“He was amazed at their lack of faith.” – Mark 6:6

All of us know someone (or perhaps *are* someone) who has trouble believing in God’s ability to heal. In today’s Gospel, we see that most of those gathered felt the same way. The Gospel tells us that faith is necessary for healing. Our faith helps us to be receptive to God’s grace. When you pray for healing of body, mind or soul, do you pray with the sure knowledge that your prayers will be answered?



How are you doing with your prayers for seekers? If you need a little inspiration, here are some thoughts:

PRAY THAT GOD WILL SEND HIS HOLY SPIRIT TO THOSE WHO RECOGNIZE THEY ARE MISSING SOMETHING, BUT DON’T RECOGNIZE YET WHAT IT IS THEY ARE MISSING. “I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. I will put my spirit within you so that you walk in my statutes, observe my ordinances, and keep them. You will live in the land I gave to your ancestors; you will be my people, and I will be your God.” (Ezekiel 36:26 - 28).

PRAY FOR MORE PEOPLE TO COME TO CHRIST. There is only one way to salvation, through Christ and Christ alone. “Jesus said to him, ‘I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me’” (John 14:6). Remember, too, that Christ is the one who calls us. (see Matthew 11:28-30).

PRAY THAT GOD WOULD OPEN PEOPLE’S HEARTS TO BELIEVE THE GOSPEL. God is always calling us, always seeking to bring us to Himself. We must respond. So pray that God would open the hearts of these unbelievers so they can in turn believe, just as Lydia did. “The Lord opened her heart to pay attention to what Paul was saying” (Acts 16:14).

PRAY WITH THE SAINTS. Here is a prayer from the Catholic Household Blessings and Prayers:

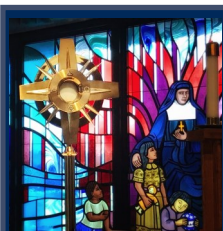
O God, you made your name known to us through the Apostles.

Grant this through Christ our Lord. AMEN

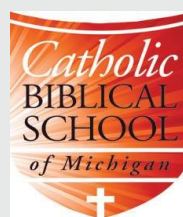


**JOIN US FOR AN AFTERNOON

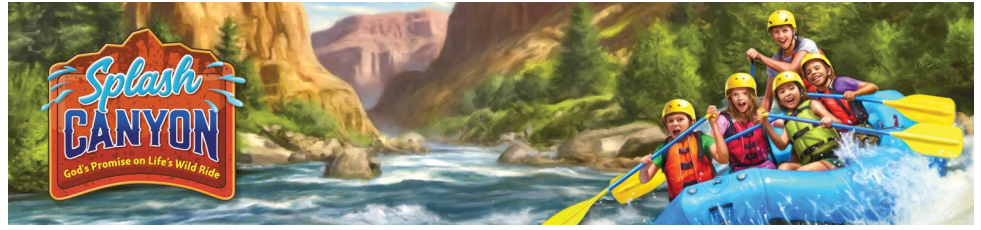

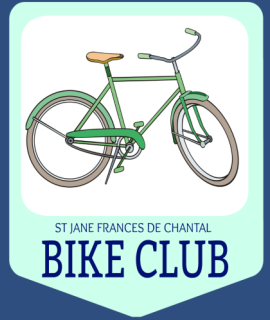

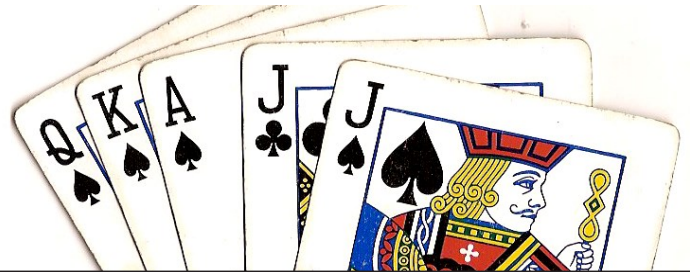
