However, throughout the centuries of the church *how* it is done has changed. One only needs to read a history of the Catholic Church to see that evangelization has changed the face of the church. For example, take the Second Vatican Council that began in 1963. Vatican II was about how the Catholic Church saw herself in the modern world.

An example closer to home is at my former parish, St. Basil the Great, The parish school closed in 1970. It was decided to lease out the school building to generate income. Wayne State University leased the building as a satellite campus for many years. Later D.D.I. leased the building as a training center. The building was being used for what it was intended for thus a new reality and a new life.

As we embark upon the blessings and challenges of unleashing the Gospel may we do so with a spirit of gratitude and with apostolic boldness knowing that we are doing God's work and not our own! We are a part of God's great plan and in faith we must trust in the plan God has for each of us. And sometimes, that plan might not look like the plan we have for ourselves.

We take a short break from Sundays in Ordinary Time this weekend for a solemnity that is celebrated on June 24th every year, regardless of the day of the week: The Nativity of Saint John the Baptist. Traditionally, a saint's day is celebrated on the anniversary of their death, since that day marks the day of their entrance into heaven. But we also celebrate John the Baptist on the day of his birth. Perhaps because before John was born, he was chosen by God to prepare the world for Jesus, the Son of God.

In Luke's Gospel we hear that John the Baptist was filled with the Holy Spirit in his mother's womb (Luke 1:15). We were not called by God in quite that dramatic a fashion; we know that the Holy Spirit came to each of us when we were baptized. John the Baptist completed his mission to prepare the way for Jesus by preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, teaching people to be honest and generous, and preparing them for the Messiah. By virtue of our baptism, each of us also shares in Christ's mission, to extend his love and his message of salvation to all we meet. As you listen to and reflect on the readings today, think about how you have been called. Spend some time in prayer this week to discern how you can prepare the way for Jesus in your world. How can you

spread Jesus' message of hope and love?

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Are you interested in "becoming" Catholic? Do you know someone who is seeking a deeper connection with God?

- Were you raised in a family that did not practice any faith yet you feel a call to be baptized?
- Perhaps you were baptized in another faith, married a Catholic and are raising your children Catholic?
- Or, you are thinking of getting engaged to a Catholic and are interested in knowing more about the faith?
- Have you been attending Mass but have not received the sacraments?
- Maybe you know someone who is seeking a deeper connection with God?
- Or possibly you just have an intellectual interest in the Catholic church?

For these situations and for answers about the Catholic faith, St. Jane Frances' Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is for you. It begins the last Sunday of September, culminates with the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation at Easter (if appropriate) and continues through to Pentecost in May. Classes are generally held each Sunday from 10:00 a.m.— 11:30 a.m.

We tend to utilize words—"The Solemnity of the Nativity of John the Baptist" without really knowing what it is that we are saying. What this is telling us is that this week we are holding the ceremonious observance of the birth of John the Baptist. Recognizing the importance of the last of the Prophets of God, as he, himself quoted Isaiah 40,

"In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD! Make straight in the wasteland a highway for our God!"



TRAVELING CHALICE: A PROGRAM OF PRAYER FOR PRIESTLY & RELIGIOUS VOCATIONS
