FR. T'S TIDBITS: THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

The Catholic Church throughout the world celebrates the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, as we did just a few weeks ago. In every country of the world, province, state, city or hamlet each Sunday the Eucharist is celebrated in community with the people of God. Thus we are united with all people every time we come

together to celebrate the Eucharist.

I recall being in Battery Park when Pope John Paul II made a pastoral visit to the United States. When he elevated the host at the open air Mass, he united everyone who was in attendance with that simple yet powerful gesture.

It is also a reminder to each of us to recall the day in which we were invited to receive the Eucharist for the first time. Pope Francis reminds us often that the Eucharist nourishes and strengthens us to proclaim the gospel message to those we meet in our daily activities - that without the Eucharist we are nothing. Our Church and our lives are centered upon the Eucharist. All that we are and all that we do flows from the Eucharist.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: The Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life. The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up in the Eucharist and are oriented towards it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely, Christ himself, our Pasch. The Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith: Our way of thinking is attuned to the Eucharist, and the Eucharist in turn confirms our way of thinking".

I recall the words of an old priest when he said to me shortly after I was ordained. "May you celebrate the Eucharist as if it were your first time and your last time."

Let us celebrate as a community of faithful disciples the Lord, who calls us, invites us and who nourishes us to embrace the Gospel of Life and proclaim it in our daily lives.

The following article appeared in the June 2019 edition of the Worship News. It was written by Sr. Georgette Zalewska, Associate Director in the Office of Worship for the Archdiocese of Detroit. It is reprinted here with permission.

I share it with all of you as it is a wonderful description of the value and meaning of Sunday Mass and our role as disciples. Let me know what you think!

PART ONE: UNLEASH THE GOSPEL AND SUNDAY MASS

Do some people attend Mass in isolation, not knowing or being known by others?

Do some have the impression that relating to God is sufficient and relating to others in the parish is unnecessary? Are all aware of their responsibility to encourage and build up the faith of others?

Do all recognize the need to forgive the offenses of others, to bear with their faults and failings, to avoid cliques and factions, to overcome social and cultural barriers, and reach out to those who may feel lonely or neglected?

Our parishes must be places where people's "hearts may be encouraged as they are knit together in love". Col.2:2 (Unleash the Gospel, Archbishop Vigneron)

Recently there has been much discussion about whether Christianity in America will survive or "Are we perhaps the last Christians?" What a frightening thought! The remarks are based on the research that has been done in recent years about Mass attendance which has been steadily dropping. Can anyone claim identity as a member of the Christian community without being part of that community on a regular basis? If Christianity is to continue existing it is vital that we understand the value and meaning of the Sunday Eucharistic gathering.

GOD CALLS US

When we gather on Sunday for the celebration of the Mass we are really responding to God who is calling us to come and celebrate. All of us, I am sure, have had times when we wanted to turn over and pull the covers over our heads. But, we did rise, dressed and got ourselves to the church. And once there we became part of the assembly that had gathered. We looked around and greeted some of those in the assembly whom we see Sunday after Sunday. Our **response to God's call** is the first liturgical act at the celebration. The Mass has begun. Only when the community has gathered does the presider enter in the opening procession.

Our Needlecrafters make many items which are shared with the community...from prayer blankets for hospice, hats, scarves and blankets for the homeless, baby blankets, "twiddle muffs" for those with dementia and autism, and so much more. We often do not know the impact these items have on the people who receive these gifts, however, recently I received this letter and thought I would share...

Dearest Prayer Blanket Ministers,

I don't know if I can fully express the absolutely purest form of love, comfort and hope that your prayer blankets offer the sick and suffering at our hospital! I pray over patients when I offer the blankets and they often say they "feel like God is hugging them!"

I tell them about your ministry that you offer these blankets free and that you have already prayed for whomever is the receiver, even though you do not know them I explain "just like God's love is free this prayer blanket is free for you and may you come to know God loves you even more than you ever thought." Patients receive these blankets with incredulous appreciation.

The nurses offer them as well and we are so very blessed to be entrusted to offer the prayer blankets you donated to patients! We see that they are made so lovingly by you. The yarn is so soft and the colors are so well chosen, some are even shaped like stars!!! They are treasured.

Often this prayer blanket for some is the last covering of beauty that a patient may have in their earthly life. It is something the family carries home with them. Even though their hearts are aching, the family has arms full of love when they carry home their loved ones belongings with the prayer blanket.

Please let me extend the true gratitude that patients have for the prayer blankets. So many can't remember the day or time when in the hospital but they remember the prayer blanket and the holy work of your generous hands...

May God continue to bless your kindness to our patients in need.


