ORDINARY TIME

The feasts are over and we are fully into the long stretch of Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time is not just the absence of a major season any more than our lives are ordinary on days that are not holidays. The extraordinary happens at any time, in any season.

For the Church, Ordinary Time forms the foundation of the liturgical year; it comprises almost two-thirds of the calendar. As we settle into the longest season of the year, let's remember the spirit of Easter and continue to move forward with joy and hope.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

As you know, RCIA returned to St. Jane last year with three adult souls brought into the church through the sacraments of initiation and two more adults who were confirmed. It was a wonderful year and a great celebration of the sacraments! RCIA can be joined at any time, so now is the time to begin praying in earnest for the Holy Spirit to send us seekers. I am asking for the prayers of the entire community to ask God to send us seekers – people looking to form a relationship with Jesus through the Sacraments of the Catholic Church. We can begin the process at any time to prepare people for reception of the Sacraments at Easter Vigil in 2020. Once we have seekers, we will need sponsors and those who are willing to share their faith with a small group. I ask you to please include prayers for a Spirit-filled group of people to come forward to form the RCIA team, but, most importantly, for our evangelization efforts to be increased so that we bring in those seeking initiation.



HOLY LAND PILGRIMAGE

Terra Sancta Pilgrimages with Franciscan friar Fr. Alex Kratz will be leading a Catholic Pilgrimage to the Holy Land from **December 2-16, 2019**. This life-changing experience walking in Jesus' footsteps includes daily Mass and Rosary, biblical readings on site, time for prayer and spiritual guidance, and meeting local Christians. Cost is \$4,299 (all expenses included, round trip from Detroit, 3 daily meals, all tips and taxes). \$500 deposit due at registration.
